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
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INSTRUCTION SHEET

EASY TO FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS FOR YOUR ADJUSTABLE FLOWER LOOM



Rosettes in 8 sizes from 1½" to 5" in diameter. Each notch in the shaft increases the diameter ½". The FLOWER LOOM will make 6 exciting different shapes.

HOW TO MAKE ROSETTES

First select correct notch for desired size. Hold shaft of FLOWER LOOM in left hand and yarn firmly between top disc and thumb of left hand, with end of yarn pointing toward you (Fig. 1), with right hand pass yarn down thru notch 1 and from left to right around pin 1, up through notch 1 across center of top disc down thru notch 7, from right to left around pin 7, up thru notch 7, across disc down thru notch 2 and from left to right around pin 2 up thru notch 2 across disc etc. . Continue in the same manner until you have looped yarn around each pin on lower disc. Cut yarn about 1" beyond center. Sew center as directed (Fig. 2).





HOW TO SEW CENTERS

Solid Centers: Fasten end of yarn by sewing two stitches thru center. Put needle under two petals, pull yarn towards center, come back one petal, then under two, continue until twelve petals have been interwoven. Be sure to sew one more stitch than you have petals. Fasten by sewing a stitch or two at center. (See Fig. 2).

Open Centers: Start by pushing needle thru center, under and between each two petals, push needle toward outer edge so it comes out, over top pin, using overcast stitch until all twelve sets of petals have been interwoven. Secure last stitch with slip knot. (When using a different color yarn for center, leave 1" of yarn at beginning of center. This will allow you to tie a double knot when center is complete).

DOGWOOD CENTER: Fasten end of yarn by sewing two stitches thru center. Put needle under 1 group of strands from right to left. Draw yarn thru tightly to the right over 2 groups of strands, under 1, over 2, and under 1, over 2, and under 1. This will give you 4 backhand stitches on right side. Fasten by sewing a stitch or two at center. (See Fig. 3).

TO REMOVE ROSETTES

Push up on adjustable clip. Slide discs together.



SQUARE: Follow same instructions for round rosette except, after going thru notches 1, 4, 7 and 10 (Fig. 1). Go around 3 pins and back thru same notch. This increases length of 4 strands.


DIAMOND: Follow same instructions for round rosette except, after going thru notches 1 and 7 (Fig. 1). Go around 3 pins and back thru same notch. This increases the length of 2 strands.

STAR: Follow same instructions for round rosette except, after going thru notches 1, 3, 5, 7, 9 and 11 (Fig. 1). Go around 3 pins and back thru same notch. This increases the length of every other strand.

TRIANGLE: Follow same instructions for round rosette except, after going thru notches 1, 5 and 9 (Fig. 1). Go around 3 pins and back thru same notch. This increases length every 4th strand.

DOGWOOD: Each petal of the dogwood flower is made up of three loops of different lengths. We get these different lengths by winding the yarn down thru four notches of the upper disc. first around a single pin, around a group of two pins, around a group of three pins on lower disc as follows . . . (Fig. 3). With right hand pass yarn down thru notch 1, left to right around pin 1, back thru notch 1, across disc, down thru notch 7, right to left around pin 7, back thru notch 7, across disc. down thru notch 1, left to right around pins 7 and 8 back thru notch 7, across disc down thru notch 1, left to right around pins, 1, 2 and 3, back thru notch 1, across disc down thru notch 7, right to left around pins 7, 8 and 9, back thru notch 7 . . . skip two notches. Using notch 4, finish by winding yarn same as above.

You should have a group of six strands in each of four notches, with two empty notches between. (See instructions for sewing center.)



Dogwood Unit

When making an article of wearing apparel such as a jacket; first cut a paper pattern of the front, back, sleeve, etc., using an old garment of proper size as a guide or buy a standard pattern of the garment desired. After crocheting the edging arrange the units on the pattern before sewing them together, add units until you have the desired shape, then sew the units. The collar, cuffs and yoke can be made of small size units. Sew the sections of the garment together with same material as edging.

EDGING FOR JOINING

The simplest way of joining the single units is with a crocheted chain stitch.

