ANOTHER ARBEE INSTRUCTION

## BASIC LARGE SINGLE DAISY

The Basic Large Single Daisy, is made on the OUTSIDE PEGS ONLY.

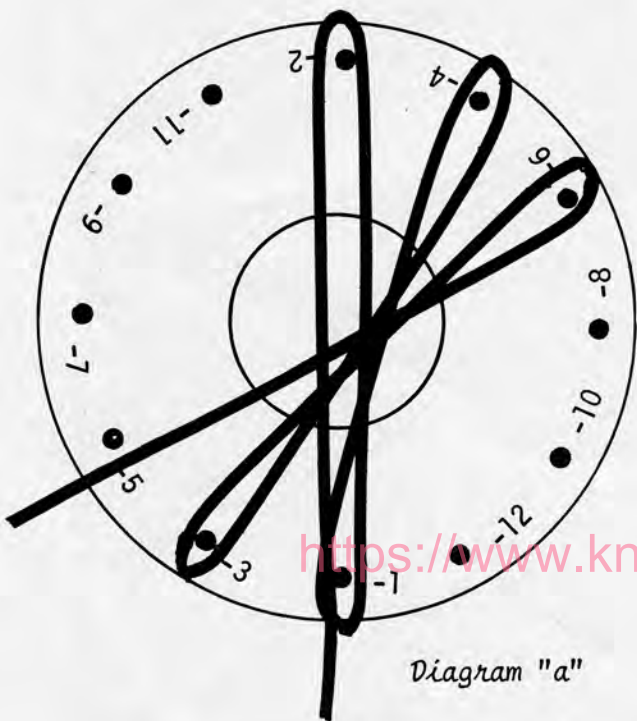
METHOD - Working on the outer row peg, place end of yarn, and hold at bottom edge of wheel, wind around peg 1" - (Diag."a"). Wind around pegs, then peg 2 working clockwise - (Diag."b"). Continue winding until peg 12 is wound. Cut yarn, leaving approx. 12" from centre. Thread through a chenille needle, and pass through centre of Daisy, and out to the back. Centre must be completely wound, before removing Daisy from wheel. If more than one layer of petals is desired, wind yarn around peg as many times as you need, and continue as Basic pattern.

Single small Daisies can also be made on Centre pegs.

The top side of the Daisy, is the right side.

When the outside petals have been wound, take chenille needle with 18" of contrasting yarn, to sew flower centre. Bring needle through from the back to centre front of Daisy, leaving 1" lap. Put needle down between petals - 1 & 3, under Daisy and up between petals 2 & 4 again, through 1 & 3, under and up between petals 4 & 6, down between 3 & 5, up between 6 & 8. Continue in clockwise direction until all petals are sewn.

Tie both ends tightly together, or sew back through middle.



### BASIC SMALL SINGLE DAISY

The Small Single Daisy is made on INSIDE PEGS ONLY.

METHOD - Same method as for Large Single Daisy, using inside pegs only.

The small Daisy with triple petals, takes 2½ yards of Fiesta Yarn, for the petals, and 2/3rds. of a yard of contrast yarn for the centre.



### FRINGED DAISY

After removing the Daisy from the wheel, cut through tips of the petals. Comb with wire suede brush, or sharp comb.



### BASIC DOUBLE FLOWER

METHOD - Follow the Instruction for the Basic Large Single Daisy.

When all 12 petals have been wound, pull thread through to wrong side, and hold. Do not proceed to sew centre.

Starting at peg (1), wind yarn on small pegs, forming a smaller Daisy. When all 12 pegs have been wound, sew flower centre, as in method for Large Single Daisy.



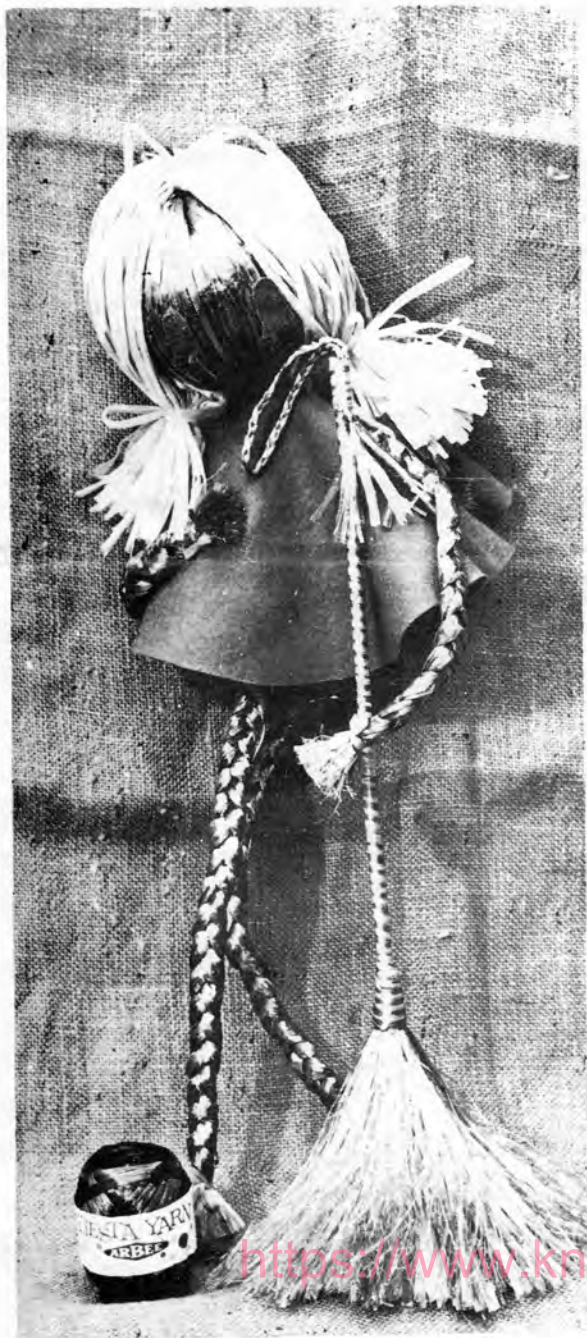
### BUD OR STRAWBERRY

METHOD - Reverse Instructions for Basic Double Flower. Make first step on small pegs. Then wind large outer petals, and sew centre. Before cutting yarn, thread through loops (petals), and pull off pegs as you go. Draw into a ball, stitch down through centre.
