## Baby Sacque No. 289A

**MATERIAL**—BEAR BRAND or BUCILLA  
Ladyfair 2 balls White,  
1 ball Pink No. 203;  
BEAR BRAND or  
BUCILLA Pompadour—1  
ball Pink No. 203.

BUCILLA Celluloid Crochet  
Hook No. 1.

Daisy Knitter small size— $1\frac{1}{8}$   
inch diameter.

$\frac{3}{4}$  yard Pink Satin Ribbon  $\frac{5}{8}$   
inch wide.

15 stitches—2 inches    4 rows—1 inch

**Right Side**—With white chain 45 for lower edge. *1st row*: Skip 1 stitch of chain, \* 1 single crochet in next stitch, chain 1, skip 1, repeat from \* across row ending 1 single crochet in each of last 2 stitches. Chain 3, turn. *2nd row*: 1 double crochet in 1st stitch, drawing up loop  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch, \* 2 doubles in the single crochet, skip the chain 1, repeat from \* across row ending 1 double in last single, chain 1, turn. *3rd row*: 1 single crochet in the 1st stitch, \* chain 1, skip 1 stitch, 1 single crochet in the next stitch, repeat from \* across until 1 stitch remains; do not chain the last time, 1 single crochet in the last stitch. The 2nd and 3rd rows are repeated throughout sacque. *4th row*: Increase 1 stitch each side by working another double in the 1st stitch, and another in the last stitch. *5th row*: Work 1 single in each of the 1st 2 stitches, pattern across row and 1 single in each of the last 3 stitches. *6th row*: Increase 1 stitch each side as follows: 1 double in the 1st single, 2 doubles in each single across row ending 1 double in the last stitch. *7th row*: Increase 1 stitch to begin row, work pattern until there are 13 single crochets, chain 1, skip 1, then decrease 2 stitches for underarm by drawing up a loop in the next stitch, skip 1, draw up a loop in the next stitch, wrap, draw yarn through the 3 loops on hook, chain 1, and continue pattern across row, chain 12 for front edge. *8th row*: Skip 2 stitches of chain, work 1 double in the next stitch, \* skip 1, work 2 doubles in the next, repeat from \* across chain, giving 9 doubles on chain, skip 1st single, work 2 doubles in next single, then pattern across row ending with 2 doubles in the next to last stitch and 1 double in the last stitch. *9th row*: Without increase. Increase 2 stitches at end of both the 10th and 12th rows. Break yarn. Left side—Work same as right side to the end of the 6th row, then chain 11 stitches for front edge, work like 1st row across chain, continue pattern across row, when there are 16 singles, decrease for underarm as on right side; finish row increasing 1 stitch at end. Increase 1 stitch at beginning of 8th row; and 2 stitches at beginning of both the 10th and

the 12th rows. Do not break off. *13th row*: Work pattern across row decreasing for underarm as in 7th row, chain 6 for center back, and work pattern across right side decreasing for underarm, being sure to have pattern match. Decrease each side at underarm on the 19th row. Work 1 more row. Work should now measure 5 inches. Beginning at left front edge work pattern until there are 14 single crochets, chain 30 stitches for sleeve, skip 2 stitches of chain, work 1 double in next stitch and work pattern across chain, and last row (54 stitches). On next row, begin to decrease 2 stitches at front edge same as at underarm and repeat every 2nd row. Work until there are 7 rows at end of sleeve. *8th row*: Decrease as before, work pattern until there are 17 singles in row, do not chain 1, work 1 single in next stitch. This leaves off 12 stitches at end of sleeve. Chain 3, turn. Continue to decrease at front edge. Leave off 12 stitches at end of 10th row. When there are 14 rows, break yarn.

**Right front**—Chain 26 for right sleeve, work a single crochet in the 28th stitch from right front edge, work pattern across these 28 stitches. Shape same as left shoulder and sleeve leaving off 12 stitches at end of sleeve on both the 9th and 11th rows. Back of sleeves and shoulders—Holding wrong side of work toward you (the side where you work the single crochet row) beginning at end of left sleeve, join yarn in 1st stitch of chain of left sleeve, work like 1st row of sacque working on opposite side of chain, in same stitches as 1st row of sleeve (14 singles on chain), chain 1, 1 single in same place with single next to sleeve on left front, work pattern across back, and across chain of right sleeve. Work pattern until there are 8 rows on back of sleeves. Leave off 12 stitches at end of 9th row, turn, work 28. Leave off 12 at end of 11th row; on remaining 16 stitches, work 3 rows. Break yarn. Skip 39 stitches on 9th row of back for back of neck; join yarn in the 40th stitch, work 28 stitches. Shape same as other side of back leaving off 12 stitches at end of 12th row, work 2 more rows. Break yarn. Sew shoulder seams.

**Daisies**—With pink Ladyfair wrap over single spokes twice. See page 30. Break pink. Do not remove from knitter. With white wrap in same way. This makes 4 threads on each spoke. Break white. Make centers with Pompadour. Make 50 daisies.

**To Join**—1st daisy—With white make a loop on hook, holding right side of daisy toward you, work a slip stitch under the 2 white threads of a petal (all joining is worked under the 2 white threads, the pink is left free), \* chain 3, work a slip stitch in end of next petal, repeat from \* around, ending with a 3 chain and a slip stitch in 1st stitch of round. Break yarn. *2nd daisy*: Work same as 1st daisy until you have made a slip stitch in 2 petals,



# Baby Zephyr Bonnet

No. 289B

**MATERIAL**—BEAR BRAND or BUCILLA

Ladyfair—1 ball each of White, and Pink No. 203.

BEAR BRAND or BUCILLA Pompadour, 1 ball Pink No. 203.

BUCILLA Celluloid Crochet Hook No. 1.

1 small Daisy Knitter,  $1\frac{1}{8}$  inches diameter.

$\frac{3}{4}$  yd. Pink Satin Ribbon  $\frac{5}{8}$  inch wide.

15 stitches—2 inches      4 rows—1 inch

\* then remove hook from stitch, insert hook in a slip stitch on edge of a petal of 1st daisy, and in loop just removed from hook, draw this loop through work on hook, chain 3, work a slip stitch in next petal of 2nd daisy, repeat from \* until 3 petals of each daisy are joined; then complete edge as on 1st daisy. *3rd daisy:* Work same as 2nd daisy, skip 3 petals on edge of 2nd daisy, join in same way to the 4th, 5th and 6th petals from last joining of 2nd daisy. This leaves 3 petals each side of 2nd daisy not joined. Continue to join as in 3rd daisy until 13 daisies are joined for lower edge.

**Front Band**—1st daisy—Begin as before, then join the 3rd petal of this daisy to the 3rd petal from 1st joining of last daisy to the one before, then join next petal of each daisy. This will join these 2 daisies at 2 places only instead of 3. Complete daisy. *2nd daisy:* Join 3rd petal of this daisy to the 4th petal from 1st joining of last daisy to the preceding one, then join each of the next 2 petals. This will make 3 petals joined. Now continue joining daisies up front until there are 7 daisies at front edge. On left front, join daisies in same way, only begin joining 1st daisy of band to the 6th petal, then the 7th from joining at lower edge. For back of neck—Join a daisy to the 3rd, 2nd and 1st petals from last joining of 7th daisy of right front border, then complete daisy. *2nd daisy:* Skip 3 petals on side of last daisy and join in 3 places as on lower edge, then complete 3 petals of this daisy, and join next 3 petals to 3 petals at side of the 7th daisy of left front border, complete the daisy.

**Center Back**—1st daisy of 2nd row—Join to 2nd and 3rd petals at inside edge of 6th daisy at right of joining 6th and 7th daisies of lower edge, then join to next petal on edge of 7th daisy. *2nd daisy:* Join to the 3rd, 2nd and 1st petals of last daisy from last joining, then join next petal to the petal at right of joining 7th and 8th daisies of lower edge, and next 2 petals to the 2 petals on edge of 8th daisy. *3rd daisy:* Join to 2 petals each side of joining of last 2 daisies.

**Front Corner**—Join a daisy to 2 petals on edge of 1st daisy of left front band, 2 on edge of corner daisy, and 2 on edge of next daisy of lower edge. Join one to other front corner to correspond.

**Sleeve Band**—Join 5 daisies as at lower edge, joining last daisy also to 1st daisy to complete circle. Join 3 daisies to this band, same as center back. Make other band same. Sew to sacque sewing 9 stitches at edge of daisies on straight edges to sacque. Cut ribbon in half. Sew end of a piece of ribbon to wrong side of sacque under center of the 3rd daisy from shoulder.

**Crown**—With white chain 3, join with a slip stitch to 1st stitch of chain to form a ring. *1st row:* Work \* 1 single crochet in ring, chain 1, repeat from \* until there are 7 single crochets in ring, then do not chain 1, work 1 more single crochet in ring. Do not join, chain 3, turn. *2nd row:* Work 3 doubles in the 1st single crochet, drawing up first loop of each double  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch, 4 doubles in each of 6 single crochets, 3 doubles in the last single crochet. Chain 1, turn. *3rd row:* \* 1 single in 1st stitch, chain 1, skip 1 stitch, and repeat from \*, across row to next to last stitch ending with 1 single in the last stitch. Turn, chain 3. *4th row:* Work 3 doubles in 1st single, \* 2 doubles in next single, 4 doubles in next single, repeat from \* across row ending 3 doubles in the last single. *5th row:* same as 3rd. *6th row:* 1 double in 1st single, \* 4 doubles in next single, 3 doubles in the next single, repeat from \* across row ending 1 double in the last single. *7th row:* like 3rd row until there are 37 singles, then 1 single in the next stitch leaving off 9 stitches at end. *8th row:* Work 1 double in the 1st single, 2 doubles in each single across row until there are 63 doubles, then 1 double in the next single leaving off 10 stitches at end of row. Turn. Work 5 rows without increase working pattern stitch like the 3rd and 8th rows alternately. Next row work 28 stitches, turn, work 5 rows on these 28 stitches. Break yarn. Skip 7 stitches at top of bonnet on the 13th row, join yarn in next stitch and work to end of row. Work 5 rows. Break yarn. Sew seam at back of crown.

**Daisies**—Make 14 daisies as for sacque. For front of bonnet, join 8 daisies in a straight line as on lower edge of sacque. Join 3 petals of a daisy to 3 petals at side of 8th daisy next to last joining, *not the end*. This makes the 8th daisy form a corner of border. Join 3 more daisies to last daisy in a straight line for lower edge of bonnet. Join next daisy as before to 3 petals of last daisy, then work 3 chain and slip



stitch for 3 petals, then join 3 petals to side of 1st daisy to complete border, finish crocheting around daisy. At inside edge of front border, join 2 petals of 14th daisy to 2 petals of 4th daisy at right of joining of the 4th and 5th daisies, join next 2 petals to the 2 petals of 5th daisy at left of this same joining. Then complete the daisy. Sew border to bonnet sewing 15 stitches on edge of each daisy to bonnet. With white make a loop on hook, work a single crochet in the 4th 3 chain (corner mesh) from joining on the corner daisy on left side of bonnet, \* chain 2, 1 single in center of next mesh, repeat from \* once, chain 2, draw up a loop in center of each of the next 2 meshes, work in this way across each daisy on lower edge having 3 meshes across each daisy to corner. Break yarn. Cut ribbon in half; sew a piece under each corner flower.

## Baby Sacque No. 288A

**MATERIAL**—BEAR BRAND or BUCILLA Saxony Yarn 3-fold, 2 balls each White and Pink No. 203.

BUCILLA Celluloid Crochet Hook No. 1.

Large Daisy Knitter 2½ inches diameter.

2 yards Pink Satin Ribbon ½ inch wide.

**White Daisies**—Wrap white yarn 3 times on single spokes. See page 30. Break yarn. Make centers with pink yarn. Make 98 white daisies.

**Two color daisies**—Wrap pink yarn 3 times on single spokes, break yarn, do not remove from knitter. With white, wrap 3 times on single spokes, making 6 threads on each spoke. Break white. Make pink centers. Make 15 two color daisies.

