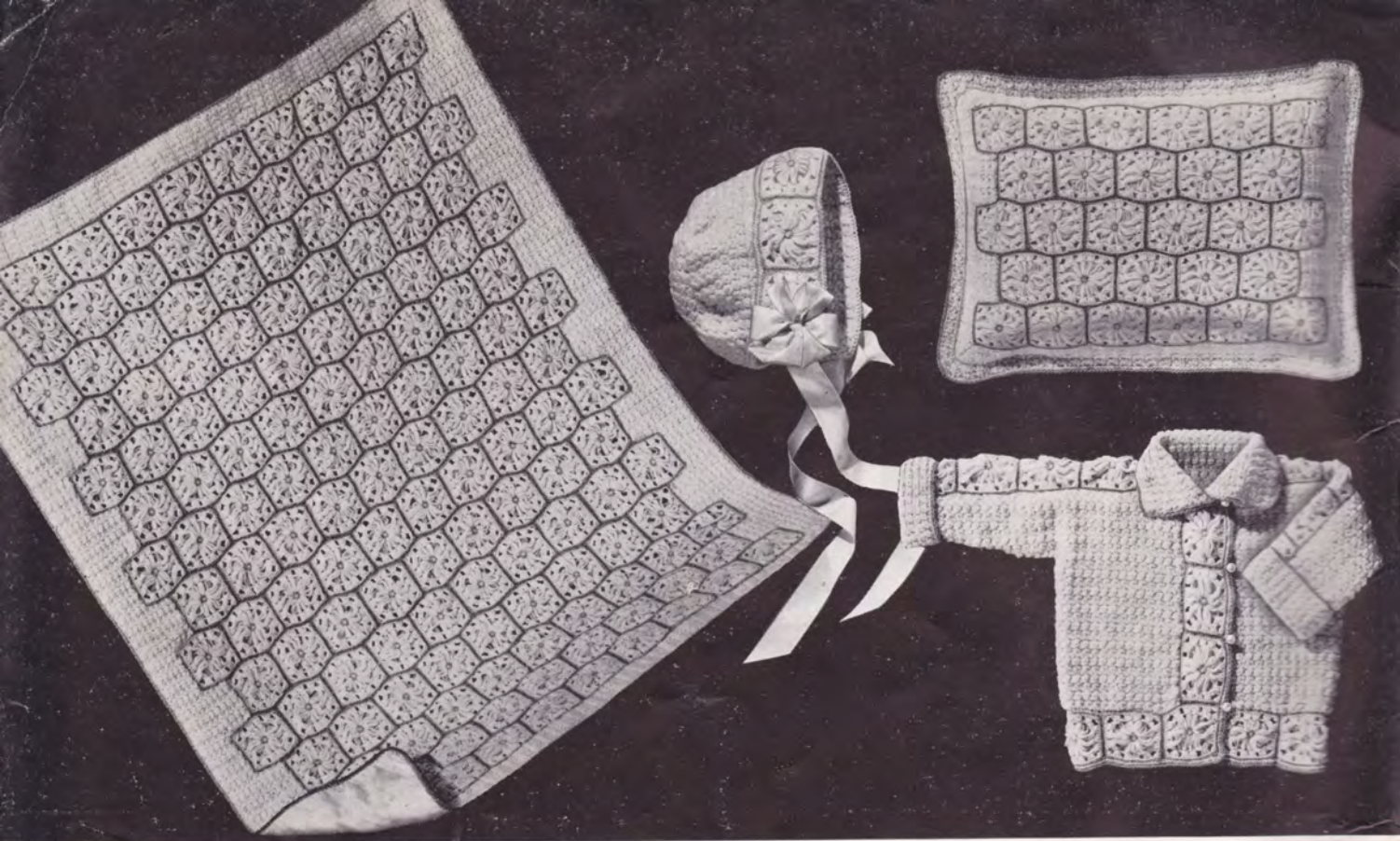

INFANT SET No. 2602

Carriage Cover No. 2602A

Approximate Size: 26 inches by 31 inches

Materials

Fleisher's Cheviot Zephyr, 5 balls White; 2 balls Color.
 1 Fleisher's Steel Crochet Hook, Size 2, Article 300.
 Adjustable Fleisher Flower Loom.
 Lining if desired.

Oblong

Following directions included with the Adjustable Fleisher Flower Loom, set loom in first groove from top of rod. With white, using 3 strands wind as follows: down into notch 1, around spoke 1, back into notch 1; across disc, down into notch 7, around spoke 7, back into notch 7; across disc, down into notch 2, around spoke 2, back into notch 2; across disc, down into notch 8, around spoke 8, back into notch 8; (See Ill. C and Page 3 for these first 4 petals), across disc, down into notch 3, around spokes 3, 4, 5 and 6, back into notch 3; across disc, down into notch 9, around spokes 9, 10, 11 and 12, back into notch 9; across disc, down into notch 5, around spokes 5, 6 and 7, back into notch 5; across disc, down into notch 11, around spokes 11, 12 and 1, back into notch 11; across disc, down into notch 6, around spokes 6, 7, 8 and 9, back into notch 6; across disc, down into notch 12, around spokes 12, 1, 2 and 3, back into notch 12. Fasten center with single strand of color as for 12 petal daisies (Ill. E and Page 3), working 11 sts instead of 13. You will have a 10 petal oblong with 4 long corner petals, 1 medium

petal on each short side, and 2 short petals on each long side. Make 143 of these oblongs.

Unit

First round—With white, make a loop on hook, with right side of oblong toward you, work * 1 s c in large corner petal (always insert hook under the 3 strands of each petal), ch 3, 1 s c in same petal, ch 3, 1 s c in next (side) petal, ch 2, 1 s c in next (side) petal, ch 3, 1 s c in next corner petal, ch 3, 1 s c in same petal, ch 3, 1 s c in next petal, ch 3, repeat from * once, join with a slip st in first s c.

2nd round—Ch 3, 2 d c in same st as joining st, * ch 4, 1 d c in fourth st from hook, 3 d c in next s c of round below, ch 2, 3 d c in each of the next 2 s c, ch 2, 3 d c in next s c, ch 4, 1 d c in fourth st from hook, 3 d c in each of the next 3 s c, repeat from * around, join with a slip st in top st of beginning ch 3. Fasten off.

3rd round—With color make a loop on hook, work 1 slip st in each st of round below, taking up back thread of st only. Fasten off, leaving a short end for joining of units. The unit should measure $1\frac{3}{4}$ inches by $2\frac{1}{4}$ inches. Work this edging around all 143 oblongs.

Joining of Units

Working from wrong side, and taking up half of stitches only, sewing stitch for stitch, join units into 8 strips of 10 units each and 7 strips of 9 units each, joining these strips as on pillow chart, being careful that all units face the same way.

Crochet Border

Gauge: 7 clusters=2 inches 7 rows=2 inches
 A cluster is always worked in 2 sts.



Straight Strips

Beginning Mitered Corner

1st row—With white make a loop on hook, ch 5, thread over hook, draw up a loop in fourth chain from hook, over and through 2 loops, leave remaining loops on hook, over, draw up a second loop in same st, over and through 2 loops, over, draw up a third loop in same st, over, draw up a fourth loop in next st, over and through 1, over and through all remaining 7 loops (a cluster worked in 2 sts).

2nd row—Ch 4, turn, work an increasing cluster in eye of cluster below (an increasing cluster is worked like a cluster but in only 1 place), ch 1, work a cluster in same place as increasing cluster and in top st of turning chain.

3rd row—Ch 4, turn, work a cluster in eye of first cluster of row below and under next chain 1, ch 1, work a cluster in eye of next cluster and in top stitch of turning chain, ch 1, work an increasing cluster in same top stitch of turning chain.

4th row—Ch 4, turn, work an increasing cluster in eye of first cluster, ch 1, work a cluster in same eye and under next chain 1, ch 1, work a cluster in next eye and under next chain 1, ch 1, work a third cluster in next eye and in top st of turning chain.

5th row—Ch 4, turn, work in same way as 3rd row having 4 clusters and 1 increasing cluster in row. This completes the mitered corner.

6th row—Ch 4, turn, work 5 clusters. Repeat 6th row 89 times or until 90 even rows of 5 clusters are completed.

End Mitered Corner

Turn, slip st over first cluster, work 4 clusters, turn, work 3 clusters, turn, slip st over first cluster, work 2 clusters, turn, work 1 cluster. Fasten off. Make another strip in same way.

Crocheted Border—Irregular Strip

Work 5 rows of a beginning mitered corner as on straight strips. Work 6 even rows having 5 clusters in each row.

* **12th row**—Do not break yarn, but continuing, chain 12, turn, work a cluster in fourth and sixth chain from hook, ch 1, work 3 more clusters on chain working the first half of each cluster in same st as last half of preceding cluster and always skipping 1 st on chain when working second half of cluster. Continue in pattern to end of row (9 clusters in all). Work 6 even rows having 9 clusters in each row (7 rows of 9 clusters in all). This completes wide section of irregular border strip. Work 7 even rows having 5 clusters in each row. (These 7 rows complete a narrow section of irregular strip.) Repeat from * 6 times, then work end mitered corner as on straight strip. Make another strip in same way.

Joining

Place strips around joined units, sew neatly matching mitered corners evenly.

INFANT SET No. 2601

(For charts, see pages 6 and 7)

Afghan No. 2601A

Approximate Size: 26 inches by 32 inches

Materials

Fleisher's French Zephyr, 3 balls White.
Fleisher's Shetland Floss, 2 balls White, 1 ball Color.
1 Fleisher's Steel Crochet Hook, Size 2, Article 300.
Adjustable Fleisher Flower Loom.
Silk for lining if desired.

Flower

Following directions included with the Adjustable Fleisher Flower Loom, set loom into first groove from top of rod. With color Shetland using 2 strands, wind as for six petal cosmos (Page 6), cut color Shetland, then with 2 strands of white Shetland wind in same way in empty notches and around empty spokes. Sew center with 2 strands of white Shetland as for twelve petal daisies (Ill. E and Page 3). You will have a twelve petal flower, 6 color and 6 white petals alternating, having 2 strands in each petal. Make 200 of these flowers.

Unit

With French Zephyr, make a loop on hook, * work 1 d c in color petal (always insert hook under both strands of each petal), ch 3, 1 d c in same petal (a corner loop), ch 3, 1 s c in next (white) petal, ch 3, repeat from * 5 times, join with a slip st in top of first d c. Fasten off, leaving a short end for joining. You will have a 6 pointed unit with a corner loop above each color petal. Work this edging around all 200 flowers.

Joinings

Following afghan chart, being careful that all face the same way, sew units together by tacking firmly in center st of corner loops and in s c of white petals as at place marked X on detail chart.

Center Crochet Section

Gauge: 3 V patterns=1 inch, 4 rows=1 inch

With French Zephyr ch 93, work 1 d c in 6th st from hook, * skip next 2 sts on chain, 1 d c in next st, ch 2, 1 d c in same st (a V pattern), repeat from * to end of chain, (30 V patterns in row).

2nd row—Ch 5, turn, 1 d c in first space, * 1 d c in space of next V pattern, ch 2, 1 d c in same space, repeat from * to end of row (30 V patterns). Repeat second row 67 times (69 rows in all). Fasten off.

Outer Border Around Joined Units

1st round—With French Zephyr make a loop on hook, with right side of units toward you, work an s c in corner loop of first unit on short side of joined units (A on chart), * ch 5, 1 tr (twice over hook) with ch 1 in each of the next 6 spaces, ch 5, 1 s c in next space (this is in the free corner loop of next unit), repeat from * to last unit on this short side; ch 5, 1 tr in next space, 1 tr in next space, ch 5, 1 s c in next space (this space is a corner loop); working on long side, * work ch 3 and 1 s c in each of the next 3 spaces, ch 5, work a tr with ch 1 in each of the next 10 spaces, ch 5, 1 s c in next space (this is in a corner loop), repeat from last * to end of this long side; work this corner same as last corner and con-

tinue to work around other two sides in same way, join with slip st in first s c.

2nd round—Ch 5, 1 d c in same st as joining st, ch 5, 1 s c in top of first tr, ch 3, * thread over hook, draw up a loop in next space, thread over, through 2 loops, leave remaining loops on hook, repeat from * 4 times, thread over and through all 6 loops on hook (a d c shell), ch 3, 1 s c in top of next tr, ch 5, a V pattern in next s c, ch 5, 1 s c in top of next tr, ch 3, repeat from first * to next corner ending with a V pattern in s c; ch 5, 1 s c in top of first corner tr, ch 5, 1 tr in space after this tr, ch 5, 1 s c in top of 2nd corner tr; working on long side, † ch 5, skip next space, work a V pattern in each of the next 3 spaces, (these 3 spaces are above unit), ch 5, 1 s c in top of next tr, ch 5, * thread twice over hook, draw up a loop in next space, thread over, through 2 loops, thread over, through 2 loops, leave remaining loops on hook, repeat from last * 8 times, thread over and through all 10 loops on hook (a tr shell), ch 5, 1 s c in top of next tr, repeat from † to first tr of next corner, work this corner same as last corner, continue to work around other two sides in same way, join with slip st in third st of beginning ch 5, 1 slip st in next space.

3rd round—Ch 5, 1 d c in same space, * a V pattern under next ch 5, a V pattern in next s c, a V pattern in top of next d c shell, a V pattern in next s c, a V pattern under next ch 5, a V pattern in next V pattern, repeat from * to last s c on this short side; work a V pattern, ch 2, another V pattern, all in top of corner tr; working on long side, work a V pattern in next s c, † a V pattern under next ch 5, a V pattern in each of the next 3 V patterns, a V pattern under next ch 5, a V pattern under next ch 5, a V pattern in top of next tr shell, a V pattern under next ch 5, repeat from † to next corner tr, work this corner same as last corner; continue to work around other two sides in same way, join as in last round.

4th round—Work a V pattern in each V pattern of round below and under each corner ch 2, join as before.

5th round—Work even in V patterns. Repeat last round once. Fasten off.

