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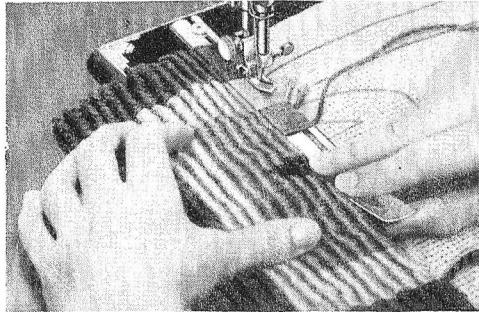
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## A New Craft For The Needlewoman For Her Clothes And Her House

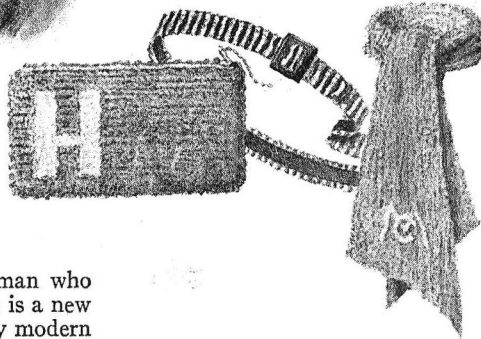
Looped wool yarn can be used to give the effect of smart astrakhan trimming, as illustrated in the cape below. The yarn is wound loosely on the guide, the rows are placed and stitched close together, and the loops are left uncut



White angora yarn is wound around the guide, then stitched to a soft backing to make the knotted section of the woolen scarf and the bow ends on the felt hat, below. Here the loops of yarn are left uncut to obtain a smart, new effect



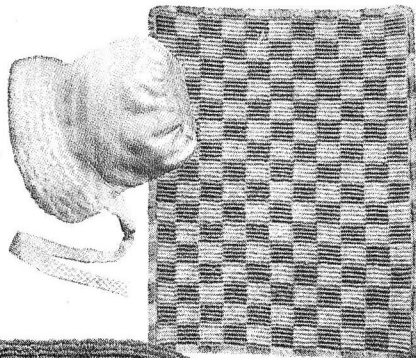
As easy as straight stitching is this new type of sewing, which consists of winding yarn or other similar material around the Singercraft guide and stitching it to a fabric backing, on which are outlined the design and colors to follow



**S**OMETHING new for the woman who sews! And so easy to do! It is a new craft guide and will interest every modern woman who enjoys making attractive things for herself, her husband, her children, or her house. Were it not such a simple process, it would seem like magic, but even so, it actually does turn old silk stockings and worn-out dresses into charming Colonial rag rugs. And, with the use of new yarns, it lends a smart air to the spring hat or scarf; makes downy edges for a baby's bonnet or coat; or fashions the latest thing in bags and belts.

It is all done with this new craft guide on any sewing machine, and the process consists of winding yarn or other similar material around the guide and stitching it to a fabric backing in such a way as to obtain a high-pile result. Different effects may be achieved by the use of different

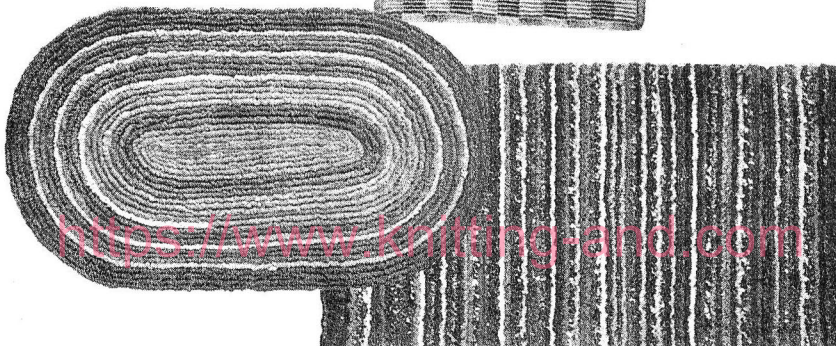
Smart accessories for your spring costume can be made in no time at all with this guide. Use bouclé yarn for the bag and scarf, the monogram contrasting; and chenille in two colors for belt



yarns—wool, silk, rayon, angora, or cotton yarns—and still further variety by clipping and shearing the surface after it is sewed. Placing the rows far apart and stitching them flat gives still another effect, quite different from the high pile. All this allows for individual ideas, and you will be fascinated in working out your own. No special skill is needed, the directions are all clear, and a pattern that you buy or create yourself serves as a guide for line and color on the backing.

The illustrations on this page give you a picture of some of the charming uses to which this new sewing craft may be applied. There are still many others: stuffed, huggable animals for young children to play with; woolly animals on afghans for little babies to coo over; monograms for men's robes; slippers for men; and ways of decorating all the rooms in your house.

Edge the baby's bonnet with rows of soft pink, blue, or white angora yarn that has been wound around the guide and stitched. To insure a soft, knitted effect, the pattern for the baby's afghan is traced on a soft piece of paper that is later torn away easily



Old silk stockings cut into strips, dyed, and applied to a canvas backing make this oval rug, which is a copy of a Colonial braided rug. And old dresses cut into strips were used for the gayly-colored striped rug. The loops are left uncut in both of these
