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ABBREVIATIONS:-K. = Knit plain; R. = Purk tog. = together; wl. fwd. = wool forward; p.s.s.o. = pass slip stitch over; w.o.h. = wool over needle; w.r.n. = wool round needle; t.b.l. = through the back of the loops; ch. = chain; tr. = treble; s.c. = single crochet; d.c. = double crochet; l.tr. = long treble (wool over hook twice); sl. st. = slip stitch; sp. = space.

**INTERPORTATION** The correct size of any of the garments illustrated in this Book will only be obtained by USING THE WOOL RECOMMENDED IN THE RECIPE AND KNITTING AT THE CORRECT TENSION. To ensure this, use the wool and needles specified, and knit a small piece of fabric in the given pattern. If knitted correctly, the number of stitches to the inch in width should correspond with the tension given.

When the instructions read, "Cast off 2 stitches, K.2" (or similar stitches), the stitch on the right-hand needle, after casting off, is counted as one stitch.



## MATERIALS:-

PATON'S SUPER Scotch Fingering Wool, 2-ply. Hyacinth Blue (shade 02906) ..... 2 ozs. (The ribbed stripes on No. 8 Needles may be worked in a contrasting colour if desired, and  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. wool extra will be necessary.)

"Beehive" Knitting Needles-1 pair each Nos. 6 and 8. ABBREVIATIONS:-See page 3.

TENSION:---

It is absolutely necessary to work at a tension to produce 6 stitches to the inch in width.

Use the Wool double throughout.

Using the No. 8 Needles, cast on 72 stitches. \*\* 1st row.—K.2, \* P.1, K.1, repeat from \* to the end of the row. Repeat this row five times.

7th row.-K.1, \* increase once in the next stitch, repeat from \* to the last stitch, K.1.

Using the No. 6 Needles, proceed as follows:-

1st row.—K.1, purl to the last stitch, K.1. 2nd row.—Knit plain. Repeat these 2 rows three times. \*\* Using the No. 8 Needles, in the next row, K.1, \* P.2 tog., repeat from \* to the last stitch, K.1. Repeat from \* to \*\* once. Using the No. 8 Needles, proceed as follows:-1st row.-K.2 tog., \* P.3 tog., repeat from \* to the last 2 stitches, K.2 tog. Repeat from \*\* to \*\* once.

Using the No. 8 Needles, proceed as follows:-

**1st row**.—K.1, \* P.3 tog., repeat from \* to end of row. **2nd row**.—K.2, \* P.1, K.1, repeat from \* to the end of the row. Repeat the 2nd row twelve times. Cast off.

Work another Piece in the same manner.

THE LINING .- Using the No. 6 Needles, cast on 60 stitches. Work in plain knitting for  $4\frac{1}{2}$  inches. Proceed as follows:—1st row.—K.2, (K.2 tog., K.4) twice,

(K.2 tog., K.1) twice, (K.2 tog., K.4) three times, (K.2 tog., K.1) twice, (K.2 tog., K.4) three times, (K.2 tog., K.4) twice, K.2 tog., K.2. Work 7 rows in plain knitting. **9th row**.—K.1, \* (K.2 tog., K.2) three times, (K.2 tog.) twice, repeat from \*

once, (K.2 tog., K.2) three times, (K.2 tog.) twice, Tepear from 3 rows in plain knitting. 13th row.—(K.1, K.2 tog.) three times, (K.2 tog.) twice, K.1, (K.2 tog.) three times, K.1, (K.2 tog.) three times, (K.1, K.2 tog.) twice, K.1. Work 2 rows in plain knitting. Cast off.

Work another Piece in the same manner,

TO MAKE UP THE TEA COSY .- Sew up the side seams of the Cosy and the lining, leaving each seam open for 3 inches and commencing the opening  $2\frac{1}{4}$  inches from the lower edge. Run a thread round the top of the Cosy, 1 inch from the top, draw up, and fasten off securely. Run a thread round the top of the lining and fasten off in the same manner. Sew the Cosy and lining together at the top, round the open spaces and along the lower edges, drawing in the lower edge slightly. Catch the lining in position lightly along the third line of ribbing from the lower edge.
