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SPINNING WHEEL MEDALLION

The correct size of any of the garments illustrated in this Book will only be obtained by USING THE WOOL RECOMMENDED IN THE RECIPE AND KNITTING AT THE CORRECT TENSION. To ensure this, use the wool and needles specified, and knit a small piece of fabric in the given pattern. If knitted correctly, the number of stitches to the inch in width should correspond with the tension given.

When the instructions read, "Cast off 2 stitches, K.2" (or similar stitches), the stitch on the right-hand needle, after casting off, is counted as one stitch.

ABBREVIATIONS:—K. = Knit plain; R. = Purl; tag. = together; wl. fwd. = wool forward; p.s.s.o. = pass slip stitch over; w.o.n. = wool over needle; w.r.n. = wool round needle; t.b.l. = through the back of the loops; ch. = chain; tr. = treble; s.c. = single crochet; d.c. = double crochet; l.tr. = long treble (wool over hook twice); sl: st. = slip stitch; sp. = space.

the quantities and number of medallions vary accordingly. Rug: 63 ins. x 58 ins. (comprises 138 whole medallions and 12 half medallions)—

MATERIALS:-

14 ozs.; Brown (shade 22000), 16 ozs.

Cushion: 24 ins. x 22 ins. (comprises 26 whole medallions and 12 half medallions)—

Green (shade 4381), 3 ozs.; Orange (shade 222), 3 ozs.;

Green (shade 4381), 12 ozs.; Orange (shade 222),

Brown (shade 22000), 3 ozs.
(1 oz. of each colour makes 10 medallions.)

A No. 13 "Inox" Crochet Hook. A Cushion Pad.

MEASUREMENTS:—

ABBREVIATIONS:-See page 3.

TENSION:-

To get these measurements it is absolutely necessary to work at a tension to produce 1 tr. to 3 inch in height and 7 tr. to 1 inch in width.

(To produce a flat surface, as illustrated, insert the hook through the two threads at the top of the treble. If a ridged surface is desired insert the hook through the back thread only.)

THE WHOLE MEDALLION.—Using the Orange Wool, make 4 ch. Join into a ring with a slip stitch.

1st round.—3 ch., 17 tr. into the ring. Join with a sl. st. Break off the Orange Wool. Join in the Green.

2nd round.—3 ch., 1 tr. in the same stitch, 1 tr. in the next stitch, 2 tr. in the next stitch, * 2 tr. in the next

repeat from * four times. Join with a sl. st.

Break off the Green Wool. Join in the Brown.

3rd round.—3 ch., 1 tr. in the same stitch, * 1 tr. in each of the next 3 stitches, 2 tr. in the next stitch, 1 ch., 2 tr. in the next stitch, repeat from * four-times, 1 tr. in the next stitch, repeat from * four-times, 1 tr. in each of the next 3 stitches, 2 tr. in the next stitch, 1 ch. Join with a sl. st.

Break off the Brown Wool. Join in the Orange.

4th round.—3 ch., 1 tr. in the same stitch, * 1 tr. in each of the next 5 stitches, 2 tr. in the next stitch, 2 ch., miss 1 ch., 2 tr. in the next stitch, repeat from * four times, 1 tr. in each of the next 5 stitches, 2 tr. in the next stitch, 2 ch. Join with a sl. st.

Break off the Orange Wool. Join in the Green.

5th round.—3 ch., 1 tr. in the same stitch, * 1 tr. in each of the next 7 stitches, 2 tr. in the next stitch, 2 ch. miss

of the next 7 stitches, 2 tr. in the next stitch, 2 ch., miss 2 ch., 2 tr. in the next stitch, repeat from * four times, 1 tr. in each of the next 7 stitches, 2 tr. in the next stitch, 2 ch. Join with a sl. st.

Continue working in this manner, working 2 tr. more in each section and working 1 row Brown, 1 row Orange,

1 row Green. Fasten off. Using Brown Wool, work 1 row of d.c. round Medallion.

THE HALF MEDALLION.—Using the Orange Wool,

THE HALF MEDALLION.—Using the Orange Wool, make 4 ch. Join into a ring with a sl. st.

1st row.—3 ch., 8 tr. into the ring, turn.

Break off the Orange Wool. Join in the Green.

2nd row.—3 ch., 1 tr. in the same stitch, 1 tr. in the next stitch, * 2 tr. in each of the next 2 stitches, 1 tr. in next stitch, repeat from * once, 2 tr. in last stitch, turn.

Break off the Green Wool. Join in the Brown.

3rd row.—3 ch., 1 tr. in the same stitch, 1 tr. in each of the next 3 stitches, * 2 tr. in the next stitch, 1 ch., 2 tr. in the next stitch, 1 tr. in each of the next 3 stitches, repeat from * once, 2 tr. in the last stitch.

Break off the Brown Wool. Join in the Orange.

4th row.—3 ch., 1 tr. in the same stitch, 1 tr. in each of the next 5 stitches, * 2 tr. in the next stitch, 2 ch., 2 tr. in the next stitch, 1 tr. in each of the next 5 stitches, repeat from * once, 2 tr. in the last stitch.

Continue working in this manner, working 2 stitches more

in each section. Work 1 row Green, 1 row Brown, 1 row Orange, and 1 row Green. Fasten off.

Using the Brown Wool, work 1 row of d.c. round the shaped sides onlys://Fastenkoffing-and.com

TO MAKE UP THE AFGHAN RUG AND CUSHION.

-With a slightly damp cloth and warm iron, press lightly. Using the Brown Wool, sew together the medallions, placing the half medallions at each end. Using the Brown

Wool, work 5 rows of d.c. round the Rug. For the Cushion, sew together 13 whole medallions and 6 half medallions for each side.