7th round—With color make a loop on hook, * work an s c in a V pattern below, ch 3, 1 more s c in same V pattern, repeat from * in each V pattern in round, join with a slip st in first s c. Fasten off. Darn in all ends neatly.

Inner Border

With right side of units toward you, beginning at point marked B on chart, work around the inner sides of joined units in the same way as the first two rounds of Outer Border, working larger shells in corners, thus filling in the spaces between units. Insert crochet section into opening of the joined units and sew neatly.

Pillow No. 2601B

Approximate Size: 14 inches by 18 inches

Materials

Fleisher's French Zephyr, 1 ball White.
Fleisher's Shetland Floss, 1 ball White, 1 ball Color.

Units

Following directions of afghan No. 2601 make 54 units.

Joinings

Following pillow chart, join units as at places marked X on detail chart by tacking firmly.

Center Crochet Section

With French Zephyr ch 36, work in same way as first row of center crochet section of afghan having 11 V patterns in row. Work as on afghan until 36 rows are completed. Fasten off.

Work the same Outer Border and the same Inner Border for pillow as on afghan. Insert center crochet section and sew neatly.

Sacque No. 2601C

6 months to 1 year

Materials

Fleisher's French Zephyr, 1 ball White.

Fleisher's Shetland Floss, 1 ball White, 1 ball Color.

2 yards Ribbon $\frac{3}{8}$ inch wide.

Units

Following directions as for afghan No. 2601, make 127 units.

Following sacque chart, join 85 units for body of sacque tacking as at places marked X on detail chart.

Front Borders

With French Zephyr, make a loop on hook, working from bottom of right front of sacque (see I on chart), work 1 s c in last free corner loop of first unit, * ch 5, work a tr (twice over hook) with ch 1 in each of the next 10 spaces, ch 5, 1 s c in next space (this space is in a corner loop), work ch 3 and 1 s c in each of the next 3 spaces, repeat from * once, ch 5, work 1 tr with ch 1 in each of the next 7 spaces.

2nd row—Ch 10, turn, thread twice over hook, draw up a loop in 6th st from hook, thread over, through 2 loops, over, through two loops, * thread over hook twice, draw up a loop in next space, thread over, through 2 loops, over, through 2 loops, repeat from * 5 times, over and through all 8 loops on hook (a shell), † ch 5, 1 s c in top of next tr, ch 5, skip the next space, work 1 d c,—ch 2,—1 d c (a V pattern) in each of the next 3 spaces, ch 5, 1 s c in top of next tr, ch 5, repeat between *'s 9 times, thread over and through all 10 loops on hook, repeat from † once, ch 5, 1 s c in top of next tr, ch 5, skip next space, a V pattern in each of the next 3 spaces.

3rd row—Ch 5, turn, 1 d c in first V pattern, work a V pattern in each of the V patterns,—under each ch 5,—and in top of each shell of row below. Fasten off. Work border of left front in same way.

Yoke

With French Zephyr make a loop on hook, with right side of work toward you, beginning at top of right front, work 1 d c and ch 1 in each of the first 4 spaces, skip next corner loop of first unit, * 1 d c and ch 1 in each of the next 2 spaces, 1 s c in next space (this is in a corner loop), ch 1, 1 d c and ch 1 in each of the next 2 spaces, skip the next 2 joined corner loops, repeat from * twice, ch 30 for shoulder, skip first corner loop of first unit of back, repeat between *'s over the 6 units of back, ch 30 for other shoulder, work over left front to correspond to right front.

2nd row—Ch 5, turn, work 1 d c in first space, * skip next space, a V pattern in next space, repeat from * to shoulder chain, work V patterns on chain skipping 2 chains between V patterns, continue to work in same way to end of row.

3rd row—Work a V pattern in each V pattern of row below. Repeat 3rd row 5 times.

9th row (decrease row)—Ch 5, turn, 1 d c in first pattern, work 1 V pattern in each of the next 4 V patterns, * work 1 d c in next V pattern (a decrease), work 1 V pattern in each of the next 5 V patterns, repeat from * to end of row.

10th row—Turn, work 1 V pattern in each V pattern of row below skipping the single d c. Work one row even in V pattern.

12th row—Work in same way as 9th row (decrease row) except having 3 V patterns between decreases.

13th row—Same as 10th row.

Beading at Neck

Ch 6, turn, skip first V pattern, 1 tr in next V pattern, work ch 2 and 1 tr in each V pattern of row below.

Edging

Ch 5, turn, 1 d c in first space, 1 V pattern in each space along neckline, then working around entire sacque, work 1 V pattern in each space on sides of yoke and bottom of sacque and in each V pattern, fasten off.

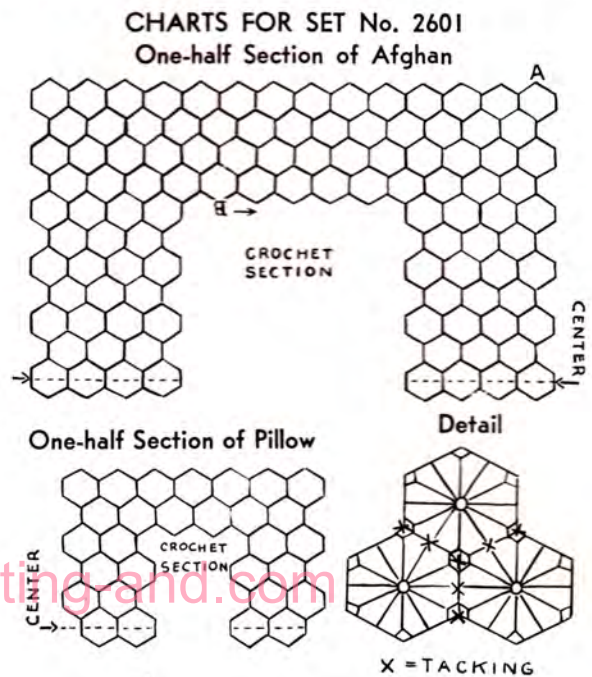
2nd row—With color, work 1 s c in any V pattern, ch 3, 1 s c in same V pattern, work 1 s c, ch 3, 1 s c—all in each V pattern working around entire sacque, join with a slip st in first s c. Fasten off.

Sleeves

Join 21 units for each sleeve as shown on sleeve chart, also join sleeves at underarm A to A, B to B.

Edging at Bottom of Sleeves

With French Zephyr make a loop on hook, * work 1 s c in free corner loop of unit, ch 1, 1 d c in next space, ch 1, 1 d c in next space, ch 1, skip next 2 joined corner loops, 1 d c in next space, ch 1, 1 d c in next space, ch 1, repeat from * around, join with slip st in first s c, slip st into next space. Work beading as on neckline, working in each space, then work last 2 rows of edging as on sacque. Fasten off. Make other sleeve in same way. Insert sleeves and sew to sacque and to shoulder yoke, holding in the fullness at top of sleeves. Draw ribbon through beading at neckline and at bottom of sleeves.



Bonnet No. 2601D

Materials

2 yards Ribbon $\frac{5}{8}$ inch wide.

Units

Following directions of afghan No. 2601, make 22 units.

Joinings

Following bonnet chart join units, tacking firmly, as at places marked X on detail chart.

Crochet Section

With French Zephyr, ch 6, join with a slip st into a ring, ch 5, * 1 d c in ring, ch 2, repeat from * 10 times, join with slip st in third st of beginning chain (12 d c in round, counting beginning chain as 1 d c), slip st in next space.

2nd round—Ch 5, 1 d c in same space, work 1 d c—ch 2—1 d c (a V pattern) in next space, work a V pattern in each of the next 10 spaces, join with a slip st in 3rd st of beginning chain, slip st in next space.

3rd round—Ch 5, 1 d c in same space, work a V pattern in each V pattern of round below, join and end as before.

4th round (Increase round)—Ch 5, 1 d c in same space, * work a V pattern in space before next V pattern (an increase of 1 V pattern), work a V pattern in next V pattern, repeat from * around, join and end as before (24 V patterns). Repeat the 3rd round 3 times.

8th round—1 s c in same space, * ch 2, work 4 tr (a tr—twice over hook) with ch 2 between in next V pattern (a shell), ch 2 and 1 s c in each of the next 2 V patterns, repeat from * around ending with ch 2, join with slip st in first s c (8 shells in round). Fasten off.

Sew crochet section to joined units, inserting a shell into each of the 6 joinings of the 7 units.

Neckline of Bonnet

Make a loop on hook, with right side of work toward you, work 1 d c in free corner loop of end unit at neckline (I on chart), ch 1, 1 d c in next space, continue to work ch 1 and 1 d c in each space along neckline shaping back of cap evenly.

2nd row—Ch 5, turn, 1 d c in first space, * skip next space, a V pattern in next space, repeat from * to end of row.

3rd row—Ch 5, turn, 1 d c in first space, work a V pattern in each V pattern of row below, fasten off. To shape back of bonnet work a row of s c along neckline only, working 1 s c in each V pattern and 1 s c in each space between V patterns. Fasten off.

Ruffle

With right side of cap toward you work 1 d c in top of end st of 3rd row of neckline, ch 1, work 1 d c and

ch 1 in each of the next 6 spaces, * 1 s c in next space (this is in a corner loop), ch 1, work 1 d c and ch 1 in each of the next 6 spaces, repeat from * 6 times, 1 d c in 3rd st of turning chain.

2nd row—Ch 5, turn, skip the first space, 1 d c in next space, * skip next space, 1 V pattern in next space, repeat from * to end of row.

Work even in V pattern for 11 rows.

14th row—Ch 5, turn, work 1 d c in first V pattern, ch 2, 1 d c in same V pattern, work 1 d c—ch 2—1 d c—ch 2—1 d c (2 V patterns) in each V pattern of row below. Fasten off.

15th row—With color work 1 s c in first V pattern, ch 3, 1 s c in same V pattern, work 1 s c—ch 3—1 s c in each V pattern of row below. Fasten off. Turn back ruffle and tack. Sew rosettes with ties to each side of bonnet.

Booties No. 2601E

Materials

1 yard Ribbon $\frac{5}{8}$ inch wide.

Units

Following directions of afghan No. 2601, make 18 units.

Joinings

Following bootie chart, join 9 units (see detail chart for joining) and then sew A to A and B to B for leg.

Foot

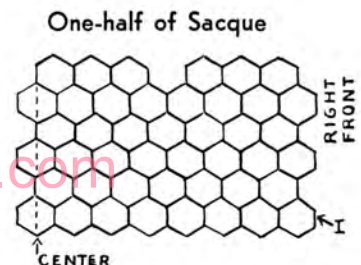
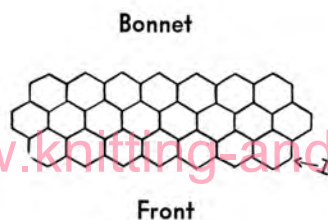
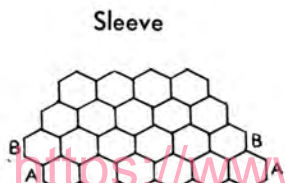
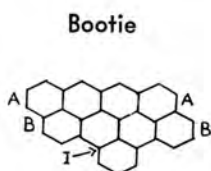
With French Zephyr make a loop on hook, work 1 d c in place on single unit marked I on chart, ch 1, work 1 d c and ch 1 in each of the next 5 spaces, work 1 d c,—ch 2,—1 d c,—(a V pattern) in center corner loop of single unit, ch 1, work 1 d c and ch 1 in each of the next 6 spaces, 1 d c and ch 1 in next space (this is in the corner loop of next unit), * skip next space, 1 d c and ch 1 in next space, repeat from * around, join with a slip st in first d c, slip st in next space.

2nd round—Ch 5, 1 d c in same space, 1 V pattern in each space of round below, join with a slip st in third st of beginning chain, slip st to next space.

3rd round—Work 1 V pattern in each V pattern of round below, join and end as before. Repeat the 3rd round 5 times. Fasten off. Sew bottom of bootie together neatly.

Beading

Work 1 tr (twice over hook) and ch 2 in each space around top units of leg, join with a slip st in top of first tr. Fasten off. With color work 1 s c in any space, ch 3, 1 s c in same space, work 1 s c,—ch 3,—1 s c,—all in each space in round, join with a slip st in first s c. Fasten off. Make other bootie in same way. Draw ribbon through beading and tie in a bow. Darn in all ends neatly.





DAINTY DRESS No. 2607

Size 3-4 years

Materials

Fleisher's French Zephyr, 2 balls Color, 2 balls White.

1 Fleisher's 6-inch White Crochet Hook, Size 1, Article 840.

Adjustable Fleisher Flower Loom.

Flower

Following directions included with the Adjustable Fleisher Flower Loom, set loom in first groove from top of rod. With 4 strands of color wind as follows: down into notch 1, around spoke 1, back into notch 1;

across disc, down into notch 7, around spoke 7, back into notch 7; across disc, down into notch 2, around spokes 2 and 3, back into notch 2; across disc, down into notch 8, around spokes 8 and 9, back into notch 8; across disc, down into notch 3, around spoke 3, back into notch 3; across disc, down into notch 9, around spoke 9, back into notch 9; across disc, down into notch 4, around spokes 4 and 5, back into notch 4; across disc, down into notch 10, around spokes 10 and 11, back into notch 10; across disc, down into notch 5, around spoke 5, back into notch 5; across disc, down into notch 11, around spoke 11, back into notch 11; across disc, down into notch 6, around spokes 6 and 7, back into notch 6; across disc, down into notch 12, around spokes 12 and 1, back into notch 12. Fasten center with single strand of white as for twelve petal daisies. (Ill. E and Page 3). You will have a 12 petal flower with 6 short and 6 long petals, alternating, each petal having 4 strands. Make 234 of these flowers.

Unit

With white make a loop on hook, with right side of a flower toward you, work 1 s c in top of a petal (always insert hook under all 4 strands of each petal), * ch 4, 1 d c in 4th st from hook (a picot point), 1 s c in next petal, repeat from * around ending with a picot point, join with a slip st in first s c (12 picot points). Work this edging around all 234 flowers.