**To join**—Join as in robe No. 285 holding *right* (pink) side of a two color daisy toward you for 1st daisy, working with pink under the 3 white threads of a petal. The 2nd daisy is all white working under all 3 threads of petals. Continue joining daisies until there are 12 white daisies, and 1 two color joined like 1st one. **2nd row**: Join as in robe 285 with colors same as 1st row. **3rd row**: Colors same as 2nd row having *wrong* (white) side of the two color daisies toward you, at each end of row, working under the three white threads of a petal. These two color daisies are turned back to form collar. **4th row**: Same as 3rd row. This brings sacque up to sleeve.

**Left shoulder**—Join as before, 1 two color with wrong side toward you, and 2 white daisies; work around end of this 2nd white daisy and on 2nd side of this row as before. Join 1 more row of daisies for left shoulder same as last row. When 2nd

side of this row is complete, continue this row down front edge joining the free petals of ends of rows. Break yarn.

**Right shoulder**—With pink yarn, make a slip stitch under the 3 threads of a petal of a white daisy, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in end of 2nd petal, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in end of 3rd petal, chain 3, remove hook, insert hook in the joining of the 2 picots of the 3rd and 4th daisies from right front edge of sacque, and in loop just removed, draw loop through, chain 2, slip stitch in slip stitch of last petal to complete picot, continue to join this daisy to the 3rd daisy from right front edge as before, join 1 more white daisy, and 1 two color daisy with white side up. Work across top of this row. Join 1 more row same as this, then continue down armhole side of these 2 rows. Break yarn.

**Back**—Skip for armhole the 4th daisy from left front edge on 4th row of jacket. Begin to join a white daisy same way as 1st daisy of right shoulder to the 5th daisy from left front edge. Continue to join white daisies until there are 6. This leaves out 1 daisy for right armhole. Work across top of row and join another row of 6 daisies to this row. When 9 petals of the 6th daisy have been joined, begin to join top of this row of daisies to right front shoulder as follows: chain 3, remove hook from loop, insert hook in center of picot at armhole side of right shoulder and in loop just removed, draw this loop through, chain 2, 1 slip stitch in last slip stitch, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next free petal of back (10th petal) and continue as before until 2 daisies of back are joined to 2 white daisies of right front; work across 2 daisies for back of neck as on previous rows leaving free the two color daisy each side of front; then join the remaining 2 daisies of back, to the 2 white daisies of left front. Continue to work as before down armhole side of the 2 rows of back. Break yarn.

**Collar**—Take up a two color daisy and with white side toward you, work as before to 3rd petal, chain 3 for picot, join as before to the free picot at top front edge of the two color daisy at top of left shoulder, complete this picot, join next 2 free petals to 2 petals at top of this same daisy of front, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in 6th petal, chain 3 for picot, join to same place where the 4 picots are joined making 5 picots at this point, complete picot, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next free petal, join to center stitch of next 3 chain of daisy of back of neck, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next free petal, join to slip stitch in end of next petal at back of neck, chain 3, slip stitch in next free petal, join to center stitch of next 3 chain of neck, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next free petal, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next free petal (11th petal).

Take up wrong side of another two color daisy, join 2 petals of this daisy to 2 petals of last daisy as before, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in 3rd petal of this new daisy, join to next petal on same daisy of neck to which last daisy was joined; chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next free petal, join to slip stitch in end of next petal on same daisy of neck; chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next free petal, join to slip stitch in end of next petal in top of next daisy of neck; chain 3, 1 slip stitch in end of next free petal, join to next petal at neck; chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next free petal, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in the 8th petal. Take up wrong side of a 3rd two color daisy, join 2 petals of this daisy to 2 petals of last daisy, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next free petal, join to center stitch of next 3 chain on neck; chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next free petal, join to next petal on neck; chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next free petal, join to center of next 3 chain on neck; chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next free petal, chain 3 for picot, join to joining of the 4 picots, complete picot; join each of next 2 petals to a petal at top of the two color daisy on right front edge, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next free petal, chain 3 for picot, join to picot at front edge, complete picot. Work across top of collar as on top of rows.

**Border**—With pink make a loop on hook, beginning in the picot at top of 2nd row of daisies on left front edge, \* work 1 single crochet under picot, work 2 singles under next 3 chain, 3 singles under next 3 chain, 2 singles under the next 3 chain, 2 singles under next picot, repeat from \* on edge of each daisy down front working 3 singles in corner picot, across lower edge, and across 2 daisies up right front edge. Break yarn. **2nd row:** Hold right side of last row toward you. Beginning in 1st stitch, work 1 single crochet in each stitch across row, work 3 single crochets in the corner stitch. Break yarn. **3rd and 4th rows:** Same as 2nd row. **5th row:** Make a slip stitch in 1st stitch of last row, \* chain 3, 1 slip stitch in each of next 2 stitches, repeat from \* to end of row. Break yarn. Holding right side of collar toward you, (wrong side of sacque) beginning in next picot to 1st stitch of lower border, work border same as on lower edge. Sew together ends of borders.

**Armhole border**—Beginning at under-arm, with pink, work around armhole same as 1st row of border, join with a slip stitch to 1st stitch of round. Do not turn. **2nd round:** Chain 1, work 1 single crochet in each stitch of last round. Join with a slip stitch. Work 2 more rounds. Break yarn.

**Sleeves**—With pink make a slip stitch in end of a petal, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next petal, chain 3 for picot, remove hook, insert hook in stitch on border opposite

joining of 2 picots at under arm, and in loop removed, draw loop through, complete picot, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next petal, join to 3rd stitch of armhole border from last joining, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next petal, join in 3rd stitch of armhole, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next petal, chain 3 for picot, join in 3rd stitch on armhole, complete picot; chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next petal, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in 7th petal; join another daisy, joining 1st picot in same place with last picot. Continue to join daisies until there are 5 daisies—each daisy exactly opposite a daisy on sacque. Work around last daisy and across top of row. Join 2 more rows of daisies as on sacque. After crocheting across top of last row, crochet down ends of rows joining the 2 ends of each row same as shoulders were joined. Break yarn. Work border on ends of sleeve, as on armhole. Then work like 5th row on sacque border. Cut ribbon in half. Make a bow at one end, leaving an end for tie. Turn back collar. Sew bow at lower end of collar.

## Baby Bonnet No. 288B

**MATERIAL**—BEAR BRAND or BUCILLA Saxony 3-fold 1 ball each Snow White and Pink No. 203.

BUCILLA Celluloid Crochet Hook No. 1.

1 Large Daisy Knitter 2½ inches diameter.

1 Yard Pink Satin Ribbon ½ inch wide.

Make daisies as for sacque—22 white and 8 two color. With pink join as for sacque. **1st row:** 8 two color daisies with pink side toward you for front edge. **2nd row:** 8 white. **3rd row:** Same as 2nd. **4th row:** Join 3 white daisies for back to first 3 daisies of last row until you have joined the 2nd picot of 3rd daisy to the 2 picots and completed the picot (there will be only 3 picots joined at this point), chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next petal, join to next petal on 4th daisy; chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next free petal, join to next (2nd) petal on 4th daisy; chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next free petal; chain 3 for picot, join to the joining of picots of the 4th and 5th daisies of last row; crochet across top of these 3 daisies of 4th row. **5th row:** 3 white daisies joined to top of 4th row, then join the 3rd daisy to the 5th daisy of 3rd row same as the 3rd daisy of last row was joined to 4th daisy of 3rd row. Then work across top of these 3 daisies joining to the remaining 3 daisies of 3rd row in same way that back of sacque was joined to front on shoulder. Then continue across lower edge of back and one front.

**Border**—With pink work border as on sleeve, increasing 2 stitches at corners. Draw ribbon through 1st row of border on lower edge of bonnet.



## Baby Sacque No. 290A

**MATERIAL**—BEAR BRAND or BUCILLA Saxony Yarn 3-fold 3 balls Pink No. 203, 1 ball Snow White.

**BUCILLA Celluloid Crochet Hook No. 1.**

1 Large Daisy Knitter  $2\frac{1}{8}$  inches diameter.

2 Yards Pink Satin Ribbon  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch wide.

**Daisies**—Wrap pink yarn 3 times on single spokes. See page 30. Make centers of white. Make 108 daisies. Join daisies as described in Robe No. 285A working with pink under all 3 threads of each petal, joining 14 daisies in a row for 4 rows for lower part of sacque. Complete top of 4th row. Break yarn. This brings you to sleeves. Join 3 daisies to each other as in 1st row but do not join to sacque until you have made a 3 chain for 2nd picot on 3rd daisy, then join this 3 chain to the joining of the picots of the 4th and 5th daisies from left front edge same as in preceding rows, complete picot, work in 2 more petals of this daisy, and continue to join daisies to each other and to back of sacque until there are 9 daisies in the row, the last 6 of them being joined to back, now join 3 more daisies in the row (working as in 1st row) but do not join these 3 daisies to lower part of sacque, work across top of this row of 12 daisies. The 3 daisies at each side not attached to lower part of sacque are for sleeves. Join another row of 12 daisies to this row and work across top. This completes back. Join 4 daisies to the 1st 4 daisies of last row, then join a daisy to this 4th daisy, but do not join it to the top of the 5th daisy of last row. Work across top of these 5 daisies. This row begins left front shoulder and sleeve. Join another row of 5 daisies to this last row. Work across top of this row as follows: after working in 9th petal of 5th daisy, chain 5 for picot, 1 slip stitch in top of slip stitch last made (9th petal). Fold over the 3 daisies of 1st 4 rows of sacque for left front. Chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next free petal, join to petal at top of 1st daisy of 4th row; chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next free petal, join to next petal of 1st daisy of 4th row; chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next free petal, chain 3 for picot, join to joining of picots of the 1st and 2nd daisies of 4th row, chain 2 to complete picot; 1 slip stitch in last slip stitch made, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in the joining of 4th and 5th daisies of this row; chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next free petal of 4th daisy, chain 3 for a picot and join in same place with last picot, chain 2 to complete picot, 1 slip stitch in same stitch with last slip stitch, remove hook, insert in slip stitch in next petal on 2nd daisy of 4th row, and in loop just removed, draw loop through, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next free

petal, remove hook, and join to next petal on 2nd daisy of 4th row; chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next free petal (11th), chain 3 for picot, join to the joining of picots between the 2nd and 3rd daisies of 4th row, chain 2 to complete picot, slip stitch into last slip stitch, join to next petal of 4th row; chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next free petal (12th), join to next petal of 4th row; chain 3 for picot, join to joining of 2 picots, chain 2 to complete picot, 1 slip stitch in last slip stitch; chain 3, 1 slip stitch in the joining of this daisy to the next daisy of this row. There are now 3 daisies of 4th row of sacque joined to 2 daisies of left front shoulder. Now crochet across top of remaining 3 daisies of this row for sleeve. Join a row of 3 daisies to top of these 3 daisies. The 2nd picot of the 3rd daisy will be joined to the joining of 4 picots making 5 picots in 1 place. Join next 2 petals to 2 petals on the daisy of 4th row which was left open at underarm, join next petal of this 3rd daisy with a picot to the joining of 4 picots, making 5 picots in one place; join next 2 petals of this 3rd daisy to 2 petals of the next daisy on back of left sleeve. Continue joining the top of this row of 3 daisies to the 3 daisies of back of sleeve. Continue row around end of sleeve. Break yarn. Complete ends of rows at left front edge.

**Right shoulder**—Work in the end of 3 petals of a daisy, make a picot, joining it to the 1st picot at top of 4th daisy from end of right sleeve then continue to join daisies until there are 5 daisies in the row, last 4 being joined to 4 daisies of shoulder and sleeve. Work this shoulder and sleeve to correspond.

**Lapel**—Take up a daisy, work to 3rd petal, chain 3 for a picot, hold wrong side of left shoulder of sacque toward you. There are 4 daisies left for back of neck. Remove hook from loop, insert hook in the joining of the picots at top of the 3rd and 4th of these 4 daisies next to left shoulder, and in loop just removed from hook, complete picot, join right side of the next 2 petals of new daisy to 2 petals at top of this 4th daisy of neck, join the picot of the new daisy to the joining of 4 picots (making 5 picots at this point). Join next 2 petals of new daisy to top of daisy at left front edge, join picot to picot and complete this daisy. Join a daisy to right front in same way.

