

The directions given are for medium size, and it will be easy to add to or decrease from the size of the vest, by casting on more or less stitches. Use rubber or wooden knitting needles, not too coarse.

Cast on 120 stitches, knit 2, purl 2, for about 22 inches.

For the first sleeve: Work on 28 sts., still preserving the same rib for 10 inches, break off the wool, and put the sts. either on the third needle or a string of coarse cotton.

Bind off 64 sts. across the front, then work on the remaining sts. for the second sleeve as you did for the first. When you have worked this sleeve, cast on 64 sts., take up the sts. of the first sleeve, then you will have 120 sts. upon which work the second half for 22 inches, then bind off. Sew up the sides, leaving the arm hole open.

For the crocheted edging which is worked around the neck and sleeves:

1. One s. c. in each st. at edge of knitting.

2. Cross trebles worked as

follows: Work as for a tr. into a st., work off the 1st loop, miss 2 sts., 1 d. c. in next, work off all the loops on needle, 2 ch., 1 d. c. in centre of tr.

3. One s. c. in a st., 4 ch., 1 d. c. in 1st st., miss 2 sts., and repeat.



No. 1.

A narrow ribbon is run through the cross trebles and is tied in front and on the shoulders. Long sleeves may be added, if desired, by taking up sts. at the arm-hole and knitting them like body of shirt and putting on an elastic, close wrist, by changing to fine steel needles and knitting on them about 3 inches.