Joinings

Being careful that all units face the same way, and that short petals are opposite each other when joining, follow chart and join 196 units for body of dress; sew by tacking picot points together firmly as at places marked on detail chart. On top row of dress, join units also at points marked E on chart, thus having 3 points joined between these top units.

Sleeves

Join 19 units for each sleeve as shown on sleeve chart having 3 joinings between units on bottom row of sleeve E on sleeve chart; join sleeve to arm-hole by matching letters as shown on detailed arm-hole charts.

Back Yoke

With white make a loop on hook, having right side of units toward you, work 1 s c in free point of first unit, * ch 4, 1 d c in 4th st from hook (a picot), 1 s c under next joining of 2 units, a picot and 1 s c in each of the next 2 points, repeat from * across back to free point of end unit of row (23 picots in row).

2nd row—Turn, * work a picot, 1 s c in next point, repeat from * across ending row with 1 s c in last point. Repeat 2nd row 10 times. Fasten off.

Front Yoke

Holding right side of units toward you, work the first row in same way as the first row of back yoke. 2nd row—Turn, work in pattern over 15 points (to

center of front yoke), turn and work 7 rows even on this half of yoke.

10th row—Turn, work for 9 patterns (do not work over last 6 points), thus shaping the neck, turn and work 5 rows even; fasten off. Join thread at center of first row of front yoke, work other half of yoke to correspond. Sew front and back yokes together at shoulders, tacking in points of last rows. Sew units of top of sleeves to yoke, holding in extra fullness at top.

Collar

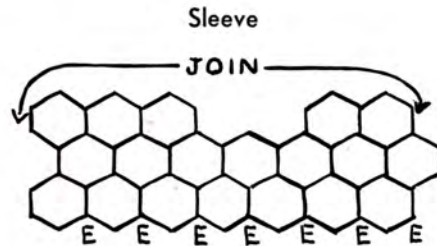
Holding right side of work toward you, work 1 s c in first point at neck opening, work in pattern spacing evenly to other side of neck opening; turn and work even for 3 more rows.

Edging

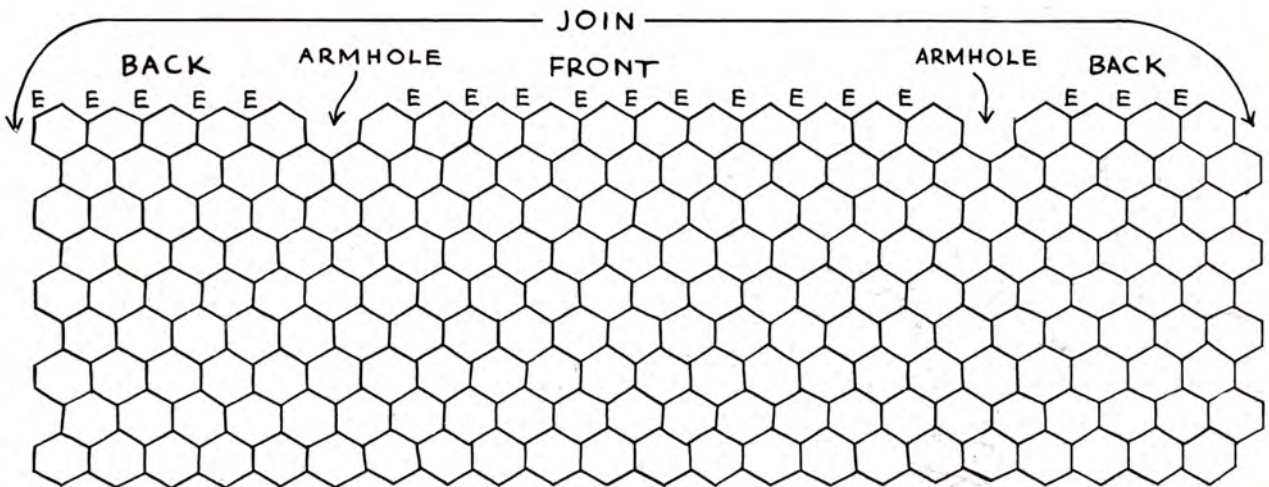
Beginning at bottom of left yoke opening, with color work in pattern on side of neck edge, along top of collar and down other side of neck opening; fasten off, turn back lapels and tack (see ill.).

Cuff

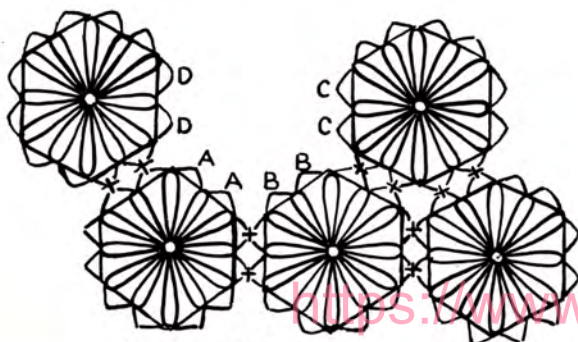
With white, beginning at underarm, work 1 s c in point of first unit, work a picot and 1 s c in next point of same unit, * skip joining of units, a picot and 1 s c in each of the next 2 free points, repeat from * to end of last unit; turn and work even for 5 rows; fasten off. Edge with color working as in row below, fasten off. Sew cuff together at underarm. Work other cuff in same way. Darn in all ends neatly.



CHARTS FOR DAINTY DRESS No. 2607

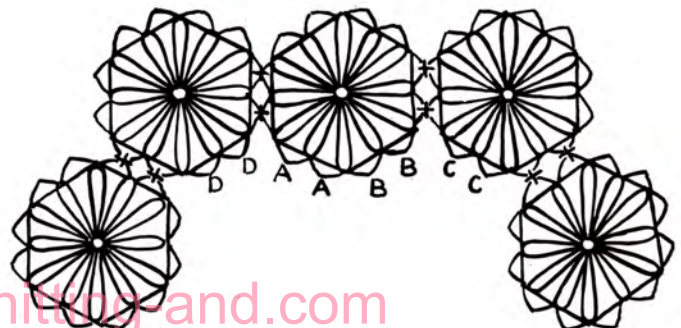


Detail for Dress Armhole

BED-JACKET No. 2605

Materials

Fleisher's Sport Angora, 13 balls White.
 Fleisher's Angel Crepe, 5 balls Color.
 1 Fleisher's Steel Crochet Hook, Size 2, Article 300.
 Adjustable Fleisher Flower Loom.
 6 Buttons $\frac{1}{4}$ inch in diameter.

Flower

Following directions included with Adjustable Fleisher Flower Loom, set loom in first groove from top of rod. With 3 strands of Sport Angora wind as for twelve petal daisies (Ill. C and Page 3) **except** that for every second petal you wind around 2 spokes. **Example:** down into notch 1, around spoke 1, back into notch 1; across disc, down into notch 7, around spoke 7, back into notch 7; across disc, down into notch 2, around spokes 2 and 3, back into notch 2; across disc, down into notch 8, around spokes 8 and

9, back into notch 8; across disc, down into notch 3, around spoke 3, back into notch 3; across disc, down into notch 9, around spoke 9, back into notch 9, etc. Sew center as for twelve petal daisies with 1 strand of Angel Crepe. (Ill. E and Page 3.) You will have a 12 petal flower with 6 short and 6 long petals alternating, each petal having 3 strands. Make 254 of these flowers.

Unit

First round—With Angel Crepe make a loop on hook, with right side of a flower toward you work 1 s c in a petal (always insert hook under all 3 strands of each petal), ch 3, * 1 s c in next petal, ch 3, repeat from * around, join with slip st in first s c, fasten off.

2nd round—With Sport Angora, make a loop on hook, * work a shell of 4 d c with ch 1 between in s c above long petal, work 1 s c in each of the next 2 spaces, repeat from * around, join with a slip

st in first d c of first shell. You will have a 6 shell unit. Fasten off, leaving a short end, for joining. Work this edging around all 254 flowers.

Crochet Medallion

With Angel Crepe ch 4, join with a slip st into a ring, † ch 3, * thread over, draw up a loop in ring, over, through 2 loops, leave remaining loops on hook, repeat from * twice, over and through all 4 loops on hook, ch 3, slip st in third st from hook (a picot), ch 3, slip st into ring, repeat from † 3 times. Fasten off, darn in all ends neatly.

2nd round—With Sport Angora make a loop on hook, * work 1 s c in picot, ch 3, 1 d c into the ring between clusters, ch 3, repeat from * around, join with a slip st in first s c. Fasten off, leaving a short end for joining. Make 202 of these Medallions.

Joinings

Following chart and being careful that all face the same way, join together 186 units with 162 medallions inserted, for body of jacket, sewing by tacking firmly as at places marked X on detail chart and also tack at matching letters as on chart. Following sleeve chart, join 34 units and 20 medallions for each sleeve in same way. Tack sleeves to armholes matching letters very carefully.

Edging of Jacket

With Sport Angora make a loop on hook, thread twice over hook, beginning at top unit of left front with right side of units toward you, insert hook under last ch 1 of top shell of this unit, thread over, draw through 2 loops, thread over, through 2 loops, leave remaining loops on hook (an incomplete tr), work another incomplete tr in the next d c, in each of the next 2 s c,—in next d c and under next ch 1, thread over and through all 7 loops on hook (a **corner cluster**), * ch 5, 1 s c in next d c, 1 s c in next space, 1 s c in next d c, ch 5, work an incomplete tr in next space—in next d c—in each of the next 2 s c—in next d c—in next space—in next d c—in next space (this is one-half of this cluster), work second half in reverse working on next unit, thread over and through all 17 loops on hook (a **complete cluster**), repeat from * 7 times, ch 5, 1 s c in next d c, 1 s c in next space, 1 s c in next d c, ch 5, work a corner cluster, ch 5; now working along bottom of jacket, † work 1 s c in next d c,—in next space,—in next d c,—in next space,—in next d c,—in next 2 s c,—in next d c,—in next space,—in next d c,—in next space,—in next d c (a group of 12 s c), ch 5, work a complete cluster, ch 5, repeat from † to next corner, work this corner same as last corner and right side like left side.

2nd row—Ch 3, turn, 2 d c in top of cluster below, * skip next 2 sts, 3 d c in next st, repeat from * working on right side, bottom and left side of jacket, ending with 3 d c in top of corner cluster of left front.

3rd row—Ch 3, turn, skip first d c, work 1 d c in each d c of row below.

4th row—Ch 3, turn, skip first d c, 1 d c in each of the next 2 d c, ch 2, † * thread over hook, draw up a loop in next d c, over and through 2 loops on hook, leave remaining loops on hook, repeat from * twice, thread over and through all 4 loops on hook, ch 2, repeat from † to within last 3 sts of end of row, work 1 d c in each of these last 3 sts, fasten off.

Sleeve Edgings

Work edgings around bottom of sleeves in same way as on sides of jacket, having complete clusters with 3 s c between, and then sew seams together neatly.

Neckline Edging

With right side of work toward you, beginning at top of last row of edging on right front, work s c's neatly keeping work flat to next joining of units, ch 5, work a complete cluster, 1 s c in next d c, 1 s c in next space, 1 s c in next d c, work a complete cluster, work s c's neatly over next medallion, 3 units and next medallion, work over left front in same way as on right front. Work next three rows same as 2nd, 3rd and 4th rows of Edging of Jacket, repeat last 3 rows once.

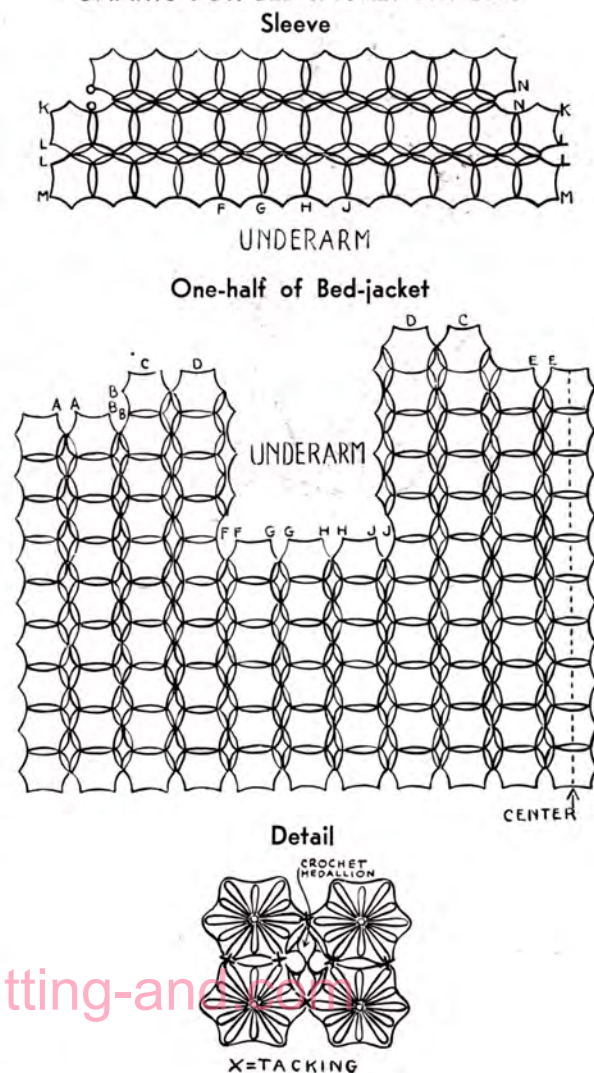
Shoulder Bands

With Sport Angora ch 68, work 1 d c in 4th st from hook, 2 more d c in same st, * skip 2 sts on chain, 3 d c in next st, repeat from * to end of chain. Work next 2 rows same as 3rd and 4th rows of Edging of Jacket. Make second shoulder band in same way.

Finishing

Sew buttons to left front at neckline on last 6 rows of edging. Make 6 buttonloops on right front in places to correspond. Slip shoulder band through sleeve and shoulder, gather together and sew in place. (See illustration.)