**Border**—Holding right side of sacque toward you, with white make a loop on hook. \* work 1 single crochet in picot at top of 4th daisy from lower edge of left front, work 2 single crochets under next 3 chain, 3 single crochets under next 3 chain, 2 single crochets under the next 3 chain, 2 singles in center of the picot, repeat from \* on edge of each daisy down left front, work 3 singles in the corner picot, repeat across lower edge and up right front to picot at top of 4th daisy. Break yarn. 2nd



**row:** Join yarn in 1st stitch of last row, work 1 single crochet in each stitch to end of row, increasing 2 stitches at corners. Break yarn. **3rd row:** Same as 2nd. **4th row:** With pink, work a slip stitch in 1st stitch of last row, \* chain 3, 1 slip stitch in each of the next 2 stitches, repeat from \* to end of row. Break yarn. Holding wrong side of sacque toward you, beginning in next picot on left front of sacque, work border up front, around neck to end of other border, same as around lower edge. Sew together ends of border.

**Sleeve border**—Join yarn in picot on end of sleeve, work 1st row as on sacque, join to 1st stitch with a slip stitch. **2nd round:** Chain 1, work same as 2nd row on sacque, join with a slip stitch. Work 3rd and 4th rounds same as sacque border, always joining with a slip stitch at end of round. Cut ribbon in half. Make bow at one end, leave end to tie. Turn back collar. Sew bow on each front to seam in border.

## Baby Bonnet No. 290B

**MATERIAL**—BEAR BRAND or BUCILLA Saxony Yarn 3-fold 1 ball each Pink No. 203 and Snow White.

BUCILLA Celluloid Crochet Hook No. 1.

1 Large Daisy Knitter  $2\frac{1}{8}$  inch diameter.

2 Yards Pink Satin Ribbon  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch wide.

Make 30 daisies as for sacque. With pink join daisies same as in Bonnet No. 288B. Make border same as on Sacque No. 290A. Run 1 yard of ribbon through 1st row of border on lower edge leaving ends to tie. Cut remaining ribbon in half. Make a bow out of each. Sew one to each lower front corner.

## Carriage Robe No. 285A

27 x 33 inches

**MATERIAL**—BEAR BRAND or BUCILLA Zephyr Germantown 4-fold 3 balls Snow White, 3 balls Pink No. 203.

BEAR BRAND or BUCILLA Saxony Yarn 3-fold 3 balls Pink No. 203.

BUCILLA Celluloid Crochet Hook No. 1.

1 Large Daisy Knitter,  $2\frac{1}{8}$  inch diameter.

28 inches Pink Satin.

**Daisies**—Wrap Germantown twice on single spokes. See page 30.

**Centers**—Use pink Germantown for

centers for white daisies, and white for center of pink daisies. Make 135 white daisies, and 135 pink daisies.

**To Join Daisies**—With pink Saxony, make a loop on hook, work a slip stitch under 2 threads at end of petal of a pink daisy (all joining is under 2 threads of a petal), chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next petal, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in the 3rd petal, chain 5, 1 slip stitch in last slip stitch to form a picot, \* chain 3, 1 slip stitch in the 4th petal, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in the 5th petal, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in the 6th petal, chain 5, 1 slip stitch in last slip stitch for a picot, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in the 7th petal, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in the 8th petal, do not chain after this slip stitch. **2nd daisy:** Pick up another pink daisy, make a slip stitch in end of a petal, chain 3, slip stitch in end of 2nd petal on 2nd daisy, remove hook; insert in slip stitch of 7th petal of 1st daisy and in loop just removed from hook, draw this loop through; chain 3, 1 slip stitch in end of 3rd petal of 2nd daisy, chain 3, remove hook from loop, insert hook in center of last picot and in loop just removed from hook, draw this loop through picot, chain 2, 1 slip stitch in slip stitch of 3rd petal of 2nd daisy, repeat from \* joining 3 pink, and 3 white daisies alternately until there are 15 daisies in a row; then chain 3, a slip stitch in the 9th petal, make a picot, \* a slip stitch in each of the next 3 petals, with a 3 chain between; a picot, chain 3, a slip stitch in the slip stitch joining this daisy to the preceding daisy, chain 3, a slip stitch in next petal of next daisy, chain 3, join to last picot of last daisy as before, chain 2, slip stitch in slip stitch in last petal, repeat from last \* across row. On last daisy, after 1st picot work 2 slip stitches with 3 chains between. **2nd row:** Slip stitch in end of petal on a new pink daisy, chain 3, slip stitch in 2nd petal of new daisy, remove from hook, insert hook in slip stitch in next to last petal of last daisy of 1st row, and in loop just removed, draw this loop through, chain 3, slip stitch in 3rd petal of daisy of 2nd row, chain 3, join as before to stitch joining 2 picots, chain 2, slip stitch in slip stitch in end of last petal of 2nd row, chain 3, slip stitch in 4th petal, chain 3, slip stitch in 5th petal of 1st daisy of 2nd row. **2nd daisy:** Join a pink daisy to 2 petals of 1st daisy same as daisies of 1st row, chain 3, slip stitch in 3rd petal of 2nd daisy, chain 3 for picot and join to the joining of the 3 picots, chain 2, slip stitch to last slip stitch on 2nd daisy, chain 3, slip stitch in 4th petal, join (as in 1st daisy) to next petal on 2nd daisy of 1st row; chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next free petal (5th petal), join to next petal of 1st row; chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next free petal (6th); chain 3 for picot, join to the joining of the 3 picots, chain 2, slip stitch into slip stitch on end of same (6th) petal; chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next free petal (7th); chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next

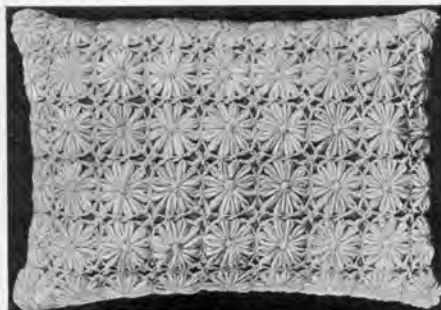


free petal (8th); and continue to join daisies to each other and to 1st row same as this 2nd daisy alternating colors as in 1st row. Work across other side of this row as on 1st row. *3rd row:* Same as 2nd. *4th row:* 3 white, 3 pink alternately across row. *5th and 6th rows:* Same as 4th. Repeat these 6 rows until there are 18 rows. Continue down remaining side of robe as across top of last row. Join with a slip stitch to 1st slip stitch on 1st row.

**Border**—With right side of robe toward you, work 2 singles under a chain of 3, 3 single crochet under next chain of 3, 2 single crochet under 3rd chain of 3, 1 single crochet under 1st of 2 joined picots, 2 single crochets under the 2nd of the joined picots, repeat around afghan working 3 single crochets in corner picot. Join with a slip stitch to 1st stitch of round; chain 1. Do not turn work. *2nd round:* Work 1 single crochet in each stitch, 3 single crochets in the corner stitch. *3rd round:* Same as 2nd round. *4th round:* Work 1 slip stitch in 1st stitch, \* chain 3 1 slip stitch in each of next 2 stitches, repeat from \* around. Cut satin 28 by 33½ inches for lining. Turn under edges ½ inch. Sew to wrong side of 2nd row of border of robe.

**MATERIAL**—BEAR BRAND or BUCILLA  
Zephyr Germantown 4-fold 1 ball each Snow White and Pink No. 203.  
BEAR BRAND or BUCILLA Saxony 3-fold 1 ball Pink No. 203.

BUCILLA Celluloid Crochet Hook No. 1.

Large Daisy Knitter 2½ inch diameter.

13 inches Pink satin.

Pillow Form 13 x 16 inches.

**Daisies**—Make daisies as for robe, 54 white and 54 pink. Join entire pillow in same way as robe. *1st row:* 3 pink, 3 white, 3 pink. *2nd and 3rd rows:* Colors same as 1st row. *4th row:* 3 white, 3 pink, 3 white. *5th and 6th rows:* Same as 4th row. Then repeat colors as in 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th rows working in same way until 1st side of 12th row is joined to 11th row. Then join 2nd side of 12th row to 1st side of 1st row in same way as 12th row is joined to 11th row. Break yarn. This forms a tube. Sew 1 end of tube. Cover pillow with satin. Insert in tube. Sew end.

**MATERIAL**—BEAR BRAND or BUCILLA

Zephyr Germantown 4-fold, 2 balls Snow White. Glossilla Twist Art No. 4479, 1 spool Green No. 60. Glossilla Rope Art No. 4475, 5 skeins Yellow No. 513.

BUCILLA Celluloid Crochet Hook No. 1.

1 Large Daisy Knitter 2½ inch diameter.

½ Yard Silk to match shade of Glossilla Twist.

Pillow Form 16 inches square.

**Daisies**—Wrap Germantown twine on single spokes. See page 30. Make centers of Rope. Make 64 daisies.

**To Join Daisies**—With Twist, join daisies as for Carriage Robe No. 285 until there are 8 daisies in a row for 8 rows. Break Twist. Steam crocheting slightly. Cover pillow form with silk. Sew on daisy top.

BEAR BRAND or BUCILLA  
Imported Angora Yarn,  
2 balls White.

BUCILLA Celluloid Crochet  
Hook No. 1.

Large Daisy Knitter,  $2\frac{1}{8}$  inch  
diameter.

2 yards White Satin Ribbon  
2 inches wide.

**Daisies**—Make each daisy wrapping  
over 2 spokes. See page 30. Make 78 tur-  
quoise daisies making 2 layers of petals.  
Make 75 white daisies making 1 layer of  
petals. Make centers with sand.

**To Join**—With turquoise, make a loop  
on hook. Make a single crochet under the  
2 threads of a turquoise petal, \* chain 5,  
1 single crochet under the threads of next  
petal, repeat from \* until there is a single  
crochet in each of 6 petals with a chain  
of 5 stitches between; do not chain after  
the 5th single crochet, work a single cro-  
chet under the single thread of an angora  
petal, then work across 5 more angora pet-  
als as on the turquoise daisy. Continue in  
this way alternating colors of daisies until  
the 1st half of 7 daisies is joined. **2nd side:**  
Continue around the 7th daisy with a 5  
chain between, and a single crochet in each  
petal, until there are 12 singles. Do not  
chain after the 12th single. Work 1 treble  
crochet (wrap hook twice, then work off  
2 loops at a time) into the stitch where  
this daisy joins the angora daisy. This com-  
pletes the circle of this daisy. Work a sin-  
gle crochet in the next free petal of next  
daisy, chain 5, 1 single crochet in the next  
petal and continue to join petals of this  
daisy with chains of 5 and single crochets  
until last petal of each daisy is reached,  
then join last petal to 1st petal with a  
treble crochet, and work a single crochet  
without chain into next petal of next daisy,  
continue across row. When last daisy is  
completed with a treble, chain 10. Lay this  
row on table in front of you with right  
side up and chain of 10 still on hook at  
right hand. **2nd row:** Work a single cro-  
chet in a petal of white daisy, chain 5, a  
single crochet in next petal, wrap yarn 3  
times around hook, insert hook in the 5th  
stitch of chain of 10, draw yarn through;  
wrap, draw yarn through 2 loops, wrap,  
draw through 2 loops, leaving 3 loops on  
hook; wrap twice, turn up edge of work  
and insert hook from wrong to right side

of top of single crochet in end of the 11th  
petal of 7th turquoise daisy, draw yarn  
through, \* wrap, take off 2 loops, repeat  
from \* until only 1 loop remains, chain 5.  
\* Work 1 single crochet in the 3rd petal of  
white daisy of 2nd row, remove hook from  
loop, insert hook from right side in top  
of single crochet of 10th turquoise petal,  
and in loop just removed from hook, draw  
this loop through the single crochet, chain  
5, 1 single crochet in the 4th petal of  
white daisy, remove hook from loop and  
insert hook in the single crochet at top  
of 9th petal of turquoise daisy, and in  
the loop just removed, draw this loop  
through the single crochet; chain 5, 1  
single crochet in top of the 5th petal of  
white daisy of 2nd row; wrap yarn 3  
times around hook, insert hook from  
wrong to right side in top of single cro-  
chet in the 8th turquoise petal, wrap and  
take off 2 loops at a time until there are  
3 loops on hook; wrap twice, insert hook  
from wrong to right side in the single  
crochet in the 11th petal of the white  
daisy of 1st row, wrap and take off 2  
loops at a time until 1 loop remains, this  
completes 3 sides of a cross stitch; chain  
5, 1 single in the 6th petal of white daisy  
of 2nd row. Pick up turquoise daisy. Work  
1 single crochet in a petal in edge of this  
daisy, chain 5, 1 single crochet in next  
petal of this daisy, wrap hook twice, insert  
in center of cross stitch, draw yarn through  
work, wrap, take off 2 loops at a time  
until 1 loop remains, chain 5, repeat from  
\* alternating colors of daisies across row.  
When you have worked a single crochet  
in the 5th loop of the 7th daisy of 2nd  
row, wrap 3 times, insert hook in the 8th  
petal of the last daisy of 1st row, wrap,  
take off 2 at a time until 1 loop remains,  
chain 5 and continue around daisy as on  
last daisy of 1st row and down second  
side of 2nd row as on 2nd side of 1st row.  
Continue joining daisies as in 2nd row  
always alternating colors until there are  
21 rows of daisies—7 in a row. Turn work.

