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ABBREVIATIONS:-K. = Knit plain; R. = Purk tog. = together; wl. fwd. = wool forward; p.s.s.o. = pass slip stitch over; w.o.h. = wool over needle; w.r.n. = wool round needle; t.b.l. = through the back of the loops; ch. = chain; tr. = treble; s.c. = single crochet; d.c. = double crochet; l.tr. = long treble (wool over hook twice); sl. st. = slip stitch; sp. = space.

**INTERPORTATION** The correct size of any of the garments illustrated in this Book will only be obtained by USING THE WOOL RECOMMENDED IN THE RECIPE AND KNITTING AT THE CORRECT TENSION. To ensure this, use the wool and needles specified, and knit a small piece of fabric in the given pattern. If knitted correctly, the number of stitches to the inch in width should correspond with the tension given.

When the instructions read, "Cast off 2 stitches, K.2" (or similar stitches), the stitch on the right-hand needle, after casting off, is counted as one stitch.

# AFGHAN RUG and

CUSHION—"Orkney" Design.

## (Illustrated below.)

### MATERIALS:-

PATON'S "ROSE" Fingering Wool, 4-ply.

These articles may be any size, and the quantities and number of medallions vary accordingly.

Rug: 72 ins. x 54 ins. (comprises 192 medallions)-

Maize (shade 2042), 2 ozs.; Greensea (shade 02940), 10 ozs.; Tropic Red (shade 59294), 5 ozs.; Kenya Red (shade 2311), 7 ozs.; Iris Brown (shade 22000), 18 ozs. Cushion: 22<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> ins. x 18 ins. (comprises 40 medallions)-

Maize (shade 2042), 1 oz.; Greensea (shade 02940), 4 ozs.; Tropic Red (shade 59294),

2 ozs.; Kenya Red (shade 2311), 2 ozs;

Iris Brown (shade 22000), 6 ozs.

1 medallion,  $4\frac{1}{2}$  ins. x  $4\frac{1}{2}$  ins. A No. 13 "Inox" Crochet Hook.

A Cushion Pad.

ABBREVIATIONS:-See page 3.

#### TENSION:-

To get these measurements it is absolutely necessary to work at a tension to produce 1 tr. to  $\frac{3}{8}$  inch in height.

THE MEDALLION .- Using the Maize Wool, make 3 ch. Join into a ring with a sl. st.

1st round.—3 ch., (2 tr., 1 ch., 3 tr.) in the ring, (1 ch., 3 tr.) in the ring twice, 1 ch. Join.

Fasten off the Maize Wool. Join in the Greensea Wool at the corner space.

2nd round.—3 ch., (2 tr., 1 ch., 3 tr.) in first sp., 1 ch., \* (3 tr., 1 ch., 3 tr.) in the next sp., 1 ch., repeat from \* to the end of the round.

Fasten off the Greensea Wool. Join in the Tropic Red Wool at the corner sp. **3rd round**.—3 ch., (2 tr., 1 ch., 3 tr.) in the first sp., \* 1 ch., 3 tr. in next sp., 1 ch., (3 tr., 1 ch., 3 tr.) in corner sp., repeat from \* to end of round, 1 ch. Join. Fasten off the Tropic Red Wool.

Continue working in this manner, working (3 tr., 1 ch., 3 tr.) at each corner and 1 ch., 3 tr. in each sp., working 1 round in Kenya Red and 1 round in Greensea. Fasten off. Join in Iris Brown Wool, work 3 rounds of d.c. round the medallion, working 3 d.c. into each cornerostitchww.knitting-and.com

TO MAKE UP THE RUG AND CUSHION.—With a slightly damp cloth and warm iron, press each medallion lightly. Using Iris Brown Wool, sew together medallions. Using Iris Brown Wool, work 3 rounds of d.c. round Rug, working 3 d.c. in each corner. Join 20 medallions for each side of the Cushion.