Yarns

Fleisher's Cassimere Sport Yarn, 15 balls Main Color, 2 balls Contrasting Color.

Needles

1 Fleisher's 6-inch White Crochet Hook, Size 1, Article 840.

Adjustable Fleisher Flower Loom.

Trimmings

3 yards of wide Ribbon, or 1½ yards fabric of contrasting color cut on bias for sash.

Snap Fasteners.

Measurements

For Finished Garment

Bust 37 inches.

Length from Back of Neck to Lower Edge 54 inches before blocking.

(If shorter coat is desired, omit bottom horizontal row of A units, allowing 1½ inches to a row.)

Flower A

Following directions included with Adjustable Fleisher Flower Loom, set loom in first groove from top of rod. With 2 strands of main color wind as for twelve petal daisies (Ill. C and Page 3). Fasten center with single strand of contrasting color as for twelve petal daisies (Ill. E and Page 3). The contrasting color is used only for fastening centers. You will have a 12 petal flower with 2 strands in each petal. Make 371 flowers A.

Flower B

Set loom in 2nd groove from top of rod, and work exactly as for flower A. Make 138 flowers B.

Flower C

Set loom in 3rd groove from top of rod, with 3 strands of yarn work exactly as for flower A. You will have 3 strands in each petal. Make 275 flowers C.

Unit A

Make a loop on hook, with right side of a flower A toward you, * work 1 s c in petal (always insert hook under all strands of each petal), ch 5, slip st in last s c (a corner picot), ch 3, 1 s c in next petal, ch 3, a slip st in last s c (a side picot), ch 3, 1 s c in next petal, work a side picot, ch 3, repeat from * around, join with a slip st in first s c. You will have a square unit with 1 large picot at each of the 4 corners and 2 small picots on each side. Each Unit A should measure 1½ inches. Work this edging around all 371 flowers A.

Unit B

Work as for unit A except having ch 7 instead of ch 5 for corner picots. Each Unit B should measure 2 inches. Work this edging around all 138 flowers B.

Unit C

Work as for other units having ch 7 for corner picots and ch 4 instead of ch 3 between petals. Each Unit C should measure 2½ inches. Work this edging around all 275 flowers C.

Joining

Following chart, being careful that all units face the same way, sew by tacking firmly through picots as in

Figure 8 on Page 6 of Instruction Sheet. When repeating chart for left half of coat, omit last row of repeat marked P, as only right side has this overlap. The panel openings will each be 11 units long. Also tack picots as at matching letters for shoulder joinings. Following sleeve chart join 23 A, 19 B and 25 C units, for each sleeve. Tack matching letters together to join sleeve at underarm and to shape top of sleeve. Each of the 6 units A at bottom of sleeve is joined to about 2 units of row above, each picot being sewn to 2 picots.

Important

Check your gauge first. See page 31 for details.

Gauge: 6 d c = 1 inch, 6 rows = 2¼ inches.

Crochet Panels

First row—Ch 30, 1 d c in 6th st from hook, 1 d c in each of the next 5 sts, * ch 2, skip next 2 sts on chain, 1 d c in each of the next 6 sts, repeat from * once, ch 2, skip next 2 sts, 1 d c in last st of chain.

2nd row—Ch 5, turn, skip the first d c, * 1 d c in front thread of each of the next 6 d c, ch 2, repeat from * twice, 1 d c in 3rd st of turning chain.

3rd row—Same as last row except working into the back thread of sts instead of into the front. Work until 12 rows are completed, being careful to work in front half of stitches on one row, and in back half of stitches on the next row always alternating, so as to form a ridge on right side of work. This is done on all crochet work and will not be mentioned again.

13th row (First decreasing row)—Ch 5, turn, skip the first d c, * work 1 d c in each of the next 2 d c, thread over hook, draw up a loop in next d c, thread over and through 2 loops, leave remaining loops on hook, thread over, draw up a loop in next d c, thread over and through 2 loops, thread over and through all remaining 3 loops on hook (a decreasing d c), 1 d c in each of the next 2 d c, ch 2, repeat from * twice, 1 d c in 3rd st of turning chain.

14th row—Work even having 5 d c in each group until 24 rows are completed from beginning.

25th row—Work a decreasing row working 1 decreasing d c in each group of d c. Work even for 11 rows, having 4 d c in each group.

37th row—Work a decreasing row as before. Work even for 11 rows having 3 d c in each group.

49th row—Work a decreasing row as before. Work even for 11 rows having 2 d c in each group.

Point of Panel

61st row—Ch 3, turn, skip first d c, 1 d c in each of the next 2 d c, ch 2, 1 d c in each of the next 2 d c, ch 2, 1 d c in each of the next 2 d c, 1 d c in 3rd st of turning chain.

62nd row—Ch 3, turn, skip first 2 d c, 1 d c in next d c, ch 2, 1 d c in each of the next 2 d c, ch 2, 1 d c in each of the next 2 d c.

63rd row—Ch 3, turn, skip first d c, 1 d c in next d c, ch 2, 1 d c in each of the next 2 d c, ch 2, 1 d c in next d c, 1 d c in top st of turning chain.

64th row—Same as 63rd row.

65th row—Ch 5, turn, skip the first 2 d c, 1 d c in each of the next 2 d c, ch 2, 1 d c in next d c.

66th row—Ch 5, turn, skip the first d c, 1 d c in each of the next 2 d c, ch 2, 1 d c in 3rd st of turning chain.

67th row—Ch 3, turn, skip the first d c, 1 d c in each of the next 2 d c, 1 d c in 3rd st of turning chain.

68th row—Ch 3, turn, skip the first 2 d c, 1 d c in next d c. Fasten off. Make 4 more panels.

Left Lapel

First row—Ch 46, work same as first row of panel having 5 groups of 6 d c. Work even until 13 rows are completed.

14th row—Work over 3 groups of 6 d c, ch 2, 1 d c in next d c. Turn and work on these 3 groups for 4 more rows.

19th row—Work over 2 groups of 6 d c, ch 2, 1 d c in next d c. Turn and work on these 2 groups for 4 more rows.

24th row—Underlap—Ch 5, turn, skip first d c, work 1 d c in back half of each of the next 6 d c (this is done so that underlap will have the ridges on other side), ch 2, 1 d c in back half of next d c.

25th row—Turn and work over row below working in front half of stitches. Continue to work over this one group as before, alternating, for 20 more rows. Fasten off.

Right Lapel

Work first and second rows as for first 2 rows of left lapel, except being very careful to work the second row in back half of stitches so that this lapel will be opposite to the left lapel. Continue to work, alternating, until 23 rows are completed. Fasten off. (No underlap).

Collar

Chain 62, work as for panel for 6 rows, having 7 groups in each row. Fasten off.

Cuffs

First round—Make a loop on hook, * work 1 s c under the joining of 2 picots at bottom of sleeve, ch 4, 1 s c under next free picot, ch 4, 1 s c under next free picot, ch 4, repeat from * around all 6 units ending with ch 2 instead of ch 4, join with a slip st in first s c (88 sts).

2nd round—Ch 3, 1 d c in each of the next 5 sts, * ch 2, skip the next 2 sts, 1 d c in each of the next 6 sts, repeat from * 9 times, ch 2, skip the last 2 sts, join with a slip st in top of beginning chain.

3rd round—Ch 3, 1 d c in back half of each of the next 5 d c, * ch 2, 1 d c in back half of each of the next 6 d c, repeat from * 9 times, ch 2, join as before.

Picot Edging

* 1 s c in next st, ch 3, slip st in s c (a picot), ch 2, skip next 2 sts, repeat from * around, join with a slip st in first s c.

Work other cuff in same way.

Finishing

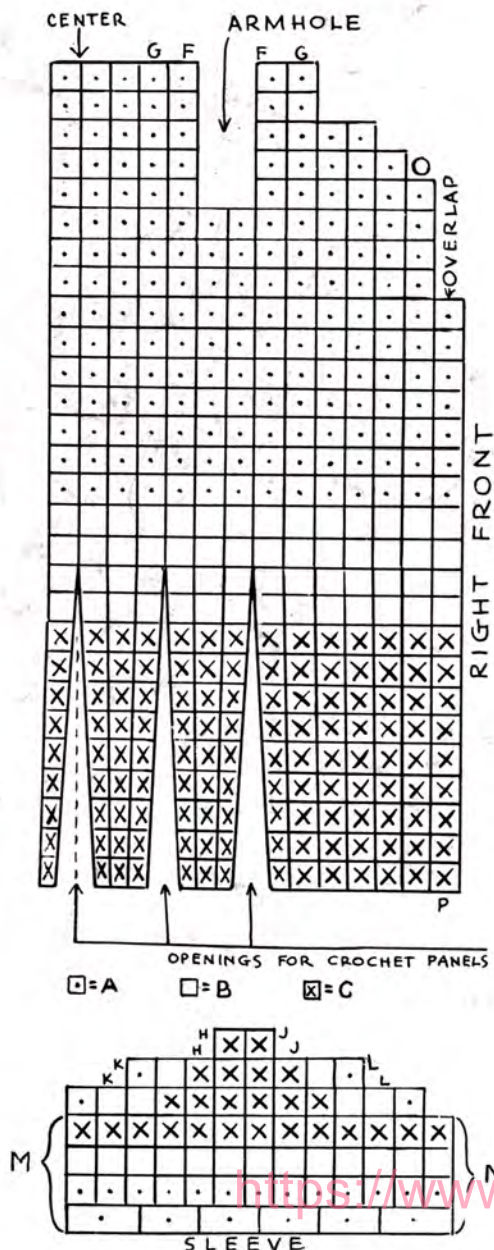
Having ridges on same side as right side of units, insert a panel in each panel opening, (see chart). Pin and sew by tacking firmly to picots of units on either side of opening, being careful that work is spaced evenly and that top tip of panel is joined to 4 joined picots. Pin sleeves to armholes with underarm sleeve seams at center underarm and sew by tacking picots together. Pin and then tack wrong side of right lapel to right side of right front having both groups of last row of lapel sewn to top of unit marked O on chart. Pin and then tack wrong side of left lapel to right side of left front sewing underlap to sides of 5 units of front. Sew right side of Collar to wrong side of 4 units at top of back. With right side of left lapel toward you and beginning at first row above underlap (24th row), work picot edging as on cuff around 2 sides of left lapel, around 3 sides of collar and around 2 sides of right lapel, keeping work flat and even. Also work this picot edging on bottom of each of the 5 crochet



panels. Make a loop on hook, with right side of work toward you, work a slip st in free picot of bottom unit of right front, working up front, ch 4, a slip st in next picot, ch 4, a slip st in next picot, ch 4, a slip st under joining of next 2 picots, continue in this way over next 8 units C; continue in same way **except** working ch 3 instead of ch 4 over next 4 units B, and ch 2 over the next 11 units A. Fasten off. Beginning at unit just below underlap, work edging down left front to correspond. Darn in all ends neatly. Steam as for one piece dress, see directions page 31. Fit garment to figure and sew snap fasteners where necessary, down front opening overlapping the right side of housecoat.

Adjustable Fleisher Flower Loom.

Flower A

Following directions included with the Adjustable Fleisher Flower Loom, set loom in 2nd groove from top of rod. With 5 strands of color wind as for twelve petal daisies (Ill. C and Page 3), **except** that you always wind around 2 spokes of lower disc instead of around 1. **Example:** Down into notch 1, around spokes 1 and 2, back into notch 1; across disc, down into notch 7, around spokes 7 and 8, back into notch 7; across disc, down into notch 2, around spokes 2 and 3, back into notch 2, etc., etc. Fasten center with single strand of white as for 12 petal daisies (Ill. E and Page 3). You will have a 12 petal flower with 5 strands in each petal. Make 112 flowers A.

Flower B

Wind in same way as for flower A, first winding with 3 strands of white, and then before sewing, winding again with 2 strands of color. Fasten center with single strand of color. You will have a 12 petal flower with 5 strands, 3 white and 2 color in each petal. Make 143 flowers B.

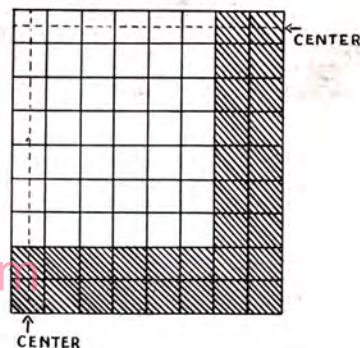
Unit A

With color make a loop on hook, with right side of a flower A toward you, work a slip st in a petal (insert hook under all 5 strands of each petal of all flowers A), * ch 5, a slip st in last slip st (a picot), ch 3, a slip st in next petal, ch 3, a slip st in next petal, ch 3, a slip st in next petal, repeat from * around ending with ch 3, join with a slip st in first slip st. Fasten off, leaving about 6 inches of yarn for joining of units. You will have a 12 petal unit with 4 corner picots. Work this edging around all 112 flowers A, shaded on chart. All units should measure about 1 7/8 inches across.