**Cuffs**—With wrong side toward you,  
\* chain 5, draw up a loop under each of  
next 2 chain loops, wrap, draw through 3  
loops, repeat from \* across row; there are  
18 chains, turn. **2nd row:** \* Chain 5, 1 sin-  
gle under next chain of 5, chain 5, draw  
up a loop in each of the next 2 chain  
loops, wrap, draw through all 3 loops, re-  
peat from \* making 12 loops. Join to cuff  
1 turquoise, 1 angora, and 1 turquoise  
daisy same as before, working in the sin-  
gle crochets between chains on cuff. Cro-  
chet on 2nd side of daisies. Break yarn.  
Make cuff on other end. Sew together ends  
of cuff and ends of one row of daisies  
above cuff.

Work edging around shoulderette and on end of cuffs. Cut ribbon in half. Make a bow leaving ends to tie. Sew 1 each side of center of the 4th flower from center back.

## Coat No. 305A

(Illustration Shown on Front Cover)

**MATERIAL**—BEAR BRAND or BUCILLA  
Shetland Floss, 15 balls  
Henna No. 301, 2 balls  
Burnt Orange No. 909.

1 Small Daisy Knitter—17 $\frac{1}{8}$   
inch diameter.

BUCILLA Celluloid Crochet  
Hook No. 1.

**Motif**—Wrap henna yarn twice on single spokes. See page 30. Make centers with burnt orange. *1st round*: With burnt orange make a loop on hook, work a single crochet under 2 threads of a petal, chain 3, \* work a single crochet in next petal, chain 3, repeat from \* around, fasten to first single crochet with a slip stitch. Break yarn. *2nd round*: With henna, make a loop on hook, \* work 4 double crochets under a 3 chain, 5 double crochets under next 3 chain, repeat from \* around, join with a slip stitch. Break yarn. This makes 12 groups of doubles or 6 groups of 9 doubles. Make 241 motifs.

**Triangle**—With henna, chain 3, join with a slip stitch to form a ring. Break yarn. With burnt orange make a loop on hook. Work \* 1 single crochet in the ring, chain 3, repeat from \* twice, join to first single with a slip stitch. Break yarn. Make henna loop on hook. Work 9 doubles under each 3 chain. Join with a slip stitch. Break yarn. Make 2 triangles.

**Motifs with 5 sides**—Make daisy as before. With burnt orange work a single crochet under two threads of 1 petal, chain 3, decrease 1 petal by working a single crochet under 4 threads or 2 petals; then \* chain 3 and work 1 single crochet under 2 threads or 1 petal as before and repeat from \* 3 times, decrease 1 petal as before, then complete the round. This gives 1 chain of 3. Work 2nd round of motif having 10 groups of doubles or 5 groups of 9

Make 4 of these motifs. Be careful to keep these 5 sided motifs separate from the others.

**Half Motifs**—With burnt orange chain 3, join with a slip stitch to form a ring. Break yarn. With henna make a loop on hook, \* work a double crochet in ring drawing up loop  $\frac{3}{8}$  inch long, chain 2, repeat from \* 4 times, work 1 more double crochet (6 double crochets in ring). Break yarn. With burnt orange work 1 single crochet in 1st double crochet, \* chain 3, work 1 single crochet under chain 2 of previous row; repeat from \* 4 times, chain 3, 1 single crochet in last double crochet of previous row, chain 3, 1 single crochet in side of same double crochet, chain 3, 1 single crochet in side of 1st double crochet of previous row, chain 3, join to 1st single crochet of round. Break yarn. \* With henna work 4 double crochet under 1st chain 3, 5 double crochet under next chain 3, repeat from \* around, join. Make 12 half motifs.

**To join Motifs**—1st row: With henna sew 2 groups of doubles of 1 motif, to 2 groups of another motif (9 doubles of each motif) sewing back loop of stitches only. This leaves a ridge on right side of edge of each motif. Sew another motif to opposite side of this 2nd motif, and continue in this way until there are 14 motifs in a row. This is for lower edge of coat. *2nd row*: Sew together in same way 15 motifs. Then sew to 1st row so that one-half of 1st and last motifs of 2nd row extend beyond 1st row. *3rd row*: 16 motifs. Sew to 2nd row with  $\frac{1}{2}$  motif extending each side beyond 2nd row. *4th row*: 15 motifs, sewed to 3rd row with  $\frac{1}{2}$  motif less each side. Repeat 3rd and 4th rows twice. This gives 8 rows up to under arm. Mark the 8th motif of this row for center back. *1st row of back*: Sew together 6 motifs for back and sew to the 8th row with 3 each side of the center back. Sew one side of a triangle to edge next to 5th motif on the 4th motif from front edge of 8th row, this is for underarm. Sew one for other underarm to correspond. *2nd row of back*: 1st of sleeve—Sew 7 motifs in a row for sleeve, then sew a 5 sided motif; skip one side (9 doubles) for lower edge of 5 sided motif; continue row with 5 motifs for back, 1 five sided motif, skip 1 side (9 doubles) for lower edge as before and sew on 7 motifs for other sleeve. Sew the center motif to center back, sew the next 2 motifs and the single side of the 5 sided motif, sew the next side of next motif (7th of the sleeve) to the remaining side of the end motif of 1st row of back, sew 2nd side of this 7th motif of sleeve to remaining side of the 3rd motif from center



## Beret No. 305B

**MATERIAL**—BEAR BRAND or BUCILLA

Shetland Floss, 2 balls  
of Henna No. 301, 1 ball  
Burnt Orange No. 909.

**BUCILLA** Celluloid Crochet  
Hook No. 1.

1 Small Daisy Knitter—1 $\frac{1}{8}$   
inch diameter.

**Motif**—Wrap henna yarn twice on single spokes. See page 30. Make centers with burnt orange. *1st round*: With burnt orange make a loop on hook, work a single crochet under 2 threads of a petal, chain 3, \* work a single crochet in next petal, chain 3, repeat from \* around, fasten to 1st single crochet with a slip stitch. *2nd round*: With henna make a loop on hook, \* work 4 double crochets under a 3 chain, 5 double crochets under next chain, repeat from \* around; join with a slip stitch. Break yarn. This makes 12 groups of doubles or 6 groups of 9 doubles. Make 19 motifs.

**To Join Motifs**—With henna sew 2 groups of doubles of 1 motif, to 2 groups of another motif (9 doubles of each motif sewing back loop of stitches only. This leaves a ridge on right side of edge of each motif. \*Sew another motif to next 2 groups of doubles of 1st (center) motif, and sew together the 2 motifs of 1st round across 2 groups of doubles; repeat from \* 4 times. This gives 1 motif for center of beret and 6 motifs for 1st round. *2nd round*: \* Sew a motif in between 2 motifs of previous round, sewing 2 groups of doubles of this motif to 2 groups of doubles each side of seam. Sew another motif to next 2 groups of doubles of 2nd motif of previous round. Sew together the 2 motifs of 2nd round across 3 groups of doubles; repeat from \* around (12 motifs in round).

**Band**—With henna make a loop on hook beginning in 2nd stitch of a motif having 4 groups of doubles at edge, \* work 1 double crochet in each stitch for 16 stitches, working under back loop only; decrease 2 stitches as follows: wrap, draw up a loop in next stitch, 1 loop in seam between the 2 motifs and 1 loop in 1st stitch of next motif: wrap, draw through 4 loops, wrap, draw through 2 loops, work 1 double crochet in each of next 7 stitches, decrease 2 stitches same as before; repeat from \* around. Join with a slip stitch to 1st stitch of round. Break yarn. *2nd round*: With henna make a loop on hook and beginning in 1st stitch after decrease, \* work

back of 8th row, sew next side of next motif to next side of triangle. Sew other side of back and sleeve to correspond. *3rd row of back*: 2nd of sleeve—Sew together 20 motifs. Sew to last row, with  $\frac{1}{2}$  motif less each side. This completes back. *1st row of front*: 3rd of sleeve—10 motifs. Sew to extend  $\frac{1}{2}$  motif at end of sleeve. *2nd row of front*: 4th of sleeve—Sew 2 motifs for front, 1 five sided motif having 2 sides for top, 7 motifs for sleeve. Sew to last row with  $\frac{1}{2}$  motif extending at front edge, and sewing the 2 sides of five sided motif to last row. *3rd row of front*: 3 motifs—Having  $\frac{1}{2}$  motif extend at front edge, sew to 3 motifs of last row, and sew 3rd side of 3rd motif of this row to the next side of the next motif of last row. *4th row of front*: 4 motifs—Having  $\frac{1}{2}$  motif extend at front edge, sew to the 3 motifs of last row, sew 4th motif of this row to the 4th motif, then the 5th motif from front edge of 2nd row of front. Having  $\frac{1}{2}$  motif extending at front edge, sew the lower edge of this row to top of the 3 motifs at front of 8th row of coat. *5th row of sleeve*: 6 motifs; sew to 4th row of sleeve having  $\frac{1}{2}$  motif extend at hand, sew to remaining side of 4th row of front, and to remaining side of 4th motif from front edge of 8th row of coat. *6th row of sleeve*: 5 motifs—Sew to last row with  $\frac{1}{2}$  motif less at hand, sew to remaining side of triangle, and to 1st row of sleeve. Sew other front and sleeve to correspond leaving 1 side of 2 motifs at center back for back of neck. Sew half motifs each side of front at ends of 4th, 6th, and 8th rows; also at ends of sleeves to make hand even.

**Border**—With henna, beginning at center back on lower edge of coat in 2nd stitch from seam, \* work 1 single crochet in each stitch for 16 stitches working in back loop only; draw up a loop in next stitch, one in the seam, and 1 in first stitch in next motif, wrap, take off 3 loops; repeat from \* across lower edge to the corner motif; work 1 single crochet in each of 7 stitches, work 2 stitches in the next stitch, work 1 in each of 9 stitches, 2 in the next, 1 in each to next to seam, then decrease as before. Work across next 2 motifs as on lower edge, now decrease 1 instead of 2 at seam on 2nd motif; on end of next 5 rows work 1 single crochet in each stitch and seam. Around neck, work as on lower edge; finish other side to correspond. Join with a slip stitch. *2nd round*: With burnt orange, work 1 single crochet in each stitch taking back loop. *3rd round*: With henna work same as 2nd round. Work border in same way on sleeves.



