**ABBREVIATIONS:**—K. = Knit plain; P. = Purl; tog. = together; wl. fwd. = wool forward; p.s.s.o. = pass slip stitch over; w.o.n. = wool over needle; w.r.n. = wool round needle; t.b.l. = through the back of the loops; ch. = chain; tr. = treble; s.c. = single crochet; d.c. = double crochet; l.tr. = long treble (wool over hook twice); sl. st. = slip stitch; sp. = space.

## **IMPORTANT!**

The correct size of any of the garments illustrated in this Book will only be obtained by USING THE WOOL RECOMMENDED IN THE RECIPE AND KNITTING AT THE CORRECT TENSION. To ensure this, use the wool and needles specified, and knit a small piece of fabric in the given pattern. If knitted correctly, the number of stitches to the inch in width should correspond with the tension given.

¶ When the instructions read, "Cast off 2 stitches, K.2" (or similar stitches), the stitch on the right-hand needle, after casting off, is counted as one stitch.

## MATERIALS:—

### PATON'S "ZINNIA" Knitting Wool.

- Brown (shade 2017) . . . . . 1 lb. 5 ozs.
  - Beige (shade 509) . . . . . 15 ozs.
  - Pompeian Red (shade 2044) . . . . . 14 ozs.
- A No. 6 "Inox" Crochet Hook.

## MEASUREMENTS:—

58 ins. x 56 ins.

## ABBREVIATIONS:—See above.

## TENSION:—

To get these measurements it is absolutely necessary to work at a tension to produce trebles  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch in height, 2 (1 tr., 1 ch.) to an inch in width.

*For brushing, see Note on page 5.*

Using the Beige Wool, make 240 ch.

**1st row.**—1 tr. into 6th ch. from hook, \* 1 ch., miss 1 ch., 1 tr. in next ch., repeat from \* to the end of the row, turn.

Break off the Beige Wool. Join in the Red.

**2nd row.**—4 ch., 1 tr. on next tr., \* 1 ch., 1 tr. on next tr., repeat from \* to the last tr., 1 ch., 1 tr. into the 4th of the five turning ch. of previous row, turn.

Break off the Red Wool. Join in the Beige.

**\*\* 3rd row.**—4 ch., 1 tr. on next tr., \* 1 ch., 1 tr. on next tr., repeat from \* to the last tr., 1 ch., 1 tr. into the 3rd of the 4 turning ch. of the previous row, turn.

Break off the Beige Wool. Join in the Red.

Continue repeating the 3rd row, working in alternate rows of Red and Beige until 7 Beige stripes have been worked.

Break off the Beige Wool. Join in the Brown.

Repeat the 3rd row thirteen times.

Break off the Brown Wool. Join in the Beige. \*\*

Repeat from \*\* to \*\* twice, then the 3rd row thirteen times, working in alternate stripes of Beige and Red, ending with a Beige stripe. Fasten off.

**TO DARN THE RUG.**—Taking a double length of Red Wool  $2\frac{1}{2}$  yards long and a darning needle, commence at the edge of the work, darning under and over the chain between the trebles from the finish to the commencement of the work, taking care to keep the darning as loose

as the fabric and ends to form a fringe. Take two more lengths of Red Wool and darn through the same space taking the opposite strands of chain. Using the Beige Wool, work in exactly the same manner in the next row of spaces.

Continue repeating alternate stripes of Red and Beige until 8 stripes of Beige have been worked.

\*\* Using the Brown Wool, darn seventeen spaces in exactly the same manner, then, commencing with the Beige Wool, darn seventeen spaces in alternate stripes of Beige and Red, ending with a Beige stripe. \*\* Repeat from \*\* to \*\* twice.

**THE FRINGE.**—To knot the fringe, commence at the left hand corner of the finishing edge of work and thread a length of Red Wool, 16 inches long, through the end stitch, knot this to the second strand of Red Wool, half an inch from the edge of the rug. Take the first strand of Red and knot to the second strand of Beige, then the first strand of Beige and knot to the second strand of Red. Continue in this manner (joining in a strand of Red Wool 16 inches long in the end stitch, with which to knot the last strand). Knot across the opposite edge in the same manner.