To crochet the edging of the smallest size daisy design, as shown in illustration of single unit: (Fig. 4) First make a loop on crochet hook, with right side of unit toward you, slip stitch thru end of one petal, chain 3, slip stitch into the second petal, chain 4, slip stitch into top of last slip stitch this forms a small picot), chain 3, slip stitch into top of third petal make another small picot of 4 chains and slip stitch into last slip stitch, chain 3, slip stitch into fourth petal, chain 8 for larger picot, continue in this way around all petals, always having two small picots and then one large one on top of petals.

Proceed as above until all petals are joined, ending with a chain 8 for large picot and slip into the slip stitch of first petal. The unit will have four large picots with two small ones in between. Sew the units together on wrong side, with same material as edging. (See Fig. 5 and tacking detail).



For larger sizes and different designs add one or more chain stitches between petals and also make picots larger. The number of chain stitches will also vary accordingly to the size and weight of the material used for the edging.

Our method of first making complete units and then sewing them together will enable you to make many combinations of designs and sizes.



Tacking Detail


MOHAIR STOLE No. 104

Approximate size: 16" x 48"

Materials:

- 1 FLOWER LOOM
- 1 Hair Pin Lace Loom
 - 5 1 oz. skeins Mohair

- 1 2 oz. skeins varn contrasting color
- 1 No. 0 Crochet Hook



Flower:

Following directions included with the Flower Loom, set Loom in third notch. With single strand of Mohair Yarn wind as for square rosettes. Fasten center with either closed or open center. Use contrasting color yarn for centers. You will need approximately 200 square rosettes.

Joining Units:

Join squares in rows of 8 across. The petals will be woven together with a zig-zag type stitch as shown in detail. Start by laying two squares side by side with points of petals overlapping, thread the petals on needle as if to weave, pull thread thru petals. Continue until you have two rows of 8 across, leaving 1" of yarn on both sides. Again weave these sixteen squares with a second strand of yarn, this time thread the petals on the needle in the opposite direction, pull thread thru squares as you go. This will give you a woven zig-zag stitch. Attach your next 8 squares to the second row in the same manner and continue this way for desired length. Tie a knot in the two strands of yarn on each side of every row.

Edge:

Use the Hair Pin Lace Loom to make edge around entire stole. As shown in picture, use basic stitch No. 2. The lace is then attached with a double crochet stitch to the edge of the stole very losely so as not to pull together.

Note:

A stole may be made by following the afgan directions No. 101. If this is

done use a single flower with the crochet edge. Make enough flowers for desired length and width. No edge around stole will be necessary. A fringe at both ends will look nice. This is done by winding yarn around a 5" cardboard. Cut loops on one side, use one strand thru each chain stitch across end. Tie knot, trim and cut.



DOUBLE FLOWER AFGAN No. 101

Approximate Size . . . 47" x 64"

Materials: 1 - Flower Loom

1 - No. 0 Crochet Hook 7 - 2 oz. skeins color B

7 - 2 oz. skeins color A

2 - 2 oz. skeins color C



Following directions included with the FLOWER LOOM, set Loom in third notch from top of rod. With 2 strands of yarn wind as for round rosettes. You will have a 24 petal rosette. Fasten center with either closed or open center. You will need a total of 540 double rosettes to make a afgan 47" x 64". Make 270 of color A and 270 of contrasting color B.

Unit:

Only crochet the bottom 12 petals, thus leaving the top 12 free. With contrasting color C, make loop on crochet hook, with ringside of flower toward you * work 1 sc in first petal of flower, chain 3, 1 sc second petal, chain 3, 1 sc third petal, chain 6, 1 sc in same petal thus forming a picot. Repeat from * 3 times, join with a slip stitch in first sc. You will have 12 petals with a picot on four petals. Make this edging around all 540 flowers.

Joining Units:

Working from wrong side, tack units together at point of each petal and picot. (See tacking detail in instruction sheet). Sew 20 units across and 27 units up, continue until entire afgan has been tacked together. To make the color contrast, stagger first color A then color B.

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
