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ABBREVIATIONS:—K. = Knit plain; P. = Purl; tog. = together; wl. fwd. = wool forward; p.s.s.o. = pass slip stitch over; w.o.n. = wool over needle; w.r.n. = wool round needle; t.b.l. = through the back of the loops; ch. = chain; tr. = treble; s.c. = single crochet; d.c. = double crochet; l.tr. = long treble (wool over hook twice); sl. st. = slip stitch; sp. = space.

IMPORTANT!

The correct size of any of the garments illustrated in this Book will only be obtained by USING THE WOOL RECOMMENDED IN THE RECIPE AND KNITTING AT THE CORRECT TENSION. To ensure this, use the wool and needles specified, and knit a small piece of fabric in the given pattern. If knitted correctly, the number of stitches to the inch in width should correspond with the tension given.

¶ When the instructions read, "Cast off 2 stitches, K.2" (or similar stitches), the stitch on the right-hand needle, after casting off, is counted as one stitch.

BLANKET or COT BLANKET—

"Norfolk" Design.

MATERIALS:—

"P & B" BLANKET WOOL—NON-SHRINK.

This article may be any size, and the quantities and number of squares vary accordingly.

Pink (shade B.W.3)—

Single Blanket, 5 lbs.

Cot Cover, 2 lbs. 8 ozs.

"Beehive" Knitting Needles 1 pair No. 1

MEASUREMENTS:—

Single Blanket 84 ins. x 63 ins.

Cot Blanket 42 ins. x 63 ins.

1 square, 21 ins. x 21 ins.

ABBREVIATIONS:—See page 3.

TENSION:—

To get these measurements it is absolutely necessary to work at a tension to produce 4 stitches to the inch in width.

Cast on 76 stitches. Work 4 rows in plain knitting.

5th row.—K.3, * wl. fwd., slip 1 purlways, K.1, repeat from * to the last 3 stitches, K.3.

6th row.—K.3, * wl. fwd., slip 1 purlways, knit together the next stitch and the wl. fwd. of the previous row (the knitting of this stitch and the wl. fwd. will be counted as 1 stitch, and will be termed K.1 throughout), repeat from * to the last 3 stitches, K.3. Repeat 6th row four times.

11th row.—K.3, (wl. fwd., slip 1, K.1) four times, K.18,

(wl. fwd., slip 1, K.1) nine times, K.18, (wl. fwd., slip 1, K.1) four times, K.3. Repeat 11th row thirty-three times.

45th row.—K.3, * wl. fwd., slip 1, K.1, * repeat from * to * three times, (wl. fwd., slip 1, K.1) nine times, repeat from * to * nine times, (wl. fwd., slip 1, K.1) nine times, repeat from * to * four times, K.3.

Repeat the 6th row five times.

51st row.—K.11, (wl. fwd., slip 1, K.1) nine times, K.18, (wl. fwd., slip 1, K.1) nine times, K.11.

Repeat the 51st row thirty-three times.

85th row.—K.3, * wl. fwd., slip 1, K.1, repeat from * to the last 3 stitches, K.3. Repeat the 85th row five times, then from the 11th to the 45th rows once.

126th row.—K.3, * wl. fwd., slip 1, K.1, repeat from * to the last 3 stitches, K.3. Repeat 126th row three times. Work 4 rows in plain knitting. Cast off.

For the Single Blanket, work 11 more squares in the same manner.

For the Cot Blanket, work 5 more squares in same manner.

TO MAKE UP THE BLANKET.—With a slightly damp cloth and warm iron, press lightly, to 21 inches square. For the Single Blanket: Make a strip by sewing four squares together, sewing the cast-off edge of one to the cast-on edge of the one below. Make 2 more strips in the same manner. Sew the 3 strips thus formed side by side. For the Cot Blanket: Sew together 2 strips of 3 squares.

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
