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ABBREVIATIONS:-K. = Knit plain; R. = Purk tog. = together; wl. fwd. = wool forward; p.s.s.o. = pass slip stitch over; w.o.h. = wool over needle; w.r.n. = wool round needle; t.b.l. = through the back of the loops; ch. = chain; tr. = treble; s.c. = single crochet; d.c. = double crochet; l.tr. = long treble (wool over hook twice); sl. st. = slip stitch; sp. = space.

INTERPORTATION The correct size of any of the garments illustrated in this Book will only be obtained by USING THE WOOL RECOMMENDED IN THE RECIPE AND KNITTING AT THE CORRECT TENSION. To ensure this, use the wool and needles specified, and knit a small piece of fabric in the given pattern. If knitted correctly, the number of stitches to the inch in width should correspond with the tension given.

When the instructions read, "Cast off 2 stitches, K.2" (or similar stitches), the stitch on the right-hand needle, after casting off, is counted as one stitch.



A cheering sight for late-comers to the breakfast table, this pretty Teapot and Egg Cosy. It is done in a very easy crochet stitch which takes practically no time at all to do. Use Green for the Cosies, with Orange, Rust and Amber for the Flowers.

MATERIALS:--PATON'S "ZINNIA" Knitting Wool.

Green (shade 2031), 3 ozs.; Orange (shade 556), 1 oz.; Amber (shade 2245), 1 oz.; Rust (shade 2044), 1 oz.

"WHITE HEATHER"

Embroidery Wool. Dark Brown (shade 519) 1 skein A No. 6 Bone Crochet Hook. One Large Brass Ring. One Small Brass Ring.

TENSION:-

It is absolutely necessary to work at a tension to produce 1 pattern to 1 inch in width.

Using the Green Wool, make 29 ch. 1st row.—1 d.c. into 3rd ch. from hook, 1 d.c. into each ch. to the end of the row. **2nd row**. — 2 ch., ** 1 tuft into 3rd d.c. from hook (to make a tuft, * wool hook, insert over hook into 3rd d.c. and draw through loop, repeat from * five times, putting hook into same stitch each time, 13 loops on hook: wool over hook and draw wool through all loops in the tuft; wool over hook and draw through last loop),

2 ch., 1 d.c. into the same stitch, repeat from ** to the end of the row (9 tufts).

3rd row.—2 ch., * 1 tuft, 2 ch., 1 d.c. under 2 ch. of previous row, repeat from * to the end of the row.

Repeat the 3rd row seven times.

11th row.—2 ch., * (1 tuft, 2 ch., 1 d.c. under next 2 ch. of previous row) twice, 1 d.c. under next 2 ch. loop, repeat from * once, 1 d.c. under next 2 ch. loop, (1 tuft, 2 ch., 1 d.c. under next 2 ch. loop) twice (6 tufts).

12th row.—2 ch., 1 tuft, 2 ch., 1 d.c. under first 2 ch., * 1 tuft, 2 ch., 1 d.c. under next 2 ch. loop of previous row, repeat from * to the end of the row.

Repeat the 12th row three times.

16th row.—1 d.c. into each 2 ch. loop of previous row. Fasten off. Work another Piece in the same manner.

TO MAKE UP THE COSY.—With a slightly damp cloth and warm iron, steam but do not press. Sew up the side seams, leaving openings for the spout and handle. Gather at the top. Using the Green Wool, work over the large ring in double crochet, and attach to the top.

THE FLOWERS.—Using the Orange Wool, make 4 ch., and fasten into a ring, * 2 ch., 3 long treble, 2 ch., 1 d.c. into ring, repeat from * four times, and fasten off. Make 3 flowers more in Orange, and 4 each in Amber and Rust. With Brown Wool, embroider centres with straight long and short stitches. Arrange round top of Cosy, stitch firmly.

THE EGG COSY.—Using the Green Wool, make 29 ch. Repeat from the 1st to the 4th rows of the Cosy once.

5th row.—1 d.c. under each 2 ch. loop of previous row. 6th row.—1 ch., 1 d.c. into the first d.c. of the previous row, * 1 ch., 1 d.c. into the next d.c., repeat from * to the end of the row.

7th row.—Like the 6th row. Fasten off.

TO MAKE UP THE EGG COSY.—With a slightly damp cloth and warm iron, steam but do not press. Sew up the side seam. Gather at the top. Using the Green Wool, work over the smaller ring in d.c. Make 1 flower in each colour, as given for Tea Cosy, and sew in position on top.

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
