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ABBREVIATIONS:—K. = Knit plain; P. = Purl; tog. = together; wl. fwd. = wool forward; p.s.s.o. = pass slip stitch over; w.o.n. = wool over needle; w.r.n. = wool round needle; t.b.l. = through the back of the loops; ch. = chain; tr. = treble; s.c. = single crochet; d.c. = double crochet; l.tr. = long treble (wool over hook twice); sl. st. = slip stitch; sp. = space.

IMPORTANT!

The correct size of any of the garments illustrated in this Book will only be obtained by USING THE WOOL RECOMMENDED IN THE RECIPE AND KNITTING AT THE CORRECT TENSION. To ensure this, use the wool and needles specified, and knit a small piece of fabric in the given pattern. If knitted correctly, the number of stitches to the inch in width should correspond with the tension given.

¶ When the instructions read, "Cast off 2 stitches, K.2" (or similar stitches), the stitch on the right-hand needle, after casting off, is counted as one stitch.

CUSHION—"Rainbow" Design.

MATERIALS:—

PATON'S "ZINNIA" Knitting Wool.

Blue (shade 01907)	3 ozs.
Wine Red (shade 104)	3 ozs.
Green (shade 4381)	3 ozs.
Beige (shade 509)	2 ozs.
A No. 7 "Inox" Crochet Hook. A Cushion Pad.	

MEASUREMENTS:—14½ ins. x 29 ins.

ABBREVIATIONS:—See page 3.

TENSION:—

To get these measurements it is absolutely necessary to work at a tension to produce trebles 3 rows to 2 inches in height and 7 trebles to 2 inches in width.

Using the Blue wool, make 4 ch., join into ring with s.c.

1st row.—3 ch., 8 tr. into ring, turn.

2nd row.—3 ch., (2 tr. on 1 tr.) seven times, 2 tr. into top of 3 ch., turn.

3rd row.—3 ch., (2 tr. on 1 tr., 1 tr. on 1 tr.) seven times, 2 tr. on 1 tr., 1 tr. into top of 3 ch., turn.

4th row.—3 ch., 1 tr. on 1 tr., (2 tr. on 1 tr., 2 tr. on 2 tr.) seven times, 2 tr. on 1 tr., 1 tr. into top of 3 ch., turn. Break off the Blue Wool. Join in the Red.

5th row.—3 ch., 1 tr. on 1 tr., (2 tr. on 1 tr., 3 tr. on 3 tr.) seven times, 2 tr. on 1 tr., 1 tr. on 1 tr., 1 tr. into top of 3 ch., turn.

6th row.—3 ch., 2 tr. on 2 tr., (2 tr. on 1 tr., 4 tr. on 4 tr.) seven times, 2 tr. on 1 tr., 1 tr. on 1 tr., 1 tr. into top of 3 ch., turn.

Break off the Red Wool. Join in the Fawn.

Continue in this manner, working the (2 tr. on 1 tr.) into the second stitch of the (2 tr. on 1 tr.) of the previous row in each successive row, working in the stripes as follows:— <https://www.knitting-and.com>

1 row in Fawn, 4 in Green, 1 in Fawn, 2 in Red, 3 in Blue, 2 in Red, 1 in Fawn, 2 in Green. Fasten off.

Work another Half in the same manner.

TO MAKE UP THE CUSHION.—With a slightly damp cloth and warm iron, press lightly. Sew together the round sides of the cover and half-way across the straight side. Insert a cushion pad and sew up the remaining half of the straight edge.
