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
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Tufted Spread. A plain spread can be decorated attractively with evenly spaced tufts, as in C, made with the Singercraft Guide.



Unbleached muslin is usually used for the spread, with heavy crochet or pearl cotton thread for the tufts. Stamp or mark position on spread for each tuft. Average tufts are about the size of a farthing

and are spaced 2" apart.

Wind thread around Singercraft Guide, crowding the winding so that tuft will be full, then stitch, using a medium-length stitch. Continue to stitch through slot of Guide to marking for next tuft, as at **D**. Wind thread again and stitch. Continue stitching and winding until design is completed. By stitching close to left hand side of slot in Guide, you make the length of thread loops about the same on both sides of stitching line. The point of your scissors can be used to even up the loops before cutting. Cut loops on both sides of stitching and shape into a ball with your fingers.
