TO MAKE DAISIES

Illustration A—Back view with spokes released.

Hold winder in left hand with flat side toward you. Holding knob between thumb and fore finger of right hand with thumb at bottom, push thumb to left to turn knob and release spokes.

Illustration B—Single Petal Daisy Wrapped Over 1 Spoke. With left thumb, hold yarn across center of winder leaving end extend about 1 inch beyond center. With right hand, pass yarn from left to right around spoke at top (No. 1); across center of winder, from right to left around spoke directly opposite (No. 2), across center of winder from left to right around spoke No. 3 at right of 1st spoke wrapped; across center, from right to left around spoke No. 4 at left of 2nd spoke wrapped; across center, from left to right around spoke No. 5; across center, from right to left around spoke No. 6; and continue in this way wrapping each spoke once, always passing across center to wrap spoke opposite, until the 12th spoke is wrapped. Bring yarn across center and cut end about 1 inch beyond center. *Make center before removing daisy from Winder See illustration E.*

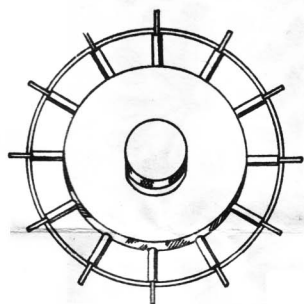
Illustration C—Double Petal Daisy Wrapped Over 1 Spoke. With left thumb hold yarn at center leaving end to extend about 1 inch; with right hand, pass yarn from left to right around spoke No. 1 at top; across center; from right to left around spoke No. 2 directly opposite, wrap around these 2 spokes once more in same way; across center, from left to right around spoke No. 3 at right of spoke 1st wrapped; across center, from right to left around spoke No. 4 at left of 2nd spoke wrapped; wrap these 2 spokes once more; across center, from left to right around spoke No. 5; from right to left around spoke No. 6; around these 2 once more; and continue in this way wrapping twice around 2 spokes exactly opposite then passing on to the next 2, until all spokes are wrapped twice ending with No. 12; bring yarn across center and cut end about 1 inch beyond center. If a daisy of more layers of petals is desired, wrap as many times as you desire layers of petals. *Make center before removing daisy from Winder See illustration E.*

Illustration D—Single Petal Daisy Wrapped Over 2 Spokes. With left thumb, hold yarn at center allowing end to extend about 1 inch. With right hand, pass yarn from left to right around spokes Nos. 1 and 2; across center, from right to left around Nos. 3 and 4; across center, around 5 and 6; across center, around 7 and 8; across center, around 9 and 10; across center, around 11 and 1; across center, around 12 and 3; across center, around 2 and 5; across center, around 4 and 7; across center, around 6 and 9; across center, around 8 and 11; across center, around 10 and 12; across center, cut end about 1 inch beyond center. *Make center before removing daisy from Winder See illustration E.*
To Make Double Petal Daisy Wrapped over 2 spokes. Make same as single petal over 2 spokes, then continue to wrap in same way as many times as desired.

Illustration E—Center. Thread needle with yarn for center. Fasten at center of wrong side of daisy as for embroidery. The side of daisy toward you is the wrong side. Insert needle under 4 petals, draw yarn through tightly; bring yarn back over the last 3 of these 4 petals, insert needle under these 3 petals and 1 more making 4 petals in all; draw yarn through, continue to bring yarn back over 3 petals and draw it under 4 petals each time until you have made 13 stitches. Be sure there are 13, otherwise your center will not be complete. As the weaving stitches are worked, be careful to carry around the starting yarn end of Daisy, taking each weaving stitch over this end for at least 10 stitches so as to fasten it securely. This is particularly necessary with all the cotton threads. Fasten yarn on wrong side. Cut off all ends close to center.

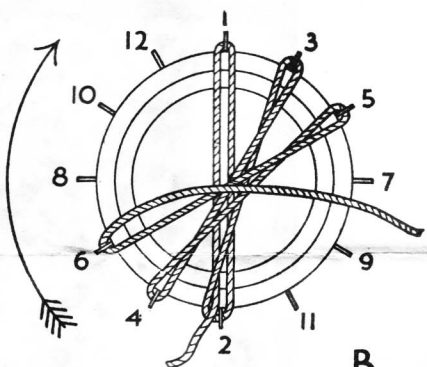
Turn knob in opposite direction to draw in spokes and release daisy.

