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


To simplify the instructions the work is shown with only one thread in the first 2 pictures.


First push the four movable slides away from the centre, so that the teeth protrude beyond the plate. Push the yarn through the punch-hole and hold it at the back of the plate until you have wound the yarn around the first few teeth. Use single, double or triple thread according to the thickness of the wool. Work only on smooth side of the plate.




2 Turn the plate once, now the vertical threads are lying horizontally. Continue to wind the yarn around all the teeth from top to bottom until the work looks as shown in picture 3.

3 This is the basis to all patterns. The next illustration will show the construction of the star-pattern.






5 Continue and tie each outside cross with two buttonhole stitches.



6 To make the centre star as shown in illustration 9 you have to tie together the four crosses in the middle. Push the needle from the top right hand corner underneath both crosspoints to the lower left hand corner and make a buttonhole stitch, repeat this stitch from the lower right hand corner to the left top. Secure the work with a sling-stitch and cut.





7 Turn the plate upside down and push the slides to the centre.



8 Remove the finished pattern and turn it over. This is the right side of the work as shown in illustration 9.



9 The finished pattern has two open and two closed sides. When crocheting or sewing the various squares together, please note, that the open sides join onto the closed sides. When crocheting join the loops with a single crochet, between each loop crochet 2 or 3 chains.
































# MINI-LOOM - THE MAGIC SQUARE For Beautiful Handicrafts

THREE SIMPLE PATTERNS

#### STOLE

Medium size Mini-Loom.
154 squares. 270 grams.
Large size Mini-Loom.
108 squares.
Fine wools, 3 & 4 ply, use
2 or 3 winds, depending
on thickness required.
Thicker wools, 5, 6 & 8 ply,
use 2 winds.
Mohair — imitation,
Mohair, use 1 wind.





#### **PONCHO**

Medium size Mini-Loom. 252 squares, 136 main colour. 116 contrast. 370 grams, size 130 x 130 cm. 3 & 4 ply. 3 winds. 5, 6 & 8 ply, 2 or 3 winds. Mohair. 1 wind.

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#### CAP.

Small size Mini-Loom. 50 squares. 60 grams. 5, 6 & 8 ply, use 2 winds.

Join 40 squares as per illustration.


Join 10 and attach in reverse to the 40 for turn back.



#### JOINING UP THE SQUARES

You can join the squares by sewing the loops together with the needle provided with the set or by crocheting.

NOTE, that each square has a joined loop side and an unjoined loop side as in the illustration below. Put right side to right side and join through all the loops, first vertically as illustrated then horizontally.



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
