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The correct size of any of the garments illustrated in this Book will only be obtained by USING THE WOOL RECOMMENDED IN THE RECIPE AND KNITTING AT THE CORRECT TENSION. To ensure this, use the wool and needles specified, and knit a small piece of fabric in the given pattern. If knitted correctly, the number of stitches to the inch in width should correspond with the tension given.

When the instructions read, "Cast off 2 stitches, K.2" (or similar stitches), the stitch on the right-hand needle, after casting off, is counted as one stitch.

Using the Greensea Wool, make 4 ch. Join into a ring with a sl. st.

1st round.—4 ch., 15 tr., into ring. Join. Join in the Rust Wool. 2nd round.—Using the Rust Wool, * (1 d.c., 1 ch., 1 d.c.)

into next tr., (1 ch., 1 d.c. into the next tr.) three times, 1 ch., repeat from * three times. Join. 3rd round.—Using the Blue Wool, * (1 d.c., 1 ch., 1 d.c.) into the corner sp., (1 ch., 1 d.c. into the next sp.) four times, repeat from * three times. Join.

Continue working in this manner, working (1 d.c., 1 ch., 1 d.c.) at each corner, and 1 ch., 1 d.c. in each space, working 1 row in Rust and 1 row in Greensea, until 8 rows of d.c. have been worked.

Break off the Rust Wool. Break off the Greensea Wool. Using the Brown Wool, work 3 rows of d.c. round the medallion. Fasten off.

TO MAKE UP THE RUG.—With a slightly damp cloth and warm iron, press lightly. Sew together the required number of medallions for the width of Rug desired, then sew the rows together. Join the Cushion in same manner.