Illustration F. Right side of complete daisy.

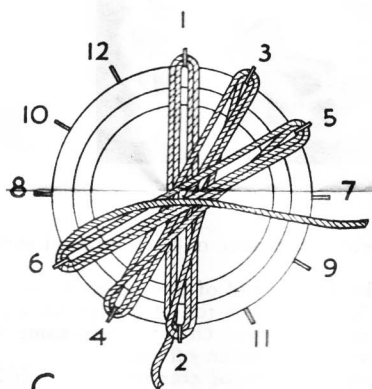

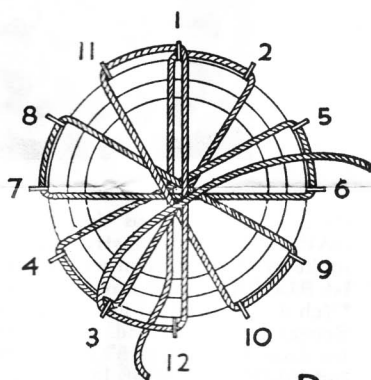
DIRECTION FOR TURNING



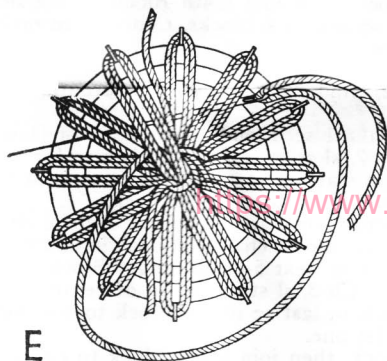

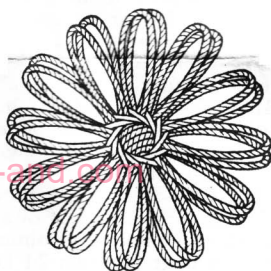

TO JOIN DAISIES WITH PICOT JOINING



Using 4-fold Worsted Yarn:—

DAISY—Following instructions on page 2, wind yarn once or twice around each spoke of Winder, then weave center.

1st BLOCK—Using crochet hook size 0, make 1 sc in end of one petal of Daisy. * (ch 4, sc in end of next petal) 3 times, ch 5, sl st in side-top of last sc for a p. Repeat from * around, ending with a sl st in starting sc, ch 5, sl st in same st for final 4th) p. Cut 6" long, thread to a needle and fasten off on back.

2nd BLOCK—Repeat 1st Block to 1st corner. In place of corner 5-ch p, ch 2, sl st in one lp of center st of a corner p on 1st Block, ch 2, sl st back in last sc on 2d Block to complete p-joining. (ch 2, sl st in next 4-ch lp on 1st Block, ch 2, sc back in next petal on 2d Daisy) 3 times. Ch 2, sl st in one lp of center st of next corner p on 1st Block, ch 2, sl st back in last sc on 2d Block to complete p-joining. Then complete 2d Block as for 1st one.

Join a 3d Block to another side of 1st Block, then join a 4th Block to one side each of both 2d and 3d Blocks, forming a square of 4 Blocks. Continue to make and join Blocks for desired shape and size.

Using Baby Yarn:—

DAISY—Following instructions on page 2, wind yarn 2 to 4 times around each spoke of Winder, then weave center.

1st BLOCK—Using crochet hook size 3, make 1 sc in end of one petal of Daisy. * (ch 5, sc in end of next petal) 3 times, ch 7, sl st in side-top of last sc for a p. Repeat from * around, ending with a sl st in starting sc, ch 7, sl st in same st for final (4th) p. Cut 6" long, thread to a needle and fasten off on back.

2nd BLOCK—Repeat 1st Block to 1st corner. In place of corner 7-ch p, ch 3, sl st in one lp of center st of a corner p on 1st Block, ch 3, sl st back in last sc on 2d Block to complete p-joining. (Ch 2, sl st in next 5-ch lp on 1st Block, ch 2, sc back in next petal on 2d Daisy) 3 times. Ch 3, sl st in one lp of center st of next corner p on 1st Block, ch 3, sl st back in last sc on 2d Block to complete p-joining. Then complete 2d Block as for 1st one.

Join a 3d Block to another side of 1st Block, then join a 4th Block to one side each of both 2d and 3d Blocks, forming a square of 4 blocks. Continue to make and join Blocks for desired shape and size.
