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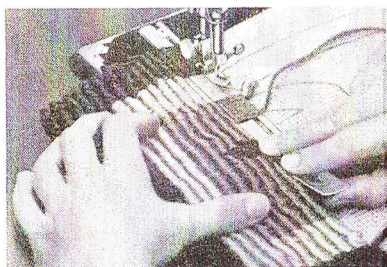
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A NEW CRAFT FOR CHRISTMAS GIFTS

WANT something new to make for Christmas gifts? Something that's easy and inexpensive and very smart? Here it is—a new craft. The work is done on the sewing machine with the aid of a thin metal bar called the craft guide. The effect obtained, as you see in the pictures, is rich, similar to the deep pile of luxurious rugs. Pillow tops, rugs, stool covers, upholstery fringe, curtains, baby blankets, animal toys, scarfs, bags, and dress trimmings—these are just a few of the uses of this new craft. The work is very easy. How to use this craft guide? That is illustrated at the right. You just wind your yarn around the guide and stitch down the slot to a background material. Slipping the guide along as you

stitch, you may wind on any wanted color without so much as raising the presser foot, and so achieve endless color effects. When the design is filled in, you clip the loops, and shear to get the deep pile effects. The work goes quickly and with very little effort. And look at the pillows you can make with designs No. 269 and 270—pillows for some lucky girl, or for some tiny baby on your Christmas list. No. 269 also includes a smart design for a scarf and bag set. Try No. 13131 in wool on net curtains. For

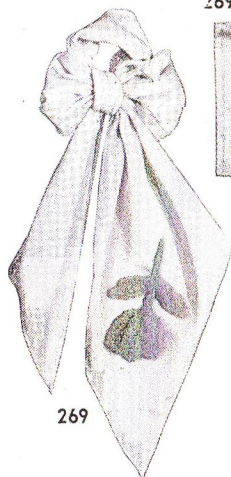