Unit B

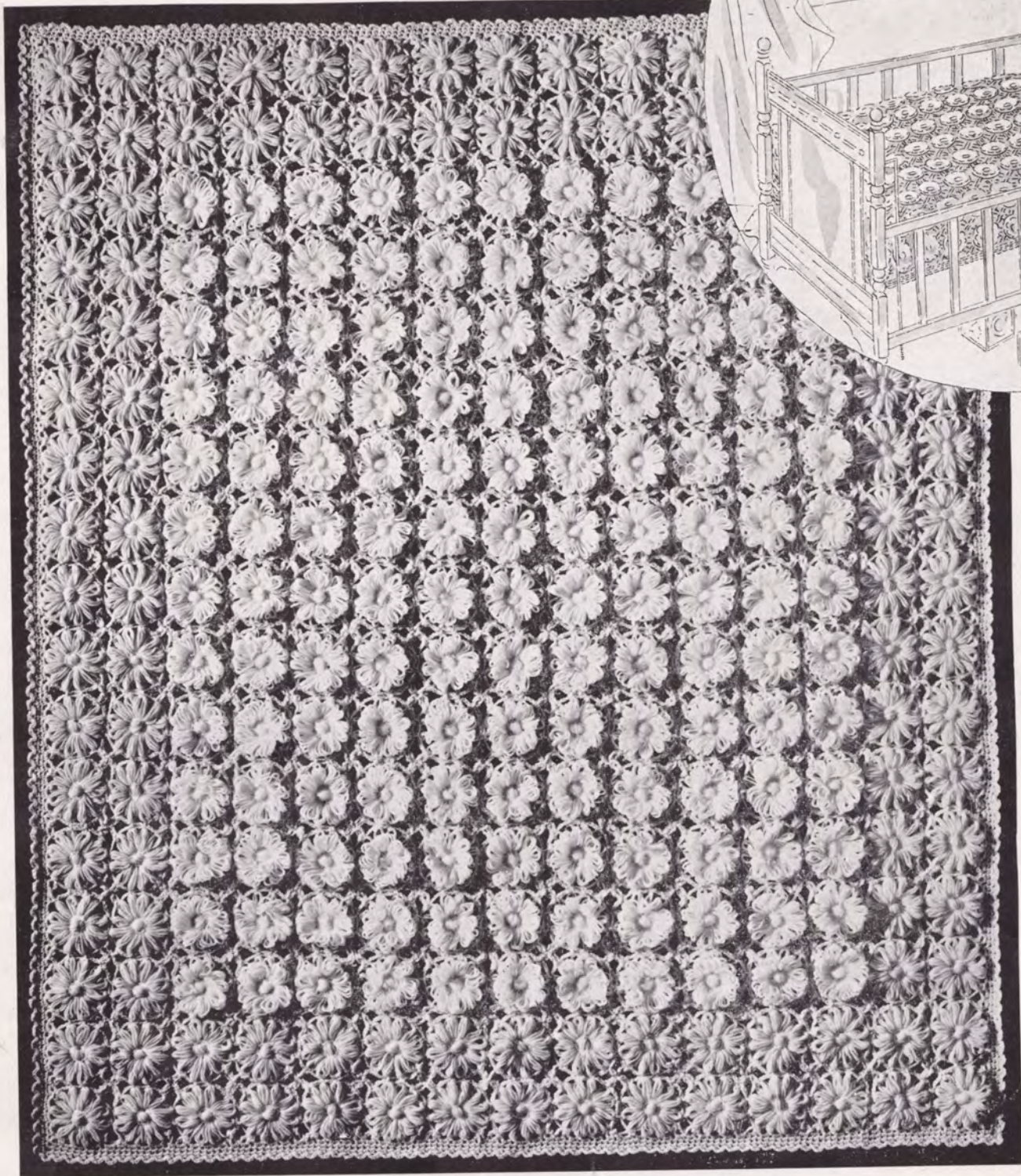
Work same edging on all 143 flowers B, **except** being careful to insert hook only under the 2 color strands of each petal, leaving the 3 white strands of each petal free and loose, unshaded on chart.

Joinings

Arrange units as shown on chart, being careful that all face the same way. Sew by tacking firmly together at corner picots and at side petals as at places marked X on detail chart, page 19.



Border

First round—With color make a loop on hook, holding right side of Afghan toward you, work 3 s c in the free picot of a corner unit, working around afghan, work 2 s c under each ch 3 and 2 s c in each picot, being careful to have 3 s c in free picot of each corner unit, join with a slip st in first s c.

2nd round—Work 3 s c in next (corner) s c, work 1 s c in each s c, being careful to have 3 s c in center s c of each corner, join with a slip st in first s c. Repeat the 2nd round once.

4th round—* Ch 3, slip st in each of the next 2 s c, repeat from * around, join with a slip st in first slip st. Fasten off. Darn in all ends neatly.

Materials

Fleisher's French Zephyr, 1 ball.
1 Fleisher's Steel Crochet Hook, Size 6, Article 300.
Adjustable Fleisher Flower Loom.

Flower

Following directions included with Adjustable Fleisher Flower Loom, set loom in first groove from top of rod. With 4 strands of yarn, wind an 8 petal flower winding as for twelve petal daisies (Ill. C and Page 3) except that you skip winding notches and spokes 3 and 9, and 6 and 12, thus getting 8 petals instead of 12. Fasten center with 2 strands of yarn as for four petal dogwood flowers (Page 4) working for 9 sts. You will have an 8 petal flower with 4 strands in each petal. Make 60 of these flowers.

Unit

Make a loop on hook, with right side of a flower toward you, work 1 s c in a petal (always insert hook under all 4 strands of each petal), * ch 7, 1 s c in same petal (a corner loop), ch 3, 1 s c in next petal, ch 3, 1 s c in next petal, repeat from * around flower, ending with ch 3; join with a slip st in first s c. Fasten off. You will have an 8 petal square with 4 corner loops. Work this edging around all 60 flowers.

Joinings

Sew 2 units on one side by tacking together firmly in center of corner loops, in s c of side petals, and in center of other corner loops. Being careful that all units face the same way continue to join units until you have a strip of 22 units. Make another 22 unit strip. Place these 2 strips side by side and tack unit to unit in same way as before. You will now have a strip 2 units wide and 22 units long. Add 2 more units above end units (4 units wide at this point), * skip next square of 4 units, add 2 more units above next unit (4 units wide), repeat from * six times.

Crochet Section

First row—Ch 11, work 1 tr (yarn twice over hook) in 5th st from hook, 1 tr in each of the next 2 sts, ch 2, 1 tr in each of the next 4 sts (8 tr in row including the turning chain 4 which always counts as 1 tr).

2nd row—Ch 4, turn, skip first tr, 1 tr in each of next 3 tr, 1 tr under next chain, ch 2, 1 more tr under same chain (an increase of 2 tr), 1 tr in each of the next 3 tr, 1 tr in top st of turning chain.

3rd row—Ch 4, turn, skip first tr, 1 tr in each of the next 4 tr, work an increase, 1 tr in each of next 4 tr, 1 tr in top st of turning chain (12 tr in row). Work 3 more rows working increases in same way in each row.

7th row—Ch 4, turn, skip first tr, 1 tr in each of the next 8 tr, 1 tr under next chain, 1 tr in each of the next 8 tr, 1 tr in top st of turning chain (19 tr).

8th row—Ch 4, turn, skip first tr, 1 tr in each of the next 17 tr, 1 tr in top st of turning chain. Fasten off. This completes one crochet section. Make 6 more crochet sections in same way. Insert a crochet section into space left above each square of 4 units. Tack to units firmly and evenly on three sides.

Neckline Edging

Make a loop on hook, with right side toward you, work 3 s c in corner loop of first unit, 3 s c under next ch 3, 3 s c under next ch 3, 3 s c in next corner loop, 1 s c in each of the next 8 sts, continue in this way to end of neckline. Fasten off. Darn in all ends neatly.

Materials

Fleisher's Sport Angora, 2 balls.
1 Fleisher's Steel Crochet Hook, Size 2, Article 300.
Adjustable Fleisher Flower Loom.

Cosmos

Following directions included with Adjustable Fleisher Flower Loom, set loom in first groove from top of rod. With 4 strands of yarn, wind as for six petal cosmos (Page 6). With double strand of yarn fasten center as for dogwood flowers (Page 4), working for 7 stitches. You will have a 6 petal cosmos with 4 strands in each petal. Make 51 of these cosmos.

Unit

Make a loop on hook, with right side of a cosmos toward you, work 1 s c in a petal (always insert hook under all 4 strands of each petal), * ch 8, 1 slip st in 4th st from hook, ch 4 (a picot loop), 1 s c in next petal, repeat from * around, join with a slip st in first s c (6 picot loops that are between petals). Work this edging around all 51 cosmos.

Joinings

Following chart being careful that all units face the same way, sew units together by tacking picots firmly as at places marked X on chart.

Shaping of Neckline

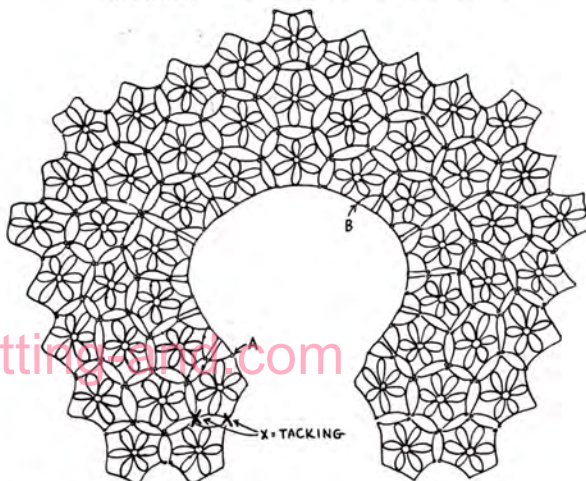
First row—Holding right side of collar toward you beginning at neckline marked A on chart, work 1 s c in first picot of first unit, * ch 3, 1 tr (twice over hook) in each of the next 2 joined picots, ch 3, 1 s c in next picot, repeat from * 4 times. Fasten off. Make a loop on hook, skip the next 3 units, work 1 s c in picot marked B on chart, continue to work as before to end of neckline.

2nd row—Turn, work 3 s c in each space across neckline and 1 s c between trebles.

Edging

Turn, * ch 4, 1 slip st in 4th st from hook, skip 1 st, 1 s c in next st (a picot), repeat from * to end of neckline. Continue to work same picots along sides and lower edge of collar working 4 picots under each picot loop of units (2 on each side of picot) and 2 picots under each half picot loop of units; join with a slip st in first st of neckline. Fasten off. Darn in all ends neatly.

Fleisher's French Zephyr, 1 ball A, 1 ball B, 2 balls C, 3 balls D (7 balls in all).

Needles

1 pair Fleisher's Steel 14-inch Knitting Needles, Size 1, Article 499.

1 Fleisher's Steel Crochet Hook, Size 4, Article 300.
Adjustable Fleisher Flower Loom.

Measurements

For Finished Garment

Bust 34 inches.

Width across back at underarm 16 inches.

Width across back at shoulders 11½ inches.

Length from waistline to underarm 8½ inches.

Length from waistline to back of neck 14½ inches.

Sleeve length, including cuff, from lower edge to armhole 7 inches.

Flower A

Following directions included with Adjustable Fleisher Flower Loom, set loom in first groove from top of rod, with 2 strands of C wind as for twelve petal daisies (Ill. C and Page 3), cut C, then, before

sewing, wind again with 2 strands of A winding over C. With 2 strands of D fasten center as for twelve petal daisies (Ill. E and Page 3.) You will have a 12 petal flower with 2 strands of C and 2 strands of A in each petal. Make 158 of these flowers A on chart.

Flower B

Winding first with C and then with B make 164 flowers in same way as flowers A (B on chart).

Unit

All flowers are edged with D. Make a loop on hook, with right side of a flower toward you, work 1 s c in a petal (always insert hook under all 4 strands of each petal), * ch 5, 1 s c in same petal, ch 3, 1 s c in next petal, ch 3, 1 s c in next petal, ch 3, 1 s c in next petal, repeat from * around, ending with ch 3, join with a slip st in first s c. You will have a square unit with 4 corner loops. Each unit should measure about 1½ inches across. Work this edging around all flowers (322 units).

Joinings

Following chart, being careful that all units face the same way, join 42 A and 42 B units for back, and 50 A and 50 B units for front, tacking firmly with D as at places marked X on detail chart.

Sleeves

Following sleeve chart, join 33 A and 36 B units for each sleeve in same way.

Important

Check your gauge first. See page 31 for details.

Gauge: 12 rows=1 inch

All Knitting is done with D.

Front Yoke

Cast on 108 sts. Work in ribbing of k 2, p 2, for 4 inches. Bind off loosely, binding off knit sts as if to knit, and purled stitches as if to purl.

Back Yoke

Cast on 96 sts, work in ribbing as on front yoke for 3½ inches, bind off in same way.

Front Waistband

Cast on 120 sts, work in ribbing as for yoke for 4½ inches, bind off.

Back Waistband

Cast on 112 sts and work in ribbing for same number of rows as front waistband; bind off.

Cuff

Cast on 96 sts, work in ribbing as on yoke for 2½ inches. Bind off. Work other cuff in same way.

Finishing

Pin and sew back band to 11 joined units at bottom of back and back yoke to 9 joined units at top of back, spacing evenly. Sew front band and front yoke to joined units of front in same way. Join front and back at underarms, tacking units and sewing waistband seams. Sew shoulder seam on top of yokes on each side for 1 inch only. Sew cuffs to sleeves and sew sleeves together tacking units and sewing cuffs. Sew sleeves to armholes with sleeve seams at center underarm holding in extra fullness at top. Finish with 1 row of s c around neck of blouse; fasten off and darn in all ends neatly.

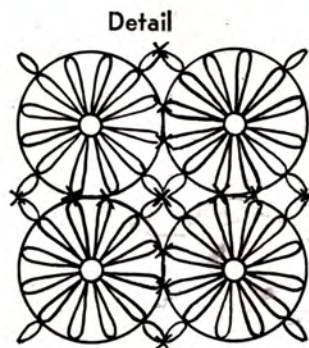

DRESSING SACQUE No. 2609

CHARTS FOR DRESSING SACQUE No. 2609

Materials

- Fleisher's Silverflake, 6 balls.
- Fleisher's Steel Crochet Hook, Size 8, Article 300.
- Adjustable Fleisher Flower Loom.
- 2 yards matching Ribbon 2 inches wide.
- 4 Small Buttons

Flower

Following directions included with the Adjustable Fleisher Flower Loom, set loom in first groove from top of rod. With 2 strands of yarn wind as for twelve petal daisies (Ill. C and Page 3). With single strand of yarn fasten center as for twelve petal daisies. (Ill. E and Page 3.) You will have a 12 petal flower with 2 strands in each petal. Make 492 of these flowers.