1 double crochet in each stitch for 14 stitches, working under back loop, decrease 2 stitches, 1 double crochet in next 5 stitches, decrease 2 stitches; repeat from \* around. Finish same as 1st round. *3rd round:* Work same as 2nd round having 12 stitches between decreases on 1st motif, and 3 between decreases on 2nd motif. *4th round:* With tangerine work 1 single crochet in each stitch, working under back loop. Break yarn. *5th round:* With henna, work same as 4th round. Break yarn.

## Slipon No. 293

Size 16

**MATERIAL**—**BEAR BRAND** or **BUCILLA** Shetland Floss—3 balls Yellow Green No. 992, 2 balls each Corn No. 991 and Snow White, **BEAR BRAND** or **BUCILLA** Silky Iceland—2 balls White.

**BUCILLA** Celluloid Crochet Hook No. 1.

Small Daisy Knitter  $1\frac{1}{8}$  inches.

**Daisies**—With a single strand of yarn, wrap single spokes twice. See Page 30. Make 174 green daisies with corn centers, 78 corn daisies with green centers, 50 white Floss daisies with corn centers.

**To Join**—1st daisy of 1st round—With Iceland make a loop on hook, holding right side of daisy toward you, work a single crochet under the 2 strands in the end of green petal, \* chain 3, work a single crochet in the end of the next petal, repeat from \* around; chain 3, join with a slip stitch to 1st single crochet. Break yarn. Fasten end. *2nd daisy:* Begin like 1st daisy, make a single in 1st petal of green daisy, chain 1; holding wrong side of 1st daisy toward you, work 1 double crochet in the 2nd stitch of a 3 chain on edge of 1st daisy, chain 1, 1 single in next petal of 2nd daisy, chain 1, 1 single in 2nd stitch of next chain 3 of 1st daisy, chain 1, 1 single in next petal on 2nd daisy, chain 1, 1 double in 2nd stitch of next 3 chain of 1st daisy, chain 1, 1 single in next petal of 2nd daisy, then complete 2nd daisy like 1st daisy. Break yarn. Fasten end. *3rd daisy:* Join green daisy in same way to 2nd daisy to the 6th, 5th and 4th chains of 3 from last joining of last 2 daisies. Continue to join green daisies like 3rd daisy in a straight line until there are 18 daisies. *19th daisy:* Join a green daisy like the others in 3 places to the 18th daisy, make 3 more 3 chains with a single

after each in end of each of 3 petals on 19th daisy, then join next 3 three chains to corresponding chains on 1st daisy. This completes the 1st round. *2nd round:* *1st daisy:* Commence like 2nd daisy of 1st round. After 1st single crochet, chain 1, hold wrong side of 1st round of daisies toward you, work 1 double crochet in the 2nd chain 3, at right of joining of 2 daisies, chain 1, 1 single crochet in next petal of daisy of 2nd round, chain 1, 1 single in next 3 chain on edge of daisy of 1st round; chain 1, 1 single in next petal of 2nd round, chain 1, wrap, insert hook in 2nd stitch of next chain (top of double), draw yarn through, wrap, take off 2 loops, wrap, insert hook in same stitch on edge of 2nd daisy where this double between the daisies of 1st round was made, draw yarn through, wrap, take off 2 loops, wrap, take off 3 loops, chain 1, 1 single in next free petal, chain 1, 1 single in next 3 chain of 2nd daisy of 1st round, chain 1, 1 single in next free petal, chain 1, 1 double in next 3 chain of 2nd daisy of 1st round, chain 1, and complete this daisy same as other daisies. *2nd daisy:* Commence as before, join this daisy like 2nd daisy of 1st round to 1st daisy with a double in the 2nd 3 chain from last joining, a single in next 3 chain, a double in top of last double of last daisy, a single in next 3 chain of 1st round (always having a chain 1, a single in a free petal, chain 1, between each of these joinings), wrap, draw up a loop in top of double joining the two daisies of 1st round, wrap, take off 2 loops, wrap, draw up loop in same stitch with this same double on edge of next daisy, wrap, take off 2 loops, wrap, take off 3 loops, chain 1, 1 single in next free petal, chain 1, 1 single in next 3 chain, chain 1, 1 single in the next free petal, chain 1, 1 double in next 3 chain. This makes 7 petals of daisy with a single crochet in each, joined at 7 places to sweater. Now finish like other daisies. Continue to join daisies like this one until there are 18 daisies in 2nd round. *19th daisy:* Join same as this last daisy until 7th joining, then chain 1, 1 single in petal, chain 1, 1 double in top of double of 1st joining of 1st daisy of this round to round below, then join to next chain 3 with a single, and to next chain 3 with a double. Finish daisy. Join green daisies in this way until there are 5 rounds. *6th round:* Join in same way 2 corn daisies, these are center front, then complete round with green daisies. *7th round:* Join 3 corn daisies having center one come between the 2 of last round, complete round with green. *8th round:* 2 corn daisies over the 3 corn of last round, 8 green, 1 corn (center back), 8 green. *9th round:* 1 corn between the 2 green at right of center front, con-

tinue with corn until there are 5, 5 green, 4 corn (center back), 5 green. *10th round:* 1 corn between the 2 green at right of center front, continue with corn until there are 8, 2 green, 7 corn (center back), 2 green. *11th round:* Join a corn daisy between the 5th and 6th corn daisies of last round (1 daisy to left of center front), join until there are 18 daisies. Leave out 19th daisy for neck opening.

**Sleeve**—Beginning end of sleeve, crochet around a green daisy like 1st daisy of 1st round, join a corn daisy to this daisy like 2nd daisy of 1st round. Join another corn daisy to this last daisy for 3 spaces, before making chain 1, and the 4th single in the 2nd corn daisy, join with a double to center top of 5th corn daisy at right of center back (as you are working, it is the left sleeve) and join daisy as in previous rows; join to back and sleeve, 1 white daisy, 2 corn, 1 white (center back), 2 corn, 1 white, 1 corn. Then join to this last corn, another corn daisy at 3 places, then complete daisy, but do not join to the 11th round. Join 1 green daisy to this corn. The two daisies extending beyond back each side are for sleeves. *2nd row of back of sleeve:* Join a green daisy between the green and corn daisies of sleeve, then 1 corn, 8 white, 1 corn, 1 green. *3rd row:* Begin green daisy, after 1st single, join with 1 double in center of 2nd chain from 1st joining of 1st daisy of last row, then a single in next 3 chain, a double in third 3 chain, then complete daisy. Join 1 corn, 9 white, 1 corn, 1 green joining last green to last corn, then at 3 places on last daisy of last row. *4th row:* Same as 2nd row having 1 green, 1 corn, 8 white, 1 corn, 1 green. *5th row:* Begin like 3rd row, 1 green, 1 corn, 3 white. This brings you to neck opening. *6th row:* Like 2nd, 1 green, 1 corn, 3 white. *7th row:* Like 3rd, 1 green, 1 corn, 4 white. *8th row:* Like 2nd, 1 green joining in 2 places on 1st daisy of last round, join to the double between the 2 daisies and 2 places on next daisy, then after joining 2 free petals, join with a double to 2nd 3 chain on edge of corn daisy of 1st row of sleeve at right of joining of corn and green daisies, join with a single to next 3 chain, then join as before to each end of double joining the green and corn daisies, a single in next 3 chain on green, and a double in next 3 chain on green. Complete daisy. Join a corn flower to green with a single and a double, then join in same way, until the 2 free petals are joined. Join with a double in same place where double was made joining 3rd daisy of 1st row of sleeve to back, 1 single on this double of back, then join as before to each end of double joining the 2nd and 3rd daisies of back of sleeve, then with a single to the 3 chain on 2nd daisy of back of sleeve, complete daisy. Then join another corn, 1 white, and 2 corn. This completes left shoulder and sleeve. Leave out 3 flowers for neck, commence other front shoulder

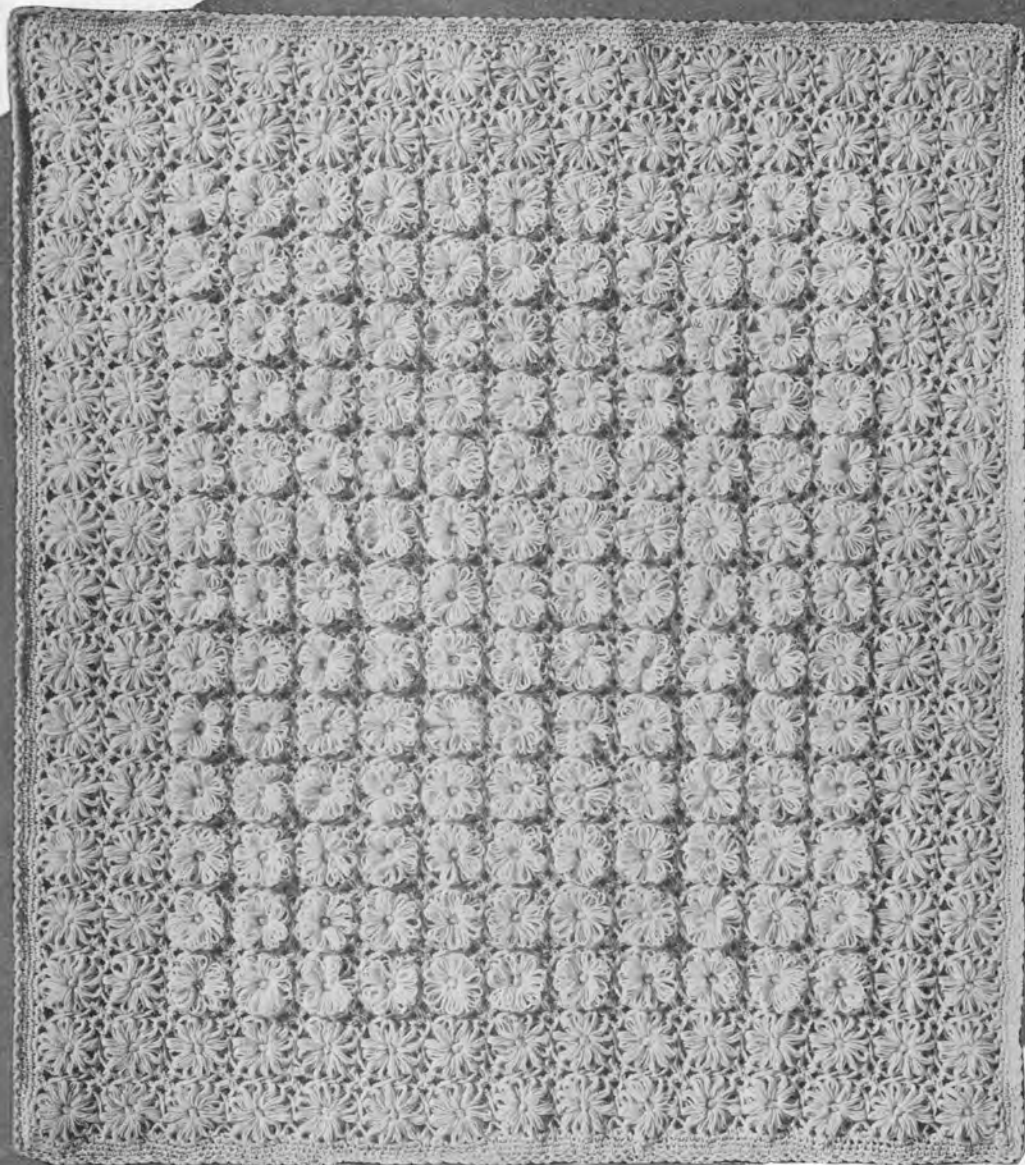
beginning to join a white flower in top center of 3rd flower from end of 1st row of 1st front shoulder. Make this shoulder to correspond.

