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ABBREVIATIONS:—K. = Knit plain; P. = Purl; tog. = together; wl. fwd. = wool forward; p.s.s.o. = pass slip stitch over; w.o.n. = wool over needle; w.r.n. = wool round needle; t.b.l. = through the back of the loops; ch. = chain; tr. = treble; s.c. = single crochet; d.c. = double crochet; l.tr. = long treble (wool over hook twice); sl. st. = slip stitch; sp. = space.

IMPORTANT!

The correct size of any of the garments illustrated in this Book will only be obtained by USING THE WOOL RECOMMENDED IN THE RECIPE AND KNITTING AT THE CORRECT TENSION. To ensure this, use the wool and needles specified, and knit a small piece of fabric in the given pattern. If knitted correctly, the number of stitches to the inch in width should correspond with the tension given.

¶ When the instructions read, "Cast off 2 stitches, K.2" (or similar stitches), the stitch on the right-hand needle, after casting off, is counted as one stitch.

AFGHAN RUG and CUSHION—

"Mexican" Design.

MATERIALS:—

PATON'S "ZINNIA" Knitting Wool.

These articles may be any size, and the quantities of wool and number of squares vary accordingly.

Rug: 60 ins. x 40 ins. (comprises 24 squares)—

Green (shade 4381)	14 ozs.
Brown (shade 2017)	8 ozs.
Orange (shade 556)	8 ozs.
Rust (shade 2044)	6 ozs.

Cushion: 20 ins. x 20 ins. (comprises 8 squares)—

Green (shade 4381)	4 ozs.
Brown (shade 2017)	2 ozs.
Orange (shade 556)	2 ozs.
Rust (shade 2044)	1 oz.

1 square, 10 ins. x 10 ins.

"Beehive" Knitting Needles 1 pair No. 7
A Cushion Pad.

ABBREVIATIONS:—See page 3.

TENSION:—

To get these measurements it is absolutely necessary to work at a tension to produce $5\frac{1}{2}$ stitches to inch in width.

Using the Green Wool, cast on 50 stitches.

Work in Garter Stitch throughout (i.e., every row plain), working 4 rows in Green, 2 in Rust, 2 in Brown, 4 in Orange, 4 in Green, 2 in Brown, 2 in Orange, 4 in Green, 4 in Rust, 4 in Green, 2 in orange, 2 in Rust, 4 in Green, 4 in Brown.

Work the stripes in the reverse order, beginning with 4 rows in Green, to complete the square. Cast off.

TO MAKE UP THE RUG.—With a slightly damp cloth and warm iron, steam, but do not press, each square. Sew together the desired number of squares, sewing the stripes horizontally in one square and vertically in next. Using the Green Wool, cut it into 6-inch lengths and make a 3-inch fringe along each end of the Rug.

TO MAKE UP THE CUSHION.

—Sew together four squares for each side. Insert the cushion pad.
