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"Day of the Week" Tea Towels in Appliqué

## No. 261. This Pattern Contains 1 Piece.

Pattern includes 7 designs (one for each day of the week) and transfer patterns for patch pieces. Each circle measures  $5\frac{5}{8}$  inches in diameter.

The quaint ladies framed in circles on these "Day of the Week" dish towels are a clever combination of appliqué and embroidery. The dresses are sweet appliquéd in bright cotton prints with bonnets of plain material, either matching or in tan, yellow or brown. The rest of the design is embroidered. Scraps of material can be used for the appliqué, but be sure that the material is of a good quality, guaranteed washable.

**To Stamp Design**—Cut apart the motifs making 7 designs. Place transfer (rough or printed side down) in the center of the towel end about 2 inches above the finished edge. Pin carefully in position, then stamp according to stamping directions below.

**To Stamp Patch Pieces**—Each set of patch pieces is lettered to correspond with the towels. First, cut apart the patch designs keeping each dress and bonnet together. Place transfer for each dress (rough or printed side down) on the figured material. Pin carefully in position, stamp according to stamping directions below. Stamp each bonnet on contrasting plain material.

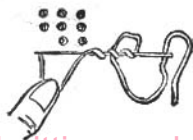
**To Appliqué**—Cut out patch pieces along the outer broken lines, the inner solid lines are the turning lines. Turn under and baste the edges of each patch, turning on the solid line, slashing material where necessary to make a perfect turning. Baste patches over the corresponding parts stamped on towel. When basting, be sure that the lower edges of skirts are properly curved so they complete the circles. When properly basted, sew down the edges of patches with invisible stitches.

**To Embroider**—Follow the illustration on the front of envelope for placing the colors. Use six strand cotton, using three strands in the needle for all work. The stitches used are outline-stitch (detail 1); French-knots (detail 2); lazy daisy stitch (detail 3); single-stitch (detail 4) and buttonhole-stitch (detail 5). When outlining the frame, continue the outline along the edge of skirt.

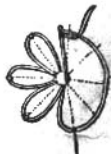
**Edge**—Finish edges of towel with  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch hems. Then work over the hems in buttonhole-stitch (detail 5). The stitches may be spaced evenly as in the detail, or in groups of two or three as illustrated on the front of envelope.