**Half daisies**—With green chain 3, join with a slip stitch to 1st stitch of chain to form a ring. Chain 6, \* wrap, insert hook in center of ring, draw yarn through ring and draw up 1 inch, wrap, take off 2 loops, wrap, take off 2 loops, chain 3, repeat from \* until there are 6 doubles. Break yarn. Fasten ends. Make 7 more. With Iceland make a loop on hook, make a single crochet in the 3rd stitch of the 6 chain of half daisy, chain 1, 1 double in the 2nd unattached 3 chain from joining on lower edge of 3rd row of daisies on back of right sleeve, chain 1, 1 single in top of 1st double of half daisy, chain 1, 1 single in center of next 3 chain on sleeve, chain 1, 1 single in center of 3 chain on half daisy, chain 1, 1 double in top of double between the 2 daisies, chain 1, 1 single in 3 chain on half daisy, and continue as in joining daisies ending with a single in last double on half daisy. Break yarn. Join half daisies in this way to spaces on end of sleeve, 4 on each sleeve.

**Border**—On end of sleeve, with Iceland make a single in a double at underarm, chain 1, 1 single in next double, \* chain 2, 1 single in next mesh, chain 2, 1 single in same place with double, chain 1, draw up a loop in top of double, draw up a loop in same place with single on half daisy, wrap, draw yarn through 3 loops, chain 2, 1 single in side of 1st green double, chain 2, 1 single in 2nd stitch of 6 chain of half daisy, chain 2, draw up a loop in single on edge of half daisy, and a loop in next white double, wrap, take off 3 loops, chain 1, 1 single in next double, repeat from \* around, join with a slip stitch. Break yarn. *2nd round:* With white Floss, work 2 single crochets in each space of 1 chain, and 3 single crochets in each space of 2 chain. Join round with a slip stitch. *3rd round:* With Iceland make a single crochet between 2 groups of singles, make a 2 chain over each group of 3, and a 1 chain over each group of 2 with a single crochet between. Join. Break yarn. With corn work like 2nd round. Repeat 3rd round. With green work like 2nd round.

**Neck-Band**—With Iceland make a loop on hook, work a single crochet in center of the unattached 3 chain at top of daisy on back of neck at left shoulder, chain 2, 1 double in same place as the double between the daisies, chain 1, 1 double in corresponding place on next daisy, \* chain 2, 1 single in center of next 3 chain, repeat from \* twice, chain 2, 1 double in same place with double, chain 1, 1 double in corresponding place on next daisy, repeat from \* across next daisy, then chain 2, 1 single in next 3 chain, chain 2, 1 double, chain 1, 1 double for corner, this completes back of

neck; continue down front as across back to point of V; do not chain between the 2 doubles at point of V; continue up to shoulder, join, break yarn. *2nd round:* With green work border as on sleeve. *3rd round:* Work with Iceland as on sleeve border to center front, then make a 1 chain instead of a 2 chain over the group of 3 each side of center. *4th round:* Corn. *5th round:* Like 3rd—do not chain over the 2 singles at corner of shoulder, make a single crochet each side with no chain between, work to center front, draw up a loop between the group of 3 and the group of 2, a loop between each of the next 2 groups, wrap, take off 4 loops, work to shoulder. *6th round:* White. Border at lower edge—Work with Iceland as around neck. Make border as on sleeve.

25 x 30 inches

**MATERIAL**—BEAR BRAND or BUCILLA Saxony 3-fold 7 balls Pink No. 203, 4 balls White.

BUCILLA Celluloid Crochet Hook No. 1.

Large Daisy Knitter,  $2\frac{1}{8}$  inch diameter.

25 inches Pink Satin.

**Daisies**—Wrap pink yarn 5 times on single spokes. See page 30. Break yarn. Make centers with white. Make 112 pink daisies.

**Pink and White Daisies**—wrap white yarn 3 times on single spokes, then wrap pink twice on single spokes making 5 threads on each spoke. Make centers with pink. Make 143 white and pink daisies.

**To Join Daisies**—With pink make a loop on hook, work a slip stitch under all 5 threads of a petal of a pink daisy (all joining of pink daisies is made under 5 threads of a petal), join as for carriage robe No. 285A having 2 rows with 15 pink daisies in each row. *3rd row:* 2 pink daisies working under 5 threads; 11 pink and white daisies working only under the 2 pink threads of each daisy; and 2 pink daisies working under 5 threads. Join this row as in 2nd row. Repeat 3rd row 12 times. *16th and 17th rows:* Same as 1st and 2nd rows. Finish remaining side same as 2nd side of each row. Border same as robe No. 285. Cut satin 25 x 30 inches. Turn under  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch on all edges for seam. Sew edge to wrong side of 2nd row of border.

## Crib Cover No. 286

34 x 45 inches

**MATERIAL**—BEAR BRAND or BUCILLA Zephyr Germantown 4-fold 19 Balls Snow White, 7 Balls Pink No. 203, 2 Balls Blue No. 100.

BEAR BRAND or BUCILLA Pompadour Yarn, 1 ball Pink No. 203.

BUCILLA Celluloid Crochet Hook No. 4.

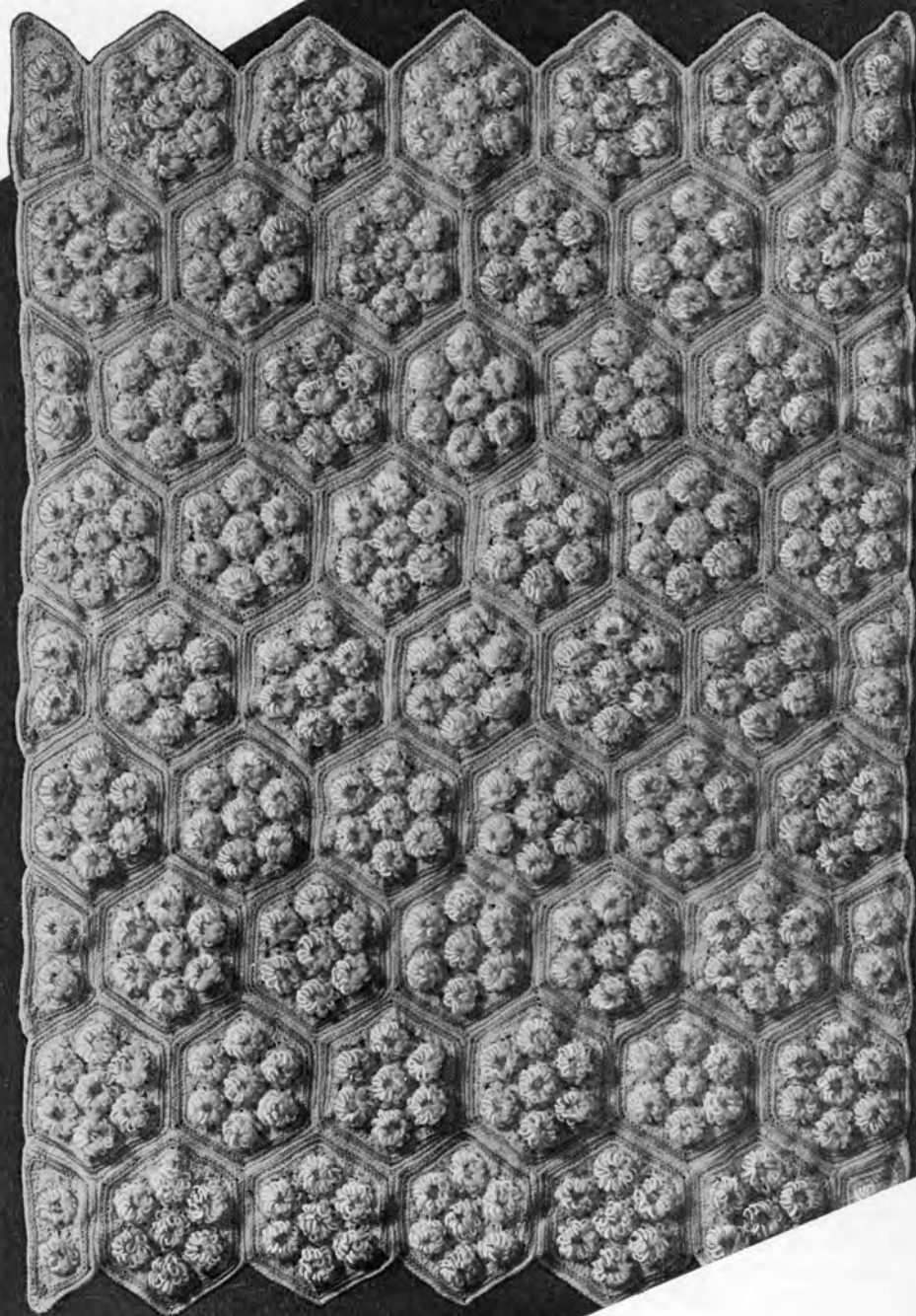
1 Small Daisy Knitter,  $1\frac{1}{8}$  inch diameter.

1 Motif =  $6\frac{1}{2}$  inches from point to point.

**Daisies**—Wrap white yarn twice around single spokes, then wrap pink Germantown twice on single spokes. This makes 4 threads on each spoke. See page 30.

Make centers with pink Pompadour. Make 252 white and pink daisies. Make 111 daisies all white wrapping 4 times on single spokes. Make centers with pink Pompadour.

**Motifs**—Center daisy with white yarn make a loop on hook, holding right side (white side) of a pink and white daisy toward you, work a slip stitch under the 2 pink loops of a petal leaving the white loops free; \* chain 2, 1 slip stitch under next 2 pink loops (all work is under the 2 pink loops of daisy), repeat from \* under each petal. Chain 2, join with a slip stitch to 1st petal. Break yarn. *1st round* — *1st daisy:* Make a slip stitch in a petal of another pink and white daisy, chain 2, a slip stitch in next petal, chain 2, a slip stitch in the 3rd petal, remove loop from hook, insert hook in a slip stitch in end of a petal of center daisy, and in loop just removed, draw this loop through, chain 2, slip stitch in next petal of new daisy, join this petal to next petal of center daisy same as last petal was joined, chain 2, 1 slip stitch in 5th petal of 1st daisy of 1st round, chain 2, 1 slip stitch in 6th petal. Do not chain after this 6th petal. *2nd daisy:* take up another pink and white daisy, work a slip stitch in end of a petal, chain 2, 1 slip stitch in end of next petal of 2nd daisy, remove hook, insert in the slip stitch at end of 5th petal

of last daisy, chain 2, 1 slip stitch in end of 3rd petal of 2nd daisy of 1st round, join as before to next petal of center daisy, chain 2, 1 slip stitch in 4th petal of 2nd daisy, join as before to next petal of center daisy, chain 2, a slip stitch in 5th petal of 2nd daisy, chain 2, a slip stitch in the 6th petal of 2nd daisy. Continue to join pink and white daisies like 2nd daisy until 5 daisies are joined to each other and to the center daisy. *6th daisy:* Join a pink and white daisy same as the other daisies with 2 petals joined to the 5th daisy, 2 to the center daisy, then join 1 petal to each of the 1st and 2nd petals of 1st daisy. \* Chain 2, 1 slip stitch in end of next petal of 6th daisy, repeat from \* in end of each free petal on this daisy, chain 2, 1 slip stitch in the slip stitch joining the 2 daisies and repeat from \* around the entire outside edge. *1st crocheted round:* Chain 2, \* work 1 half double crochet (wrap, insert hook in stitch, draw yarn through stitch, wrap, take off the 3 loops on hook) in each of the 2 stitches of 1st chain 2 of last round, skip the slip stitch, 1 single crochet in each of next 2 chain stitches, skip the slip stitch, 1 single crochet in each of the 2 chain stitches of both the 3rd and the 4th chains, 1 single crochet in the slip stitch, then work 1 single in each chain and skip each slip stitch to the 6th petal at outside edge of daisy, then work 1 half double in each of the 2 chain stitches, 1 double in the slip stitch joining the 2 daisies, repeat from \* around entire motif, join with a slip stitch to top of chain 2 at beginning of round. Drop white. Do not turn work. *2nd round:* Join pink Germantown, work 1 single crochet under back loop of each of 7 stitches, 2 single crochet in the 8th stitch, \* work 1 single crochet in each of 15 stitches, 2 single crochets in the next stitch, repeat from \* around, ending with 1 single crochet in each of 7 stitches, join with a slip stitch to beginning of round. Break pink. *3rd round:* Pick up white, work 1 single crochet in the back loop of each stitch, increasing 1 stitch in the 2nd stitch of the 2 stitches together of each increase of last round. Break yarn. Make 36 motifs using pink and white daisies. Make 13 motifs using all white daisies and using blue instead of pink for the 2nd crocheted round.

