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The correct size of any of the garments illustrated in this Book will only be obtained by USING THE WOOL RECOMMENDED IN THE RECIPE AND KNITTING AT THE CORRECT TENSION. To ensure this, use the wool and needles specified, and knit a small piece of fabric in the given pattern. If knitted correctly, the number of stitches to the inch in width should correspond with the tension given.

When the instructions read, "Cast off 2 stitches, K.2" (or similar stitches), the stitch on the right-hand needle, after casting off, is counted as one stitch.

ABBREVIATIONS:—K. = Knit plain; R. = Purl; tag. = together; wl. fwd. = wool forward; p.s.s.o. = pass slip stitch over; w.o.n. = wool over needle; w.r.n. = wool round needle; t.b.l. = through the back of the loops; ch. = chain; tr. = treble; s.c. = single crochet; d.c. = double crochet; l.tr. = long treble (wool over hook twice); sl: st. = slip stitch; sp. = space.

MEASUREMENTS:—

The Rug: 48 ins. x 66 ins.

Wide stripes, $6\frac{1}{2}$ ins. in width. Narrow stripes, $2\frac{1}{4}$ ins. in width.

The Cushion: $23\frac{1}{2}$ ins. x $18\frac{1}{2}$ ins.

ABBREVIATIONS:—See page 3.

TENSION:—

To get these measurements it is absolutely necessary to work at a tension to produce $4\frac{1}{2}$ stitches to the inch in width.

THE RUG:-THE WIDE STRIPE.-Using the Sylvan Green Wool, make 28 ch.

1st row.—Miss 1 ch., draw up a loop through each of remaining ch., leaving all loops on hook as if for knitting. To work back, wool over hook and draw through the first loop, * wool over hook and draw through two loops, repeat from * until all the stitches are worked off again. 2nd row.—The loop on the needle stands for the first stitch, draw a loop through the next stitch (i.e., perpendicular stitch over the ch. stitches). Draw a loop through each of the perpendicular stitches along the row to the last stitch and draw a loop through the last stitch. Work back as given for the 1st row.

*** Repeat the 2nd row four times.

7th row.—Pick up 6 loops (7 loops on hook), * wool over hook, insert hook in 2nd perpendicular stitch to the right of last loop picked up on needle in the 3rd par below. ** Wool over hook, draw through 1 loop, wool over hook, draw through 2 loops, wool over hook, draw through 1 loop, ** wool over hook, insert hook in first perpendicular stitch to the left of the last picked up loop on the needle in the 4th row below. Repeat from ** to ** once. Wool over hook twice, insert hook in perpendicular stitch to the left of the last picked up loop on the needle in the 5th row below. Wool over hook, draw through 1 loop, (wool over hook, draw through 2 loops) twice, wool over hook, draw through 1 loop, wool over hook, insert hook in first perpendicular stitch to the left of the last picked up loop on the needle in the 4th row below. Repeat from ** to ** once. Wool over hook, insert hook in first perpendicular stitch to the left of the last picked up loop on hook in the 3rd row blow. Repeat from ** to ** once. Wool over hook, draw through 6 loops. Pick up next 7 loops. Repeat from * to the end of the row. Work back. ***

Repeat from *** to *** forty-three times, or length

desired. Work 2 rows. Fasten off.
Using the Light Green Wool, work 2 stripes more in the same manner.

THE NARROW STRIPE (A). Using the Light Green Wool, make 9 ch. Repeat the 1st row once and the 2nd row three times, as given for the Wide Stripe.

** 5th row.—Pick up 4 loops (5 on hook), wool over hook, insert hook in the first stitch to the right of the last picked up loop on the needle in the 3rd row below, repeat from ** to **, as given for the Wide Stripe, once, wool over hook, insert hook in the first loop to the left of the last picked up loop on the needle in the 3rd row below. Repeat from ** to **, as given for the Wide Stripe, once, wool over hook, draw through 3 loops, pick up remaining 4 loops. Work back as given for the Wide Stripe. Repeat the 2nd row, as given for the Wide Stripe, once. ** Repeat from ** to ** one hundred and nine times (or length desired). Fasten off. Using the Light Green Wool, work another Stripe in the

same manner. Using the Sylvan Green Wool, work 4 stripes more in the

THE NARROW STRIPE (B).—Using the Grotto Green Wool, make 9 ch. Work 6 rows.

7th row.—Pick up 5 loops. Work 1 pattern as given for the Wide Stripe. Pick up 4 loops. Work back as given for the Wide Stripe. Work 4 rows.

Continue working in this manner until 44 patterns have been worked from the commencement.

Work 2 rows. Fasten off.

Using the Grotto Green Wool, work 3 stripes more in the same manner.

TO MAKE UP THE RUG.—With a slightly damp cloth and warm iron, press lightly. Using the Grotto Green Wool, work 1 row of d.c. along both sides of each stripe. With the right side of the work facing, join stripes together with 1 row of s.c. The stripes are joined in the following order: 1 narrow Grotto green stripe B, 1 narrow Sylvan Green stripe A, 1 wide Light Green stripe, 1 narrow Sylvan Green stripe A, 1 narrow Grotto Green stripe B, 1 narrow Light Green stripe A, 1 wide Sylvan Green stripe, 1 narrow Light Green stripe A, 1 narrow Grotto Green stripe B, 1 narrow Sylvan Green stripe A, 1 wide Light Green stripe, 1 narrow Sylvan Green stripe A, 1 narrow Grotto Green Stripe B. Using the Grotto Green Wool, work 1 row d.c. across each end of the Rug.

THE FRINGE.—Cut the wool into 12-inch lengths. Using 3 strands of wool, draw through the fabric in every alternate row, working the colors to correspond with the stripes. Take 3 strands from each section and knot 1 inch below first knot.

THE CUSHION.—Using the Light Green Wool, make 28 ch. Work exactly as given for the Wide Stripe until 14 patterns have been worked from the commencement. Work another Stripe in the same manner. Using the Light Green Wool, make 9 ch.

Work exactly as given for the Narrow Stripe A until 35 patterns have been worked from the commencement. Work 1 row. Fasten off.

Work 3 Stripes more in the same manner.

Using the Sylvan Green Wool, work 4 Stripes more in

the same manner. Using the Grotto Green Wool, work 4 Stripes more in the same manner (if desired, the colors may be reversed for one side of the cushion).

TO MAKE UP THE CUSHION.—With a slightly damp cloth and warm iron, press lightly. Using the Grotto Green Wool, work 1 row of d.c. along both sides of each stripe. With the right side of the work facing outwards, join stripes together with 1 row of s.c. The stripes are joined in the following order: 1 narrow Light Green stripe, 1 narrow Grotto Green stripe, 1 narrow Sylvan Green stripe, 1 wide Light Green stripe, 1 narrow Sylvan Green stripe, 1 narrow Grotto Green stripe, 1 narrow Light Green stripe. Join the remaining stripes in the same manner. Using the Grotto Green Wool, work 1 row of d.c. across the end of each piece. Using the Grotto Green Wool, join both sections with 1 row of s.c., leaving an opening to insert the Cushion. Make a lining and fill with kapok, insert in Cushion, and finish row of s.c.
