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



In this book, we show you how to work six easy stitches:-

RUNNING STITCH THREADED RUNNING STITCH CROSS STITCH WHIPPED RUNNING STITCH HALF CROSS STITCH HERRINGBONE STITCH

The diagrams at the end of the book will help you to make these stitches correctly and the gay coloured pictures show ways in which you can use them. Some of the objects, such as the slipper bag and the apron, are small enough for you to make by yourself, whilst a big hanging like the one on the back cover could be made by a group of children. Our birds and beasts were designed by girls of eleven. The front cover shows a close-up of the penguin. It would be fun to make a hanging like this to put in your own classroom.












RUNNING STITCH








Cross Stitch in blue and white is worked on checked gingham.



This flower-pot motif is worked in Cross Stitch and it could be used to decorate a cushion.






This wall pocket could be used to hold books in the classroom. It is embroidered with Herringbone Stitch.

The close-up shows a two-colour arrangement of the same stitch. 8




A jolly circus horse decorates this lapbag apron. The stitches used are Running Stitch, Whipped Running Stitch, Herringbone Stitch and Half Cross Stitch. Two cross stitches worked one on top of the other make each of the stars which are embroidered in rows below the horse and on the pockets.

A butterfly, designed by a girl of eleven, decorates this kettle holder which is embroidered on felt in varieties of Running Stitch, Cross Stitch and Herringbone Stitch.







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
RUNNING STITCH



WHIPPED RUNNING STITCH




THREADED RUNNING STITCH




HALF CROSS STITCH