Sew together taking back loop the straight sides of 2 pink motifs. Opposite this, sew 1 blue, then 2 pink—5 motifs in a row. *2nd row:* Sew 1 pink, 1 blue, 2 pink, 1 blue, 1 pink. Sew this row above the 1st row having  $\frac{1}{2}$  of a pink block extend each side. Repeat these 2 rows alternately until there are 9 rows.

**Half motifs**—Join petals of center white daisy same as for motifs. Take up another white daisy join the 1st and 2nd petals to center daisy same as in motifs, then join remaining petals of this daisy same as outside edge of 1st round of motif. *1st crocheted round:* Work as for 1st crochet round of motif including the 4th chain of 2, then 1 single crochet in slip stitch, work 1 single crochet in each of next 2 chain stitches, skip the slip stitch, 1 single in each of next 2 chain stitches, skip the slip stitch, 1 half double in each of the next 2 chain stitches of the 7th chain, 5 double crochets in the slip stitch, 1 half double in each of the next 2 chains, skip the slip stitch, 1 single in each of the 2 stitches of the 9th chain, skip the slip stitch, 1 single in each of the next 2 chain stitches, skip the slip stitch \* work 1 half double in each of the 2 chain stitches, 1 double in the slip stitch joining the 2 daisies, 1 half double in each of the 2 stitches of the 1st chain on 2nd daisy, and reverse from \* to beginning of this row. Do not turn work. *2nd crocheted round:* Join blue, work 1 single crochet in each of 7 stitches taking back loop, 2 single crochet in the next, 1 single crochet in each of the next 7, 1 half double in each of 2 doubles, 5 doubles in the next stitch, 1 half double in each of the next 2 doubles, then work 1 single in each stitch to the group of 5 doubles of next corner, work same as in 1st group, then 1 single in each of next 7 stitches, 2 singles in the next, 1 single in each of the next 7, join with a slip stitch to 1st stitch of round. Break blue. *3rd crocheted round:* With white work 1 single crochet taking back loop in each of 8 stitches, 2 singles in the next stitch, 1 single in each stitch to the group of 5, 1 half double in each of 2, 5 doubles in the 3rd, 1 half double in each of next 2, \* 1 single in each stitch to next group of 5, reverse from \* to beginning of round, join with slip stitch to 1st stitch. Break yarn. Make 10 half motifs. Sew a half motif at each end of the 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th and 9th rows.

**BUCILLA** Celluloid Crochet

Daisy Knitter, small size—

**Daisies**—Wrap yarn 4 times on single  
spokes. See page 30. Make centers with  
Cherry Glowfloss. Make 90 daisies lightest  
rose, 248 daisies in next to lightest shade,  
360 daisies in next darker shade, 180 daisies  
darkest shade.

**To Join Daisies**—Center daisy—With  
same shade make a loop on hook, make  
a slip stitch under 2 back threads of a  
petal leaving free the 2 top threads,  
\* chain 2, a slip stitch under 2 back threads  
of next petal (all work is done on the 2  
back threads of petals, this will not be  
again mentioned), repeat from \* working  
in every petal until 12 petals are joined,

of 1st daisy. Then \* chain 2, 1 slip stitch  
in next petal of 6th daisy, and repeat from

around entire outside edge, join with a  
slip stitch to the joining of the 5th and  
6th daisies. Break yarn. Lay these daisies  
in front of you right side up. *2nd row of*  
*daisies:* 1st daisy—Begin like 1st daisy of  
1st round, join to 2nd petal at right of  
joining of 2 daisies of 1st round, join  
to next petal, and to 2 petals at left of  
same joining, always having a 2 chain be-  
tween, then chain 2, a slip stitch in next  
petal of 1st daisy of 2nd row, chain 2, 1  
slip stitch in next petal, 8 petals in all.  
*2nd daisy:* Make a slip stitch in a petal of  
another daisy and continue to join like 2nd  
daisy of 1st round. *3rd daisy:* Join like  
2nd daisy to 2 petals of 2nd daisy, then  
proceed as in 1st daisy of 2nd row joining  
to 4 petals of 1st round. Continue to join  
daisies like 2nd and 3rd daisies of 2nd  
row alternately until 7 are joined. Then  
crochet around outside edge of these 7  
daisies as on outside edge of 1st round.  
Break yarn. Make a loop on hook, make  
a slip stitch in end of a petal of a daisy,  
join this daisy like 1st daisy of 2nd row  
to 2 petals each side of the joining of  
the last 2 daisies at end of last row, then  
crochet around outside of petals until all  
are joined. Break yarn. Join daisy in same  
way to the 2 daisies at other end. Break  
yarn. This is 16 daisies to form a dia-  
mond. Make 5 diamonds of lightest rose,  
10 diamonds of next to lightest shade, 20  
diamonds of next to darkest shade, 10 dia-  
monds of darkest shade.

**Border of diamond**—Join green in back  
loop of center stitch of 4th (center) mesh  
of chain 2 at outside edge of the row  
of 4 daisies across center of diamond,  
chain 1, work under back loop 1 single  
crochet in same stitch, 1 single in each of  
next 6 stitches, skip 1 stitch, 1 single cro-  
chet in the next stitch, \* draw up a loop  
in next stitch, skip the stitch where the 2  
daisies were joined, draw up a loop in the



next stitch, wrap, take off the 3 loops, 1 single crochet in next stitch, skip 1 stitch, 1 single crochet in each of 8 stitches, skip 1, 1 single crochet in the next, repeat from \*; on daisy at point, you will have 20 single crochets instead of 8, continue down other side to center mesh at other end of row of 4 daisies having 7 singles at end of row. This leaves other half of diamond without border. Chain 1, turn. *2nd row:* Work single crochet under both loops of stitches of last row, 2 stitches in the 1st stitch, 1 in each of next 6 stitches; \* decrease by pulling up a loop in each of next 2 stitches, wrap take off the 3 loops on hook; 1 single crochet in each of 9 stitches, repeat from \* across row; on daisy at point, you will have 21 singles instead of 9; at end of row, you will have 6 stitches, increase 1 stitch in last stitch, break green, take off last 2 loops of last stitch with steel, chain 1, turn. *3rd row:* 2 single crochets in the 1st stitch, 1 single in each of 7 stitches, decrease as before, 1 stitch in each of next 8, decrease, 1 stitch in each of next 8, decrease, 1 stitch in each of next 10, 2 singles in the next, 1 in each of 9, decrease and work as on other side ending with 1 in each of 7, 2 in the last. Break steel, join green, chain 1. *4th row:* Decrease by drawing up a loop in each of 1st 2 stitches, also at each point opposite the joining of the daisies, do not increase at point, decrease 1 stitch in same way at end of row. Break yarn, join steel. *5th row:* Decrease 1 stitch at beginning and end of row, work 1 stitch in each stitch between. Break yarn. Work border in this way on one half of each diamond.

**Half diamonds for sides**—Join as for diamonds until there are 5 daisies of 1st round joined to center, then chain 2, 1 slip stitch in end of next petal of 5th daisy of 1st round and continue around outside edge until all petals are joined. Break yarn.

Take up another daisy and work as for 1st daisy of 2nd row joining this daisy to 2 petals each side of the joining of the 4th and 5th daisies of last row, after joining at these 4 places, chain 2, 1 slip stitch with a 2 chain between, in each of the next 4 free petals, 1 slip stitch in a petal of another daisy, chain 2, 1 slip stitch in next petal of this new daisy, join as before to the 9th petal of last daisy, then chain 2, slip stitch in next petal of new daisy, continue around outside edge of these 2 daisies. Join. Break yarn. Join 2

daisies in same way to other end, joining the 1st one each side of joining of the 1st and 2nd daisies of 1st row and working in each of 6 petals instead of 4 before joining 2nd daisy. There are 10 daisies. Make 1 half-diamond of lightest shade, 2 of next to lightest, 4 of next to darkest, 2 of the darkest shade. On lightest half-diamond work border as on diamonds to center of 6th mesh on the daisy at point, chain 1, turn. Work border on these 4 daisies of the half-diamond as on diamonds, do not increase or decrease at top of this end daisy. Work border in same way on 4 next to darkest half-diamonds. These 5 half-diamonds are for left edge of afghan. On next to lightest half-diamond join yarn in the 6th mesh on daisy at point of half diamond, and work across outside edge to center of the 4th daisy. Work border on these 4 daisies. Make border in same way on the 2 next to lightest half-diamonds, and on the 2 darkest. With steel, sew afghan together as follows:—*1st row at bottom of afghan*—Lay in front of you 1 half-diamond at left side, and 5 whole diamonds of next to darkest shade having all edges with borders toward the top. Sew ends of last 2 rows of border (the decreased rows) of the half-diamond to ends of last 2 rows of next diamond, continue to sew together in this way the 5 diamonds. *2nd row:* Sew together in same way 5 diamonds of darkest shade, and 1 half-diamond of same shade at right edge. Sew the border side of 1st row to side of 2nd row without border, sewing increased ends of borders of 2nd row to center top of border of 1st row of diamonds, leave 1 mesh each side of the joining of 2 daisies, and 2 steel stitches opposite, unsewed. *3rd row:* Next to darkest shade 1 half-diamond at left edge, 5 diamonds. *4th row:* Next to lightest shade—5 diamonds, 1 half diamond at right edge. *5th row:* Center—lightest shade—1 half-diamond, 5 diamonds. *6th row:* Same as 4th and continue to reverse rows ending with 9th row like 1st.

**Triangles for ends**—Join next to lightest shade daisies as for whole diamonds until there are 4 daisies in 2nd round joined to center. Then crochet around edge of daisies as before. Break yarn. Take up another daisy and join to 2 petals each side of the joining of the 2nd and 3rd daisies of last row, then crochet around outside edge of this daisy. There are 6 daisies. Break yarn. Make 10 triangles.

**Border**—Beginning in center stitch of the 5th mesh at outside edge of a corner daisy, work border as on diamonds up 1



side, around point, to corresponding point on other side, this is 2 sides of a triangle. Work back and forth increasing 1 stitch each side on the 2nd and 4th rows. Make borders on 5 half-diamonds for openings below 1st row. Sew in place. Beginning in the center stitch of 5th mesh at outside edge of a corner daisy of a triangle, join green, work 1 single crochet in back loop of same stitch and 1 in each stitch until there are 10 singles, skip 1, 1 single in the next, decrease as before, 1 single, skip 1, 8 singles, skip 1, 1 single, decrease, 1 single, skip 1, 10 singles, chain 1, turn. Work border as before increasing 1 stitch each side every row. Work this border on 5 triangles. Sew these into the openings on top of afghan, sewing last row of border to the 3rd stitch from center top of 9th row of diamonds.

**Quarter-diamonds**—Next to lightest shade, join as for diamonds until there are 2 daisies of 1st round joined to center daisy. Then crochet around outside edge of these 2. Break yarn. Take up another daisy, join to center daisy in the 4th then the 3rd petal from 1st daisy, crochet around outside edge. Sew in right lower corner of afghan having the 2 daisies on a straight line with the 3 daisies of the triangles and the single daisy on line with the single daisy at point of triangles. For upper right corner, join the 2 daisies as before to center. Join the remaining daisy to the 3rd and 4th petals from the joining of 2nd daisy. Sew in place.