Unit

Make a loop on hook, holding right side of flower toward you, work a slip stitch into a petal (always insert hook under both strands of each petal), * ch 4, slip st into next petal, repeat from * around, end with ch 4 and join with a slip st in first slip st. You will have a loop of ch 4 between the petals. Work this edging around all 492 flowers.

Joinings

Following charts, being careful that all face the same way, sew units by tacking firmly with single strand of yarn as at places marked X on detail chart. Also tack matching letters A to G for underarm seam on one side and tack the other side to correspond. Beginning with H tack matching letters from H to L for raglan sleeve, and work additional tackings at letter M at each underarm to shape sleeve. Work other sleeve in same way.

Edging

Working on bottom of sacque, with right side of work toward you, make a loop on hook, * work 1 s c under 2nd loop after a joining of 2 units, work ch 3 and 1 s c under each of the next 3 loops of same unit, ch 3, repeat from * around, join with a slip st in first s c, slip st in first space.

2nd round—Ch 3, 2 d c in same space, work 3 d c in each space of round, join with a slip st in top st of beginning chain 3. Fasten off.

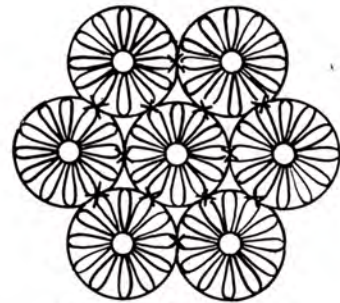
Edging Around Sleeves

Work the first 2 rounds in same way as around bottom of sacque. Do not fasten off.

3rd round—Ch 3, 1 d c in each of the next 2 d c, * ch 1, 1 d c in each of the next 3 d c, repeat from * around, end with ch 1, join as before, slip st over the next 2 sts.

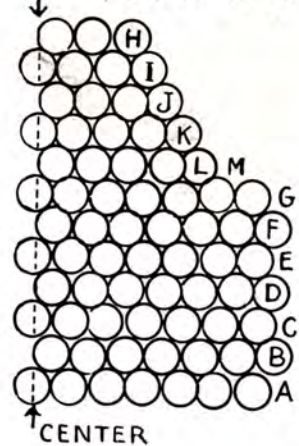
Final round—1 s c under the chain 1, * ch 4, slip st in fourth st from hook (a picot), 1 s c under next chain 1, repeat from * around, end with a picot and join with a slip st in first s c. Fasten off. Work same edging around other sleeve. With wrong side of work toward you, also work this same edging across the 6 units of front neckline beginning in first free loop of first unit and turning at end of each row instead of joining. Fasten off. Work same edging around 10 units of neckline, also beginning in first free loop (the 3rd and 8th units will have only 2 loops instead of 4). Sew buttons in places as shown in illustration. Slip ribbon ties under units at underarm (see ill.) and tie in bows.

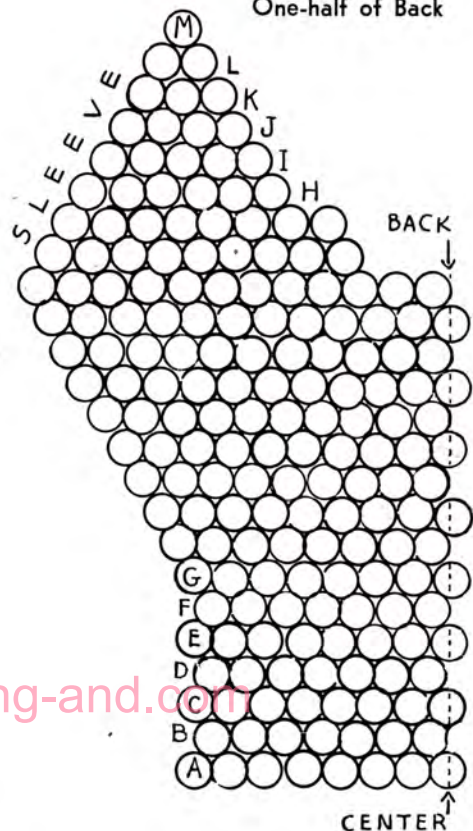


X = TACKING

TRIANGLE BLOUSE No. 2611

Size 36

Materials required to complete

Yarns

Fleisher's 3-fold Saxony, 6 balls White.

Needles

1 pair Fleisher's 14-inch White Knitting Needles, Size 3, Article 846.

1 Fleisher's Steel Crochet Hook, Size 7, Article 300.
Adjustable Fleisher Flower Loom.

Measurements

For Finished Garment

Bust 36 inches.

Width across back at underarm, 16½ inches.

Width across back at shoulders, 13½ inches.

Length from lower edge to armhole, 10½ inches.

Length from lower edge to back of neck, 16½ inches.

Length of sleeves at underarm, 6½ inches.

Triangle

Following instructions included with Adjustable Fleisher Flower Loom, set loom in first groove from top of rod. With 2 strands of yarn wind as for twelve petal triangles, (Page 5, Figure 5). Fasten center with 1 strand of yarn as for twelve petal daisies, (Ill. E and Page 3). You will have 2 strands in each petal. Make 76 of these triangles.

Unit

First round—Make a loop on hook, with right side of triangle toward you, * work a slip st in corner petal (always insert hook under both strands of each petal), ch 5, slip st in next petal, ch 3, slip st in next petal, ch 3, slip st in next petal, ch 5, repeat from * around, join with a slip st in first slip st.

2nd round—Slip st in corner petal, * ch 9, slip st in same petal (a corner loop), work ch 5 and a slip st under each of the next 4 loops, ch 5, slip st in corner petal, repeat from * around, join with a slip st in first slip st. You will have a corner loop at each of the three corner petals, and 5 smaller loops on each side. Fasten off, leaving end for sewing units together. Work this edging around all 76 triangles.

Joining

Following charts, being careful that all units face the same way, make 2 strips of 24 units (12 units long and 2 units wide) each, for front of blouse and 2 strips of 14 units (7 units long and 2 units wide), one for each sleeve, tacking units together firmly through loops as at places marked X on detail chart.

Important

Check your gauge first. See page 31 for details.

Gauge: 7 sts=1 inch, 10 rows=1 inch.

Pattern is a multiple of 23 plus 3.

Back

Cast on 104 sts for lower edge. Work in ribbing of k 2, p 2, for 3½ inches. Increase in first st, * p 7, increase in next st, repeat from * to end of row, increase in last st (118 sts). Begin pattern.

First row—* P 1, k 1, p 1, k 20, repeat from * ending p 1, k 1, p 1.

2nd and all even numbered rows—P 1, k 1, * p 22, k 1, repeat from * ending p 1. Repeat these 2 rows once.

5th row—* P 1, k 1, p 1, k 9, yarn over, slip 1 st as if to knit, k 1, pass the slipped stitch over the knit st (slip, knit, pass), k 9, repeat from * ending p 1, k 1, p 1.

7th row—* P 1, k 1, p 1, k 8, yarn over, slip, knit, pass, yarn over, slip, knit, pass, k 8, repeat from * ending p 1, k 1, p 1.

9th row—* P 1, k 1, p 1, k 7, yarn over, slip, knit, pass, k 2, yarn over, slip, knit, pass, k 7, repeat from * ending p 1, k 1, p 1.

11th row—* P 1, k 1, p 1, k 6, yarn over, slip, knit, pass, k 4, yarn over, slip, knit, pass, k 6, repeat from * ending p 1, k 1, p 1.

13th row—* P 1, k 1, p 1, k 5, yarn over, slip, knit, pass, k 6, yarn over, slip, knit, pass, k 5, repeat from * ending p 1, k 1, p 1.

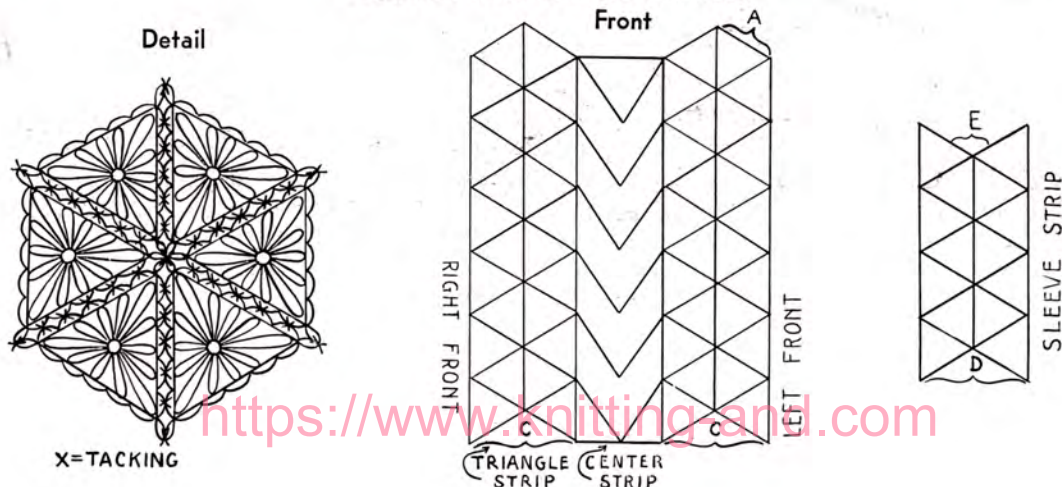
15th row—* P 1, k 1, p 1, k 4, yarn over, slip, knit, pass, k 8, yarn over, slip, knit, pass, k 4, repeat from * ending p 1, k 1, p 1.

17th row—* P 1, k 1, p 1, k 3, yarn over, slip, knit, pass, k 10, yarn over, slip, knit, pass, k 3, repeat from * ending p 1, k 1, p 1.

19th row—* P 1, k 1, p 1, k 2, yarn over, slip, knit, pass, k 12, yarn over, slip, knit, pass, k 2, repeat from * ending p 1, k 1, p 1.

21st row—* P 1, k 1, p 1, k 1, yarn over, slip, knit,

pass, k 14, yarn over, slip, knit, pass, k 1, repeat from * ending p 1, k 1, p 1.

23rd row—* P 1, k 1, p 1, yarn over, slip, knit, pass, k 16, yarn over, slip, knit, pass, repeat from * ending p 1, k 1, p 1.

24th row—Same as 2nd row. These 24 rows complete the pattern. Work 2 more complete patterns. Work first 4 rows of 4th pattern.

Armholes

Bind off 6 sts at beginning of next row, k 5, yarn over, slip, knit, pass, continue in pattern to end of row. Bind off 6 sts at beginning of next row, purl across. Being careful to keep pattern, decrease 1 st at each side every 2nd row 4 times (98 sts). Work even on these 98 sts ending with last row of 6th pattern, 144 rows in all (6½ inches from bind off).

Shoulders

Bind off 7 sts at beginning of next row, knit in pattern until you have 22 sts on right-hand needle, slip these stitches to thread or stitch holder, bind off 40 sts for back of neck. Continue in pattern to end of row. Bind off 7 sts at the beginning of each of the next 2 rows and 5 sts at the beginning of each of the next 3 rows at armhole edge for left shoulder. Join yarn at neck edge and work right shoulder to correspond (29 sts for each shoulder).

Front

Center Strip—Cast on 26 sts. Work even in pattern as for back until you have 6 complete patterns. Bind off.

Right Front

Cast on 26 sts. Work even in pattern for 3 complete patterns and first 3 rows of 4th pattern.

Armhole

4th row—Purl Row—Bind off 8 sts at beginning of row.

5th row—P 1, k 1, p 1, k 9, yarn over, slip, knit, pass, k 2, k 2 together. Being careful to keep pattern, continue to decrease 1 st at armhole edge every knit row 3 more times. Continue in pattern on these 14 sts until work measures 6½ inches from bind off, ending with last row of 6th pattern (5th row of each new pattern will begin, p 1, k 1, p 1, k 9, yarn over). Bind off 7 sts at the beginning of the next 2 knit rows for shoulder.

Left Front

Work as for Right Front for 3 complete patterns and 4 rows of 4th pattern.

Armhole

5th row—Bind off 8 sts at beginning of row, k 3, yarn over, slip, knit, pass, k 9, p 1, k 1, p 1. Work 6th row in pattern.

K 2 together at beginning of every knit row 4 times. Continue to work to correspond to right front, binding off shoulder at armhole edge (5th row of every new pattern will begin yarn over, slip, knit, pass).

Sleeve

Right Half—Cast on 26 sts. Work in pattern for 2 complete patterns and first 4 rows of 3rd pattern.

5th row—Bind off 3 sts at beginning of row, k 8, yarn over, continue in pattern. Work 6th row in pattern.

7th row—Decrease 1 st at beginning of row. Being careful to keep pattern, decrease 1 st at beginning

of every 4th row until there are 12 sts left, then decrease at beginning of every 2nd row until there are 6 sts left. Bind off.

Left Half—Work as for right half ending with 3rd row of 3rd pattern.

4th row—Bind off 3 sts at beginning of row, p 20, k 1, p 1.

5th row—Work in pattern decreasing 1 st at end of row. Work as for right half, except decreasing at end of rows. Work one more right half and one more left half in same way for other sleeve.

Finishing

Pin and then tack a triangle strip on each side of center strip, allowing 1 knit pattern for each triangle (see chart). In same way tack right front to right triangle strip, and left front to left triangle strip.

Front Waistband—Working from right side pick up 100 sts at lower edge of front, picking up 2 sts as if to knit and 2 sts as if to purl, and allowing 11 sts picked up through the loops at bottom of each strip, C on chart. Work in ribbing of k 2, p 2, for same number of rows as ribbing on back. Bind off knit sts as if to knit, purl sts as if to purl. Tack triangle sleeve strip between right and left half of sleeve, allowing the triangles to entire length of knitted sections. Pick up 72 sts at bottom of sleeve in same way as for front of blouse allowing 20 sts picked up through loops at bottom of sleeve strip, D on chart. Work in ribbing for 1½ inches. Bind off. Work other sleeve in same way.

