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
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
HOW TO USE THE

Mary Louise Flower Pattern Plate No. 2

Use Any Ordinary Needle With a Dull Point

Pass material used through hole in center, having a loose end on back of plate about 2 1-2" long, fasten material to notch as per figure 2, start from center hole on front of plate, passing material to No. 1, on back of plate to No. 2, and on front of plate to No. 3, on back to No. 4, on front to center, where you place thumb and make turn to No. 5, on back to No. 6, on front to No. 7, on back to No. 8, on front to center hole where you pass needle under No. 2, No. 1, and No. 5, and draw tight in center, [See Fig. 1]. Keep passing needle under each strand backwards. When flower is desired size, [See Fig. 3], take off on outside edge. To form flower, draw loose end on outside edge, leaving enough to tie, [See Fig. 4].