**Outside border**—Beginning at upper left corner of afghan, join green yarn in edge of corner daisy in next stitch to end of border, chain 1, work 1 single crochet in the same stitch, 1 single crochet in each of the next 12 stitches; skip 1; \* draw up a loop in the next stitch, skip 2 (1 stitch each side of the joining of 2 daisies), draw up a loop in the next, wrap, draw yarn through the three loops on hook; 1 single in the next stitch; draw up a loop in each of the next 2 stitches, wrap, take off 3 loops; 1 single in the next; draw up a loop, skip 2 (1 stitch each side of next joining of daisies), draw up a loop in next stitch, wrap, take off the 3 loops, skip 1 stitch, work 1 single crochet in each of 15 stitches, skip 1, repeat from \* across edge of half diamond. Work 1 single crochet in end of each of the 8 rows of border. Continue to work in this way down long side to lower corner, work 21 stitches on this corner daisy. Work 1 single crochet in end of each of the 5 rows of border; work across the 3 daisies of triangle same as border on other side of triangle; 1 single crochet in end of each of the 10 rows of border, and continue across lower

edge in this way to next corner. There will be 21 singles on this corner daisy: skip 1, draw up a loop in next stitch, skip 2 stitches at joining of the 2 daisies, draw up a loop in next stitch, wrap, take off 3 loops, and continue to work as on 1st long side to upper right corner; work 21 single crochets on corner daisy, skip 1, 1 single crochet in next, draw up a loop in the next stitch, skip 1, draw up a loop in next stitch, wrap, take off 3 loops, 1 single crochet in next stitch, skip 1, 1 single in each of 8 stitches of remaining daisy. Chain 1, turn. **2nd row:** Increase 1 stitch in 1st stitch, work across these 2 daisies as at point of diamond; on long side, decrease 1 stitch by drawing up a loop each side of 1st decrease stitch of last row (opposite joining of daisies), wrap, take off the 3 loops; 1 single crochet in each of the next 2 stitches; draw up a loop each side of decrease opposite next joining of daisies, 1 single crochet in each of 14 stitches on next daisy, 1 single crochet in each stitch on ends of border, continue to work across row having 1 stitch in each stitch and decreasing as above opposite each joining of daisies, to corner. Work around corner daisy as on point of diamond, continue across lower edge as in 2nd row of diamond border. Work around corner as before. Work 2nd long side like 1st long side, increasing 1 stitch in the end stitch. Join steel, chain 1, turn. Break green. **3rd row:** Work 1 single crochet in each stitch, increase 1 stitch in center of each scallop; between scallops, decrease 1 stitch as in last row opposite each joining of daisies having 1 single crochet between the 2 decreases, continue in this way to corner, working 1 single crochet in each stitch on ends of borders; work around corner and across lower edge as on diamonds, working 1 single crochet in each stitch opposite borders. On 2nd side work as for 1st long side, work around next corner and to end of row. Join green, chain 1, turn. Break steel. **4th row:** Increase 1 stitch in 1st stitch, work 1 stitch in each stitch of scallop; decrease, work around corner 1 stitch in each stitch. On long side, work 1 stitch in each stitch on scallops; between scallops decrease as follows:—draw up a loop in each of next 2, wrap, take off 3 loops, draw up a loop in each of next 2, wrap, take off 3 loops and repeat on long side. On lower edge, work across daisies as on 4th row of diamond border, with 1 stitch in each stitch across ends of borders; work up 2nd long side as on 1st, increase 1 stitch at end of row. Break green. Join steel, chain 1. **5th row:** Work 1 single crochet in each stitch of last row. Break yarn, sew ends of border to afghan.

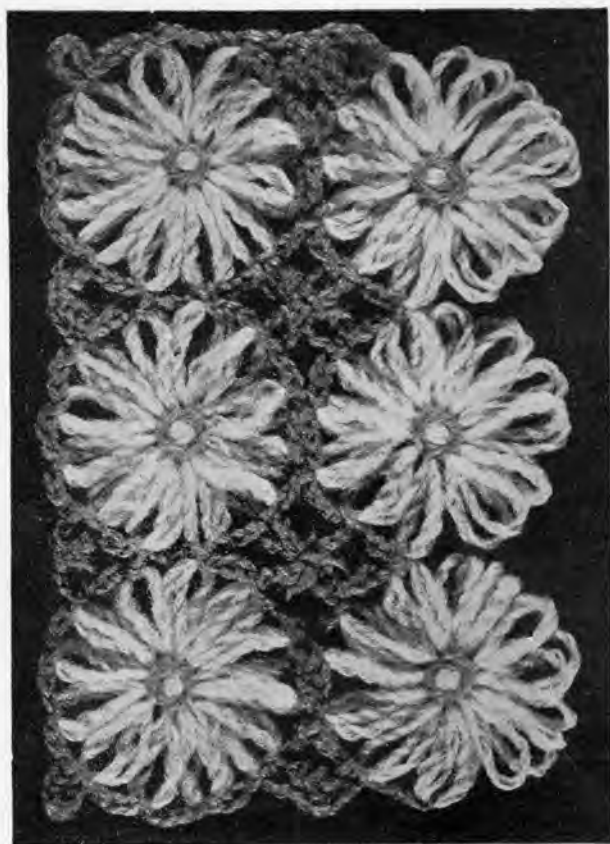
## TO JOIN DAISIES WITH PICOT JOINING

Make a loop on hook. Make a slip stitch in end of a petal, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in end of next petal; for picot chain 5, 1 slip stitch in top of last slip stitch, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in each of next 3 petals with chain 3 between, make another picot as before, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in the next or 6th petal. Do not chain 3 after the 6th petal.

2nd daisy—1 slip stitch in a petal on a 2nd daisy, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in the 2nd petal; chain 3 for picot, join with slip stitch to top of last picot on 1st daisy, chain 2, 1 slip stitch in top of slip stitch in end of 2nd petal. This completes a picot. Chain 3, 1 slip stitch in 3rd petal, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in each of next 2 petals with a 3 chain between, chain 5 for picot, join with a slip stitch to top of last slip stitch, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in 6th petal of 2nd daisy. Join remaining daisies of row like 2nd daisy.

Second side of 1st row—Chain 3, 1 slip stitch in the 7th petal of last daisy, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in 8th petal, chain 5 for picot, 1 slip stitch in top of slip stitch in 8th petal, \* chain 3, 1 slip stitch in each of the next 3 petals with 3 chain between, chain 5 for picot 1 slip stitch in slip stitch at top of 11th petal, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in the 12th petal, wrap yarn twice around hook, draw a loop through the slip stitch joining the 1st petal of this daisy to the next daisy, wrap, draw through 2 loops 3 times to form a treble crochet; 1 slip stitch in the 7th petal of next daisy, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in the 8th petal, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in top of last picot of last daisy, chain 3, slip stitch in top of slip stitch in 8th petal of this daisy, repeat from \* across row, complete last daisy ending with a treble in 1st petal of 1st daisy joined. Chain 3, 1 slip stitch in the top of last picot.

2nd row of daisies—chain 3, 1 slip stitch in a petal of a daisy, chain 3, 1 slip stitch



of last picot, \* chain 3, 1 slip stitch in top of slip stitch in 2nd petal of this new daisy, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in next petal, 1 slip stitch in slip stitch in next petal on the daisy of last row, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in the 4th petal of new daisy, 1 slip stitch in next petal of daisy of last row. Chain 3, 1 slip stitch in 5th petal of new daisy, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in the joining of the 2 picots between the 2 daisies of last row, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in slip stitch in 5th petal of daisy of 2nd row, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in the 6th petal of this same daisy. Take up another daisy. Work 1 slip stitch in a petal, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in the 2nd petal, chain 3, 1 slip stitch in the top of the 3 picots together, repeat from \* across row to end. Then work same as 2nd side of 1st row.



# TO MAKE DAISIES

**Illustration A**—Back view with spokes released.

Hold knitter in left hand with flat side toward you. Holding knob between thumb and fore finger of right hand with thumb at bottom, push thumb to left to turn knob and release spokes.

**Illustration B**—*Single Petal Daisy Wrapped Over 1 Spoke*. With left thumb, hold yarn across center of knitter leaving end extend about 1 inch beyond center. With right hand, pass yarn from left to right around spoke at top (No. 1); across center of knitter, from right to left around spoke directly opposite (No. 2), across center of knitter, from left to right around spoke No. 3 at right of 1st spoke wrapped; across center, from right to left around spoke No. 4 at left of 2nd spoke wrapped; across center, from left to right around spoke No. 5; across center, from right to left around spoke No. 6; and continue in this way wrapping each spoke once, always passing across center to wrap spoke opposite, until the 12th spoke is wrapped. Bring yarn across center and cut end about 1 inch beyond center. *Make center before removing daisy from Knitter*. See illustration E.

**Illustration C** — *Double Petal Daisy Wrapped Over 1 Spoke*. With left thumb hold yarn at center leaving end to extend about 1 inch; with right hand, pass yarn from left to right around spoke No. 1 at top; across center; from right to left around spoke No. 2 directly opposite, wrap around these 2 spokes once more in same way; across center, from left to right around spoke No. 3 at right of spoke 1st wrapped; across center, from right to left around spoke No. 4 at left of 2nd spoke wrapped; wrap these 2 spokes once more; across center, from left to right around spoke No. 5; from right to left around spoke No. 6; around these 2 once more; and continue in this way wrapping twice around 2 spokes exactly opposite then passing on to the next 2, until all spokes

are wrapped twice ending with No. 12; bring yarn across center and cut end about 1 inch beyond center. If a daisy of more layers of petals is desired, wrap as many times as you desire layers of petals. *Make center before removing daisy from Knitter*. See illustration E.

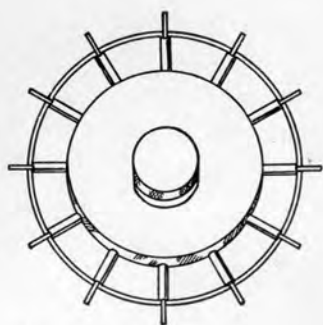
**Illustration D** — *Single Petal Daisy Wrapped Over 2 Spokes*. With left thumb, hold yarn at center allowing end to extend about 1 inch. With right hand, pass yarn from left to right around spokes Nos. 1 and 2; across center, from right to left around Nos. 3 and 4; across center, around 5 and 6; across center, around 7 and 8; across center, around 9 and 10; across center, around 11 and 1; across center, around 12 and 3; across center, around 2 and 5; across center, around 4 and 7; across center, around 6 and 9; across center, around 8 and 11; across center, around 10 and 12; across center, cut end about 1 inch beyond center. *Make center before removing daisy from Knitter*. See illustration E.

*To Make Double Petal Daisy Wrapped over 2 spokes*. Make same as single petal over 2 spokes, then continue to wrap in same way as many times as desired.

**Illustration E**—**Center**. Thread needle with yarn for center. Fasten at center of wrong side of daisy as for embroidery. The side of daisy toward you is the wrong side. Insert needle under 4 petals, draw yarn through tightly; bring yarn back over the last 3 of these 4 petals, insert needle under these 3 petals and 1 more making 4 petals in all; draw yarn through, continue to bring yarn back over 3 petals and draw it under 4 petals each time until you have made 13 stitches. Be sure there are 13, otherwise your center will not be complete. Fasten yarn on wrong side. Cut off all ends close to center.

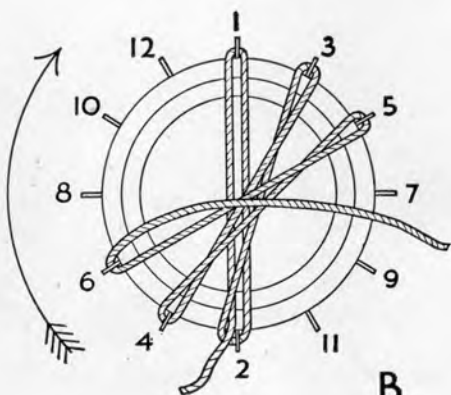
Turn knob in opposite direction to draw in spokes and release daisy.

**Illustration F**. Right side of complete daisy.

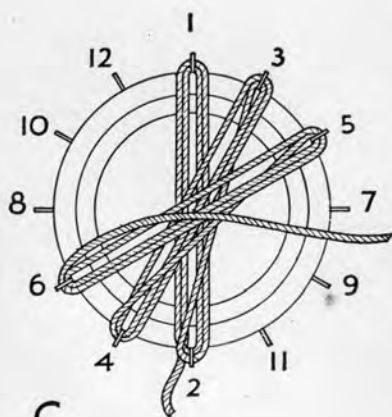