Sew underarm seams. Sew shoulder seams using top of one unit, A on chart, as front part of shoulder. Sew sleeve seams. Pin and sew sleeves to armholes with sleeve seams at underarm, using corner loop and 3 loops only of each of the two top units for joining at top of sleeve. This will leave 4 loops and 2 joined corner loops at center of double strip free for shape of top of sleeve, E on chart. Finish neck edge of center strip by working 1 s c at joining of unit to strip, * ch 4, skip 2 sts, 1 s c in next st, repeat from * across. Work same edging around neckline of back of blouse.

Edging of Carriage Cover

With white work s c's around all four sides keeping work flat and even. Fasten off.

2nd round—With color work an s c in each s c of round below taking up back half of sts only. Fasten off. Darn in all ends neatly.

Pillow No. 2602B

Approximate Size: 13 inches by 17 inches

Materials

Fleisher's Cheviot Zephyr, 1 ball White, 1 ball Color.

Make 28 units following directions of carriage cover. Following pillow chart, sew units together as for carriage cover.

Crochet Borders

Work 2 straight strips in same way as for carriage cover, having 54 even rows of 5 clusters each. Work irregular strips in same way as in carriage cover, having two wide sections in each of the two strips. Sew borders to joined units. Work same edging around pillow as around carriage cover.

Baby Sweater No. 2602C

Size 1-2 years

Materials

- Fleisher's Cheviot Zephyr, 2 balls White, 1 ball Color.
- 1 Fleisher's 6-inch White Crochet Hook, Size 2, Article 840.
- 4 Buttons $\frac{1}{4}$ inch in diameter.

Make 20 units following directions of carriage cover.

Back

Gauge: 7 clusters = $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches 6 rows = 2 inches

Using white crochet hook and white yarn, chain 60. Work as on chain of 12th row of Irregular Strip of carriage cover, having 28 clusters in row. Work even until 17 rows are completed.

18th row—Not breaking yarn at end of last row, ch 16 for 1 sleeve, turn, work in pattern on this chain (6 additional clusters) and across back. Drop this yarn (do not fasten off) and with another end of yarn make a loop on hook, join in first stitch of row below and ch 12 for other sleeve, fasten off. Pick up dropped yarn and continue to work in pattern to end of chain (12 additional clusters in this row). Repeat the 18th row twice (64 clusters in last repeat row).

21st row—Work even in pattern over these 64 clusters for back and sleeves. Repeat 21st row five times (26 rows from beginning). Fasten off.

Right Front

Chain 34, work as for back of sweater for 17 rows, having 15 clusters in each row.

18th row—Not breaking yarn, chain 16 for sleeve, turn, work in pattern on this chain and across front (6 additional clusters).

19th row—Turn, work in pattern over the 21 clusters, drop this yarn and with another end of yarn join in top of first st of 18th row, ch 12, fasten off. Pick up dropped yarn and work in pattern to end of chain (6 additional clusters).

20th row—Same as 18th row (33 clusters). Work even on these 33 clusters for 4 rows (24 rows in all). Fasten off.

Work left front in same way. Sew side seams of back and fronts together neatly. Sewing units together at narrow side make a strip of 4 units for top of each sleeve. Starting at bottom of sleeve on front, count off 27 clusters of last row. Pin and then sew long side of a strip to these 27 clusters. In same way count off 27 clusters of last row of sleeve of back and sew to other long side of same strip. Work other sleeve in same way. Make a strip of 9 units for bottom of sweater and a strip of 3 units for right front. Sew this strip of 3 above the first unit of strip of 9. (See Ill.) Pin and sew these joined strips to bottom and right front of sweater evenly.

Underlap of Left Front

With right side of work toward you and beginning at top of left front, work a row of clusters down front spacing evenly so that work lies flat (about 1 cluster to each row) ending at bottom of unit. Turn, work even in pattern for 2 rows (3 rows of clusters for underlap). Fasten off.

Neckline and Collar

With right side of work toward you, join yarn in corner st of top unit of right front, work 4 clusters over this unit, work in pattern over remaining 6 clusters of front, 4 clusters over top of unit of sleeve, over remaining clusters of back, 4 clusters over top of unit of other sleeve, over remaining clusters of left front and over top of underlap, being careful to keep work flat and even.

Decreasing row—Turn, work in pattern to first cluster above sleeve unit, skip this cluster, work a cluster in each of the next 2 clusters, skip next cluster, work in pattern to first cluster above top unit of other sleeve, decrease over this unit in same way (shaping of shoulders), continue in pattern to end of row. Work one more decreasing row in same way. Continue to work 7 rows even for collar. Fasten off.

Cuff

Starting at underarm edge and spacing evenly, work cuff in same way as left front underlap for 4 rows. Sew sleeve and cuff together at underarm. Holding wrong side of work toward you, work 2 rounds of edging as on carriage cover. Work other cuff in same way.

Work 2 rounds of same edging as on carriage cover around entire sweater. With color work 4 button loops on right front of sweater, working ch 4 for each loop, having one at neckline and 1 at each joining of units. Sew buttons on first row of underlap of left front to correspond with buttonloops.

Cap No. 2602D

Trimming

1- $\frac{1}{3}$ yards Ribbon $1\frac{1}{8}$ inches wide

Make 6 units following directions of carriage cover. Join at narrow sides into a strip.

Crochet Section

With white using white crochet hook, ch 5, join with a slip st into a ring.

First round—Ch 3, work 23 d c into the ring, join with a slip st in top st of beginning chain (24 d c including the ch 3 which counts as 1 d c).

2nd round—Draw up the loop on hook, thread over hook, draw up a loop in same st as joining st, thread over and through 2 loops, leave remaining loops on hook, thread over, draw up a second loop in same st, thread over and through 2 loops; thread over, draw up a third loop in same st; thread over, draw up a fourth loop in next st, over and through 1 loop, over and through all 7 loops on hook, ch 1 (a cluster worked in two places), work 11 more clusters always working in 2 sts for each cluster; join with a slip st in top of first cluster.

3rd round (increasing round)—All clusters in increasing rounds are worked in 1 place only. Pull up the loop on hook, * work a cluster in eye of cluster below, work a cluster under next ch 1, repeat from * 11 times, join as before (24 clusters in round).

4th round—Draw up the loop on hook, work a cluster in eye of first cluster and under the next ch 1, continue to work even in this way to end of round, join (24 clusters).

5th round—Same as 4th round.

6th round (increasing round)—Work same as 3rd round having 48 clusters. Work even for 5 more rounds.

1st row—Ch 3, turn, work even in pattern to within 8 clusters of end of round below (40 clusters).

2nd row—Ch 3, turn, work even in pattern, working the second half of last cluster of row in top of turning chain (40 clusters). Repeat the 2nd row 6 times.

Shaping of Neckline

1st row—Shape neckline of cap by working s c's along back of cap spacing sts evenly.

2nd row—Turn, work 1 s c in each s c below. Repeat the 2nd row once. Do not fasten off.

Finishing

Pin wrong side of strip of units on right side of cap, having front edges even (see ill.), and continue to work s c's inserting hook through back st of each slip st of last round of units and through sts of last row of cap, thus joining strip to cap; continue to work s c in back st of each slip st on the remaining 3 sides of strip. Fasten off. With color make a loop on hook and work an s c in back st of each s c around strip. Fasten off.

ZIGZAG STRIPE AFGHAN No. 2600

Approximate Size: 47 inches by 67 inches

Materials

Fleisher's 4-fold Zephyr Germantown, 16 balls Black; 9 balls each of Sand No. 544; Green No. 640; Rust No. 684; and 8 balls of Goldenrod No. 504 (51 balls in all).

I Fleisher's White 6-inch Crochet Hook, Size 2, Article 840.

Adjustable Fleisher Flower Loom.

Flower

Following directions included with the Adjustable Fleisher Flower Loom, set loom in 3rd groove from top of rod. With 2 strands of yarn wind as for four petal dogwood flower (Ill. D and Pages 3 and 4), then, using same strands, continue to wind as for twelve petal daisies in the remaining 8 empty notches, winding around single spokes. (Ill. C and Page 3). Fasten center with single strand of black as for twelve petal daisies (Ill. E and Page 3). Centers of all flowers are sewn with black. You will have a 12 petal flower with 6 strands in the 4 corner petals and 2 strands in each of the side petals. Make 111 flowers each of green No. 640, A on chart; goldenrod No. 504, B on chart; sand No. 544, C on chart; rust No. 684, D on chart (444 flowers in all).

Unit

With same color as flower make a loop on hook, with right side of a flower toward you. * work 1 s c in corner petal of flower inserting hook under all 6 strands of this petal, ch 3, 1 s c in same petal (a corner loop), ch 3, 1 s c inserting hook under the 4 strands of next 2 petals thus forming 1 petal, ch 3, repeat from * 3 times, join with a slip st in first s c. You will have an 8 petal unit with a corner loop above each of the 6 strand corner petals and an s c above each of the 4 strand side petals. Each unit should measure about 2 inches. Make this edging around all 444 flowers.

Strips

Being careful that all units face the same way, with single strand of same color as units, sew by tacking units together firmly at center stitch of corner loops and in s c of side petals, see detail chart. Join 37 units for each strip. Make 3 strips of each color, 12 strips in all.

Edging Around Strips

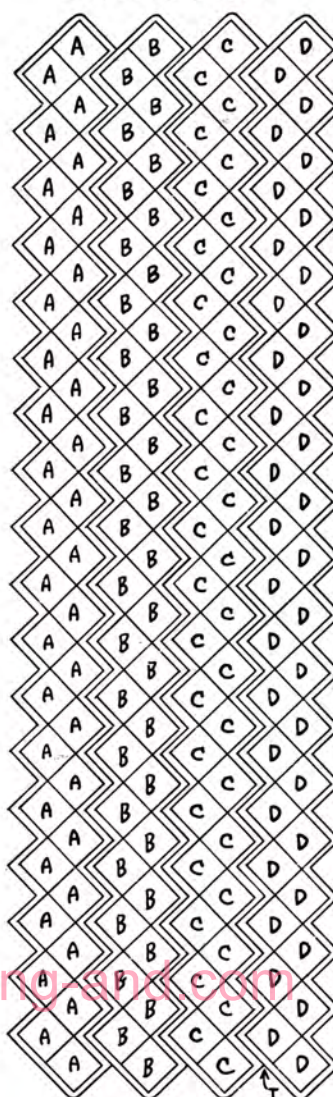
With black make a loop on hook, with right side of a strip toward you, beginning at point marked I on chart, work 2 d c in corner loop, ch 1, 2 d c in next corner loop, ch 1, 3 d c in next space, ch 1, 3 d c in next space. ch 1. work a group of 3 d c, ch 1. 3 d c. ch 1,—all in next corner loop, * 3 d c with ch 1 in each of the next two spaces, a group of 3 d c, ch 1, 3 d c, ch 1,—all in next corner loop, 3 d c with ch 1 in each of the next two spaces, 1 tr (twice over hook) working over joining of the three corner loops (II on detail chart), ch 1, continue around strip, being careful to work over joining of last two units of strip (III on detail chart) in exactly the same way as over the first two units (I) at beginning of strip, join with a slip st in first d c. Fasten off. Work same edging, always using black, around remaining 11 strips.

Joining of Strips

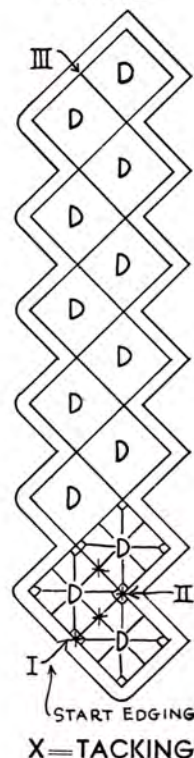
Following chart, and working from wrong side, with black sew strips together stitch for stitch, sewing through half of stitches only. Continue in same way until all 12 strips are joined.

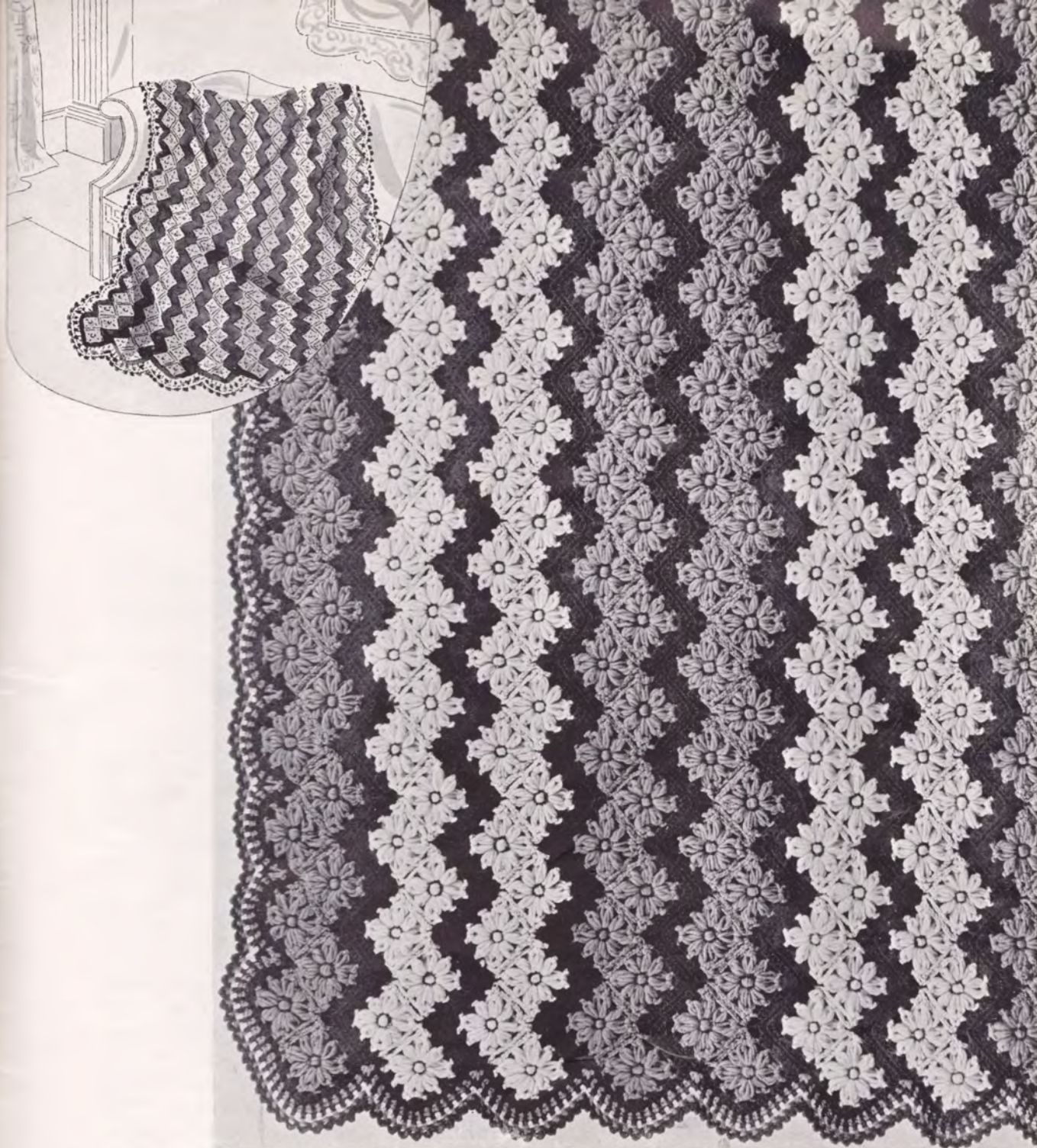

Edging Around Afghan

First round—With green No. 640 make a loop on hook, with right side of work toward you, beginning at corner and working on short side of afghan, work 1 s c in first d c of group of 3 d c, * ch 1, skip 1 st, 1 s c in next st, repeat from * to joining of strips, omit chaining 1, 1 s c in first d c of next strip, continue in this way to next side of afghan; work on long side of afghan in same way, being careful to omit ch 1 between s c's at base of all scallops and skipping all trebles to insure that work will lie flat; work other two sides in same way, join with a slip st in first s c. Fasten off.

2nd round—With black make a loop on hook, work 1 s c under first chain 1, ch 1, 1 s c under next chain 1, ch 1, continue to work in this way to next corner

being careful to omit ch 1 when working at base of scallops; work on long side of afghan in same way, not working under the last and the first chain 1 at base of each scallop, thus keeping work flat; work remaining two sides in same way; join and fasten off.

3rd round—With sand No. 544 work 1 s c and ch 1 under each chain 1 of round below being careful not to work ch 1 between s c's at base of scallops; join and fasten off.

4th round—With rust No. 684 work 1 s c and ch 1 under each chain 1 of round below; join and fasten off.

Final round—With black work 1 s c in any space, * ch 3, 1 s c in third st from hook (a picot), 1 s c in next space, repeat from * around afghan; join and fasten off. Darn in all ends neatly.

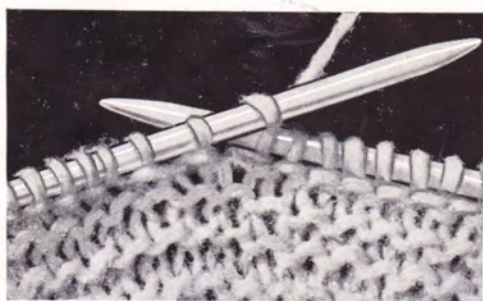

To Cast On

To Cast On

Make a loop, leaving a long end and slip loop to a needle; with loose end, make a loop on left thumb; insert needle in this loop and with end attached to ball, knit a st on the needle; tighten loose end with left hand.

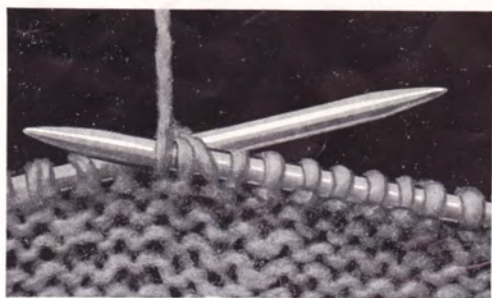


To Knit

To Knit (k)

Holding the needle containing the sts in the left hand, with the yarn back of the work, insert the right-hand needle into first loop and make a loop on right-hand needle, as for casting on, slip loop from left needle. The loops should be retained on the right-hand needle. Work each st in this way until no loop remains on the left-hand needle.

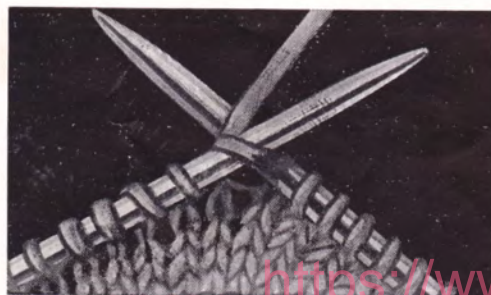
When the row described above is repeated back and forth, any number of times, the work becomes alike on both sides and is called GARTER STITCH.



To Purl

To Purl (p)

Hold as for plain knitting, but bring the yarn to front of the work. Insert the right-hand needle from right to left through the front of the next st, pass the yarn around the back of the right-hand needle, draw it over the needle and through the loop, backwards, and let the st slip off the left needle, just as in plain knitting. When purling comes after plain knitting in the same row, the yarn must be brought from back to front under the point of the right-hand needle, and it must be brought back again in the same manner before returning to plain knitting.

Cast on a desired number of sts on a needle, k 1 row, p 1 row for the required length.

Knitting Stitches

To Slip a Stitch in Knitting

Take it from one needle to the other without knitting. Insert needle as if to purl, unless otherwise stated.

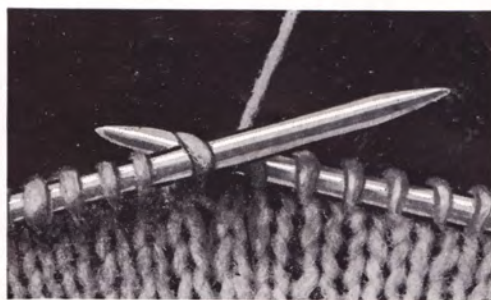
To Increase

1—Knit 1, but do not slip it from the needle as usual; turn needle to which the sts are being knitted behind the first needle, and knit a second st on the back thread of the same st, after which slip the latter from the needle as usual. (Illustrated.)

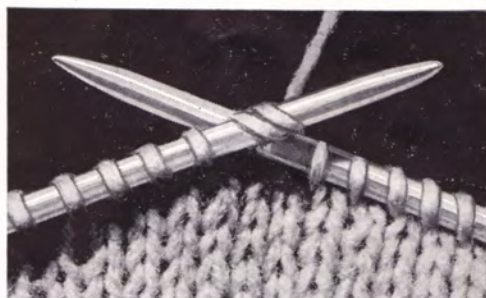
2—Knit 1, draw up an extra st in side of next st *in row before last row*, then knit the next st.

By these two methods of increasing, a st is added without making a hole in the work.

3—"Over" means to throw the yarn over the right hand needle, which is another way of increasing a st. This method makes a hole in the work and is used to provide a space for a beading, to work a lace pattern, etc.

1—Knit 2 sts together. Work as with plain knitting, but insert needle into two sts at a time, instead of one.

2—Slip 1, k 1, pass the slipped st over the knitted ("slip, knit and pass").



To Bind Off

To Bind Off

Knit 2 sts, * pass the first st over the second, knit another st, again having 2 sts on the needle. Repeat from * until only 1 st remains. Break off the yarn and draw it through the last st.

To Sew Seams

Hold edges to be joined close together, with right side toward you. Using a tapestry needle, bring yarn from wrong to right side; beginning at top insert needle through 2 threads on edge of piece at right (see cut), pull yarn through; insert needle through 2 threads on edge of piece at left, pull yarn through. Continue in this way keeping seam elastic.

Chain Stitch (ch)

Make a loop on hook, * wrap and draw yarn through the preceding loop, repeat from * the desired length. Each loop is called one chain st (ch).

Crocheted Slip Stitch (slip st)

Insert the hook in next st, wrap and draw through both loops on hook.

Single Crochet (s c)

Make a chain the length required, turn, insert the hook in 2nd ch from hook and draw yarn through it, wrap and draw yarn through both loops on hook. Continue to work in this way in each ch to end of row. *2nd row*—Turn the work, ch 1, * insert the hook in top of next st, taking up both threads, wrap and draw yarn through, having 2 loops on the hook, wrap and draw yarn through both loops on hook. Repeat from * across row.

Short Double Crochet (s d c)

Make a chain the length required, turn, skip 2 ch, * wrap and draw up a loop in next ch, wrap and draw yarn through all 3 loops on hook; repeat from * in each ch to other end. A new row is begun with 2 chs after turning.

Double Crochet (d c)

Make a chain the length required, turn, wrap, insert the hook in the 3rd ch from hook and draw yarn through, having 3 loops on hook; wrap and draw yarn through 2 loops, again wrap and through 2 loops. For the 2nd st, * wrap and draw yarn through next ch, wrap and through 2 loops and then wrap and through 2 loops more, as before; repeat from * to other end of chain. *2nd row*—Turn, ch 2, wrap, insert the hook in the top of the first d c of preceding row, taking up both threads, and work off as in first row.

Treble Crochet (tr)

Treble crochet is made in the same way as double crochet, only wrap the yarn around the hook twice, instead of once. Work the loops off the hook as follows: wrap, draw through 2, wrap, draw through 2, wrap and draw through 2.

slip, k and pass—slip 1, k 1, pass the slipped st over the knitted st.

An *Asterisk* (*) indicates that the directions immediately following are to be repeated the given number of times, in addition to the original. Thus "repeat from * 3 times" means to make 4 times in all.

The ** and † are used in the same way.

Even means that a row is to be worked without either increase or decrease.

Over means to throw the yarn over the right-hand needle, which is another way of increasing a st.

Work means to continue in the stitch which has been described.

Helpful Hints

Check Your Gauge First—Before starting your garment, knit a small sample. If you cannot procure the exact gauge given in the directions, try a needle one or even two sizes smaller or larger until you obtain the exact gauge specified for the garment you intend to make. The needles recommended in the directions are based as nearly as possible on the average knitter's work, but because some knitters work tightly and others loosely, we suggest you test your own work first to verify the gauge.

If you find you have to use a different size needle than that called for in the directions, the change will not in any way alter your garment, provided your gauge is in accordance with that called for in the directions.

Directions for Garments in This Book are Based on the Following Measurements:

To Change Size of Garments to Another Regulation Size—Add the number of sts required to make 1 inch (see gauge at beginning of directions for garment to be made) to both the back and front of garment for each size larger than the size given in directions; or subtract the number of sts required for 1 inch from both back and front for each size smaller. When a pattern stitch is used, add (or subtract) the number of sts given for 1 or more repeats (or "multiples") of pattern, according to the number of inches required. Then follow the directions given. When shaping armholes, bind off 1 st more each side for one size larger (1 st less each side for one size smaller). Make the armhole $\frac{1}{4}$ inch longer at both back and front for one size larger ($\frac{1}{4}$ inch shorter for one size smaller). When shaping shoulders, bind off more (or less) sts than given in directions for shoulders and back of neck, adding $\frac{1}{3}$ of the extra sts to each shoulder and remaining sts to back of neck. When casting on the sts for lower edge of sleeve, add $\frac{1}{4}$ inch for each size larger, then increase $\frac{1}{4}$ inch extra. This will make sleeve $\frac{1}{2}$ inch wider at underarm for each size larger.

If You Vary from a Regular Size—Take your own measurements wherever you differ from the size given in the directions. Multiply the number of inches of each of these measurements by the number of sts (or rows) equivalent to 1 inch, to obtain the number of sts (or rows) required at

each particular place where it is necessary to make your garment larger or smaller. Follow directions given, changing number of decreases or increases, to obtain desired width or the number of rows between decreases or increases to obtain desired length. In making a garment, always count the rows on the front and back, being careful to have the same number on each piece. Count the rows in same way on each sleeve.

To Wash Knitted Garments—First take complete measurements of your garment, then using Lux Soap Flakes, make thick suds with hot water; then add enough cold water to make it lukewarm (comfortable wrist temperature). Avoid using hot water which shrinks wool. Immerse garment and gently work suds through the fabric—do not rub or twist or allow the weight of the garment to pull it out of shape. Keep the garment supported in the hands when squeezing out water.

Rinse thoroughly in three lukewarm waters immediately after washing, squeezing garment gently between the hands to remove soap. Do not twist or wring. Roll garment between two turkish towels to knead out excess moisture—unroll at once and shape garment according to original measurements, leaving it on turkish towel. Let it dry slowly, not forgetting to stretch it frequently into its natural shape, according to measurement. While garment is still damp, block according to directions given below.

To Block or Steam Garments—Turn garment wrong side out. Lay flat on a pressing board. Pin edges of garment if necessary to make it lie flat. For one-piece dress, pin across waistline, then pin skirt according to directions given below. Lay a wet cloth over garment. Pass a hot iron over the cloth allowing the steam to go through the garment. Do not allow the weight of the iron to rest on the garment. Leave garment pinned until thoroughly dry.

When Garment Is Not in Use—Be sure to lay your garment flat when not in use—never under any circumstances hang your garment on a clothes hanger or hook.

Buy Sufficient Material—At the time you make your initial purchase of the yarn for the garment you intend to make, it is important that you buy the complete amount of each color necessary to finish the article, making sure that it is all of one dye lot number as the next lot number of any color may differ slightly in shade from the original lot you purchased and make it impossible to complete your garment satisfactorily.



This charming two-piece model, beautifully knit after one of the season's smartest designs, was sacrificed to help YOU avoid washing mistakes.

This half was washed the Lux way—gently cupped in cool Lux suds and pinned to its outline to dry. It's unshrunk—soft as new.

This half was rubbed with an ordinary cake of soap in water that was too warm. It's badly shrunken—the fibers matted and felted.
